Most managers want their organisations to be successful, but not all of them know how to achieve this goal. Being a manager is often very different from learning or reading about it, and few supervisors think they are ready for this role when they get into it. The left flounder in the everyday aspects of working with the company does not know which activities to prefer to make things go smoothly. The first management activity leading to a successful organization is a well-thought-out rental process. By hiring the right types of staff at the right time, you can remove a lot of negative results directly from the bat. In the area of fostering friendly relations with workers, there is often a long way to go in improving the quality of their work, as managers are likely to see more as allies to whom they can seek help. Be careful that your relationship is professional, however - too personal with employees causes your own set of problems. If a group considers a person, they choose another, until they find a person, they decide to remove. Step 6: While everyone stares at each other, the fox carefully winks at the person (without catching others) and removes them. That person waits for a few seconds, and then announces: I've just been too much. Step 7: The game leader urges hounds to fall asleep again, and all but fox and remove players bow their head and close their eyes. Step 8: When someone is removed, they can stay and watch the rest of the game, but they can't speak at any time or give clues about the identity of the fox. Step 9: Play continues as long as one person is left or fox or hound. Hounds win the game if they manage to find a fox this way before he or she outfoxes them. Most classes have four to five countries a year, including Halloween, Winter (or Christmas) party, Valentine's Day, spring (or Easter) party, and end of the year. If you are lucky that the teacher has chosen one of the parents in the room for your child's class, the first thing you will have to do is meet other parents in the room in your class, as well as a teacher, to find out what your duties will be. Some of the things you will need to clarify are: What are the dates and occasions of your class countries? How much time will each country be given? Does the teacher want her parents to run the whole party, or will she organize some activities? Does the teacher expect craft at every party? Does the teacher expect the parents of the room Game in every country? Will there be goodie bags at parties? Will funds be collected for countries from all students, and who is responsible for collecting money? If not, is there a national budget, or are the parents of the room responsible for organising donations for things like food, crafts, party goods and goodie bags? What kind of food does the teacher want to serve? After the teacher parties have established reasonable rules, it's time for the parents of the room to decide how they will divide responsibility for each of them. Usually the teacher asks that one parent be the point person to contact her about the party. After that, the group may decide to meet in front of each country to divide duties, or they may have only one meeting setting out who will be responsible for the crafts for all parties, who is responsible for food for all parties, who will contact parents of another class for victims, etc. When planning snacks for a class party, the first thing we would like to know is whether there are allergies in the classroom. You hate that one parent send peanut butter cookies if you are a child with a nut allergy! Here are other things you'll want to think about to plan your food: It's always good to have some kind of healthy snack, such as a cut fruit tray. Do not go overboard on healthy snacks unless it's the only thing you serve. Depending on the choice between cookies and vegetables, which do you think children will choose? Baby carrots and sometimes chopped cucumbers are popular snacks for young children, especially when served with the fall of the ranch. Try to plan snacks that carry your holiday theme. For example, creepy spider cupcakes for Halloween; Valentine's cookies for Valentine's Day; marshmallow chickens and bunnies for spring party, etc. Food is usually the easiest donation to receive from parents. Each class seems to have one mom who likes to make seasonal cupcakes or cookies. Salty snacks are also popular party food. Potato chips usually win over pretzels at my children's parties. You can't serve too many choices. Otherwise, the children will hang their plates, and then at the end of the party you will see a ton of food thrown in the trash can. If it was decided that each country needs to organize a craft, you need to remember a few important things: to keep the craft simple and manageable over time, to keep the crafts for ages, and if the ship on that day will be transported home, do not forget to take into account the drying time necessary for paint or glue projects in most cases , especially in younger classes, it is useful that all accessories organized against the parties. Create snowmen from styrofoam balls, pom-poms, and buttons for winter parties. Make a gingerbread house at a winter party. Give each child a small, empty, clean milk or juice box. Let them cover the box with graham crackers, using white refrigeration as glue. Finally, give them a selection of colorful sweets to decorate your house using refrigeration. Make hearts with pipe cleaners and beads for Valentine's Day gifts for a loved one. Decorate large cut hearts on Valentine's Day. Paint and plant small flower pots for a spring party. Create fabric paper flowers for a spring party. Create marble art by placing a sheet of paper in a shallow box, immersing the balls in paint of different colors and turning it into a box for colorful designs. At most class parties, you should plan games or activities so that children can work with some energy. If the weather is nice, it may be possible to plan off games such as relay races. There are many fun games that you can play in the classroom or gym as well. Here are some options: Relay racing using plastic eggs and spoons. Water balloon toss (external only). Freeze Dance: The class activity in which you play music is becoming increasingly popular, children dance, then suddenly stop the music and the children freeze. If they are caught moving when the music is turned off, they're out. Keep playing until there's one dance left. A variation of musical chairs, some hula bows are placed on the ground, and children parade around the hoops and jump into one when the music stops. Works great in the gym or outdoors. Duck, Duck, Goose: The children sit in a circle, one child goes around and gently touches each child on the head, saying duck until she decides to make one goose. The child tapped like a geese must chase the child around the circle. If the child returns to an open place without being caught, a new child becomes it. Turn it into a dance party where children play musical games. Pass the potato or pumpkin, Valentine, or any theme with the right object. Play until one person is left in the circle. Mummy Wrap: A fun game of Halloween-split children into groups and give each group a roll of toilet paper.
