
Sex refers to a set of factors that determine whether an individual is considered biologically female, male, or intersex. These factors include chromosomes, genes, internal and external sex organs, hormones, and secondary sex characteristics (such as breats for females or facial hier for males). For those with disorders of sex development (DSD), these factors are not all aligned with typical female or male development. DSD traits may manifest themselves at different times throughout life, from conception to adolescence or adulthood, Individuals with DSD are also called intersex.
