

## **Eligibility Requirements for State Child Care Subsidy, Waitlist Reduction Initiative Subsidy, and Smart Start of Mecklenburg County**

- State Child Care Subsidy serves children ages birth through 12
- Mecklenburg County Waitlist Reduction Initiative Subsidy and Smart Start of Mecklenburg County Subsidy serve children ages birth through pre-kindergarten 5

To be determined eligible for child care subsidy, the child's parent/responsible adult must have current documentation that they are:

- A resident of Mecklenburg County
- Employed an average of 30+ hours per week AND have current check stubs to document employment and income; OR
- In school 20 hours per week AND have a school schedule that documents this; OR
- Working and in school a combination of at least 30 hours per week AND have current check stubs to document employment, income, and school schedule; AND
- For families with children ages birth to 5, family income cannot exceed 200% of the Federal Poverty Level.
- For families with children ages 5 through 12, family income cannot exceed 133% of the Federal Poverty Level.
- Families remain income eligible for these subsidy programs until their income exceeds 85% of the State Median Income.

To compute eligibility, multiply the gross family income by the following:

- 4.3 if paid weekly
- 2.15 if paid bi-weekly
- 2 if paid twice per month

*Families currently enrolled in any of these programs whose income increases to 85% of State Median Income are eligible for the EEWf Subsidy Program until their income reaches 300% of the Federal Poverty Level.*
