## Cher bang bang 1987

Her second, Sunny Side of Scher, written by her husband Sonny Bono and released in 1966, the song came to Number 3 in the UK singles chart and number 2 on the Billboard Hot 100 for a week (behind You're My, Spiritual and Inspired by The Righteous Brothers). It eventually became one of Cher's best-selling singles in the 1960s[1][2][2], a single history that proved to be a high-profile success in many countries around the world. It became Cher's first million-selling single and her top three in the UK (and finally, until The Shoop Shoop Song (in his kiss) reached number one in 1991), the critic Tim Sendra in his album The Sonny Side of Cher gave her a mixed review: the only track with real zest was a novelty written by Bono 'My Baby Shot Me Down'. In contrast, investigators for Cashbox said the song was an artifact and predicted it would become a blockbuster 2014. In 1987, Cher recorded a rock version of the platinum-certified comeback album in 1987. Her version includes guitar tremolo, played by her organizer, Billy Strange,[26] and has a resurgence in popularity when it was used to turn the credits of the 2003 Quentin Tarantino film Kill Bill Volume 1. Her version is also a theme for coverage. The BBC's 2005 Wimbledon tennis tournament and has been sampled in several hip-hop records, including Audio Bullys (with Nancy Sinatra), the top 3 UK hit Shot You Down in 2005. After her recordings, several Italian singers, including Mina and psychedelic band Equipe 84 and I Corvi, covered her version. Her versions are also included as the main songs of the 2010 drama Heartbeats, in addition to Dalida and Sinatra, artists who covered the 1966 song, Stevie Wonder on his album Down to Earth, The Beau Brummels on Beau Brummels '66; Petula Clark on her album I Can't Live Without Your Love; and Gábor Szabó on his album Spellbinder, a version of Sheila (with French lyrics) became hugely popular in France in the summer of 1966; the French cover of Claire Lepage was released in Canada (i.e. bang! Bang!) In 1966, other notable cover releases included: Stevie Wonder. In 1966, on the album Down to Earth Vanilla Fudge in 1967; a version from the album Vanilla Fudge was used in David Fincher's 2007 film Zodiac and season 2, episode 8 of Lily Hammer. The Bonzo dog band recorded sometime in 1968; it appeared as a bonus track in 2007 for the re-release of Doughnuts in Grandma's Conservatory, Cambodian singer and songwriter Panron has covered the song as Snaeha in the late 1960s, her cover being used in season 3, episode 10 of Mr. Robot in 2017. Frank Sinatra, Nancy's father for his 1981 album, She Shot Me Down, Ivan Cattaneo recorded a disco-style version of Italo in 1983 Crazyhead on a bonus disc/extended version of their debut album Desert Orchid in 1989. On their 1991 album Dim The Lights, Chill The Ham Paul Weller in his 2003 compilation Fly on the Wall: B Sides & Rarities Isobel Campbell in 2004, her EP time was the same. Scottish singer Paolo Nutini recorded a live rock version in 2007 of Carla Bruni in a lancia musa television commercial airing in Europe in January 2008. Polish singer Ania Dąbrowska recorded her version of Bang Bang on her 2010 album Ania Movie, an alternative rock group Nico Vega for their album Lead to Light. Used for TV ads for the 2013 cable TV miniseries Bonnie & Clyde. [31] Cellos on their 2013 album In2ition with Sky Ferreira provided vocals. Pharmakon, a bonus track in 2014 released The Best Burden, and on Holy Bone Records release, French music producer and DJ David Guetta released a version of this song with vocals from American singer Skylar Grey in 2014 as a digital download. In 2014, kannada Ulidavaru Kandanthe had a song called Knock Knock, which was influenced by the song. Icelandic blues rock band Kaleo (band) in various performances from around 2015 Annie Trousseau covers the song on Independence Day, the 2016 film: The Resurrection. British singer Dua Lipa covers music in 2017 for tv ads for fashion brands. Her covers were also included in the Italian special edition of her album Dua Lipa Aly & AJ's cover shows at their New York and Toronto shows during their 2018 tour contract. Using Interpol for the good guy track on his 2018 sophomore album, Icarus Falls, German band AnnenMayKantereit uploaded a cover on YouTube with newcomer Amilli in 2019. 19 Israeli singer Daniela Pick, wife of Quentin Tarantino, performs jingle Tres Coronas Release in 2011 for the film La vida Loca, US dream pop singer Chrysta Bell and UK indie rock band Whyte Horses.
