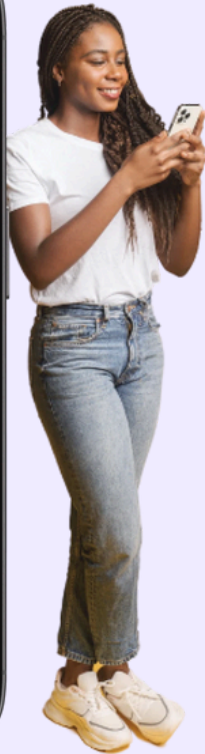
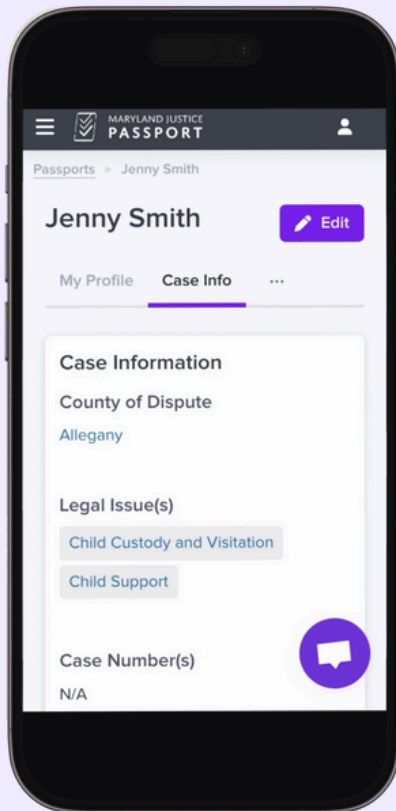


Maryland Justice Passport

Who can use the Maryland Justice Passport?

Anyone. The Justice Passport is a free program supported by the Maryland Judiciary. The Passport is available in all Maryland counties.

What is the Justice Passport for?

The Passport is to assist people in getting services and organizing their civil legal case. It belongs to the litigant, and includes referrals for organizations to contact, case and litigant information, files, tasks, notes, and events. Litigants use their Passports to move their case forward and easily share information with organizations without repeatedly explaining their case .

Where do Passports come from?

Many Passports are made by the Maryland Centers for Legal Assistance, which provide legal advice and make informed referrals to other service providers. You can also create your own at the QR code below!

What kind of services are available on the Passport?

The Passport refers litigants to civil legal representation as well as credit counseling, housing counseling, conflict resolution, and rental assistance in eligible counties. The Passport also allows litigants to securely store information and files related to their case, and share the Passport's contents with anyone they want.
