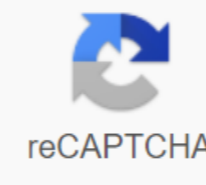

The San Diego campus at SDSU now accepts applications for a small number of academic programs: External degree/self-support programs, which are not subsidized by the State of California. Student fees will vary by program. Business Administration postgraduate degree program: Applications from international students are not accepted for spring. International applicants are encouraged to apply for the fall 2021 term, which opens on October 1, 2020. The spring 2021 application deadline is November 1, 2020. The San Diego SDSU campus and the Imperial Valley campus (located 120 miles east of San Diego) do not accept applications for all other programs. Please consider applying to the program for the fall 2021 term. February February If you haven't already, apply for your Free FAFSA (financial aid application) as soon as possible. Be sure to use the IRS data retrieval option when completing your FAFSA to reduce errors and include the federal school code SDSU (001151) in your FAFSA. February 15, the HealthConnect Portal opens. Log in to the portal and upload proof of immunization and your Tuberculosis Risk Assessment (TUBERCULOSIS). Admissions Home Freshman Admission I Want to Apply San Diego State University accepts freshman applications between October 1 and December 4 to enter the following fall. Start by reviewing the acceptance criteria below. Who are the freshman? You can apply to SDSU as a first-time freshman if you have: haven't graduated high school, but are on track to graduate with a high school diploma in spring 2021, graduated high school, but has not taken a college course beyond the summer after graduating. We strive to enroll academically qualified students and demonstrate the potential to contribute to a diverse community of elementary school. A-G Requirements To meet the minimum admission requirements, you must complete, usually with a C- or higher letter value, a comprehensive pattern of 15 units of college preparation courses known in California as A-G requirements. To enter autumn, you must complete your subject requirements in the spring before enrolling in SDSU. Review the A–G, High School GPA course We consider the breadth and depth of your academic record, and encourage you to challenge yourself by taking a rigorous curriculum including Advanced Placement classes (AP), and/or International Baccalaureate (IB). Preparing for the Indicated Study Area you must choose a major when you apply to SDSU. All majors are and each major has more applicants than available places (CSU mentions this impact). While we look at all the college preparation courses you have taken during high school, we also consider your performance and the number of units taken in the course that are most relevant to the predicted success in the academic discipline you are referring to. Department of Computer Science and Engineering: Preference is given to applicants who have taken and earned strong grades in science and mathematics courses. Dance, Music, and Theater Performances: Applicants must successfully pass auditions and meet general admission requirements to enter majors and universities (usually scheduled for February). Nursing: You should get a B or better grade in algebra, biology, and high school intermediate chemistry with lab courses to consider. If an AP or IB level course is taken in this field, you should get a B or better grade in the course. Preference is given to applicants who have taken and earned strong grades in science and mathematics courses. Review our freshman nursing prerequisite requirements for more information. Additional Factors Special consideration is given to students who have overcome life barriers, participated in college preparation programs, and attended high schools within the local admissions area of SDSU. Note: In line with the California State University (CSU) system, SDSU will not require or consider SAT or ACT exam scores from first-year applicants for spring 2021, fall 2021 and spring 2022. Scores can be requested post-entry to assist with course placement. SDSU uses the CSU general admissions application through the Cal State Apply website. A non-refundable filing fee of \$70 must accompany your application. If you are unable to register online, contact the Admissions Office to make specific arrangements to register electronically with the help of the campus. Acceptance decisions are initially based on self-reported data on the app, so we don't need your transcript until after you've received it. You must provide complete and accurate information about your application, such as high school GPA, course title, and grades. Transcripts will be used to verify self-reported information and any delivery errors will compromise your acceptance status. Cal State Implements Application Checklist Plan ahead and takes effect early. Have the following items before you start your app: Unofficial transcripts. You will be asked to enter all the courses you have completed, which are currently in progress, and whatever you plan to take. Enter your value when it appears in the transcript using your school's assessment scale. Your Social Security Number (SSN), if you have one. Your citizenship status. Credit card. Application fees are due at the time of application and are paid by credit card. Annual income. If you're dependent, then report your parents' earnings. If you are independent, independent, report your earnings. Your parent's work background and two recommendations. This is only applicable if you are enrolled in the Educational Opportunity Program (EOP).
