## Inky johnson injury speech

The dream is ???????? Hustle, job, reward is ???????? ??????????????????????. @inkyjohnson // #VFL pic.twitter.com/nF3bUPgBwq — Tennessee Football (@Vol\_Football) August 14, 2020 Former Tennessee defensive lineman Inky Johnson, who suffered a career-changing injury while playing for the Vols in 2006, was in Knoxville this week on a visit with the current Tennessee football team. During his speech to the Vols, he spoke to them about why they shouldn't base their work ethic and commitment level on the uncertainty of the upcoming season. The official Twitter account for tennessee's football program on Friday night shared a video of part of Johnson's speech with the team. Johnson's hand was paralyzed by an attempted tackle in a Tennessee game against the Air Force 14 years ago, and has since become a motivational speaker who shares a story about his own inspirational journey through advers ity. During his speech at the Vols, Johnson reflected on his own life, specifically his injuries and his upbringing, and pointed to it as an example of why nothing should be taken for granted. 10-Year Anniversary SPECIAL: GET 50% off the annual VIP membership for GOVOLS247 for all of August Here's what Johnson said to the Vols in the video above: As I told the guys last year, this place is very, very special to me, as well as almost in a sacred way. It means a lot to me. But I always tell people because I get a question when I travel, and when I go to different places, it's hard for cats to understand why I would change what happened to me. When we look at someone who has encountered a level of adversity that I have encountered, the only thing they can think of and remember in their mind is what they have lost. It's hard for them to understand when they see something like a paralyzed right hand and a hand that I encountered for a game of football, it's hard for them to understand when I say, 'If I had the same game this coming Saturday, I'd go for it in exactly the same way with the same energy, with the same passion, and I'd change something about it because it was deeper than football for me. I spoke to the athlete a couple of weeks ago, he was like, 'Inky, I don't have a training table.' I said, 'You didn't have a training table when you first got a dream. You didn't have a device when you first got the dream. You didn't have a dressing room when you first got the dream. You didn't have a dining room when you first got the dream. Now we're talking about whether they move in season, I can keep my ride. Now we are talking about whether we know if we are going to play, we can show with the same level of responsibility, the same level of dedication and the same level of commitment to something that we said we wanted. I say concrete A pledge that says, 'Can I stay true to what I said I would have done long after the mood I said in left?' So the question remains, can you come here every day and work on something that is not based on the result. When you break it down to the essence of what it is, what is it? It's my versus your conscious ness. It's my mentality versus your mentality. So my mother raised me versus how your mother raised you. Or when you say something, and you see another man, you say, 'Boy, you have to go through hell and high water to want it more than I want, and if you want to, you're going to have to fight to get it. I just want one thing from you: Don't get caught in the headlines. Don't get caught, all right, if we have to pay, if we don't play, I'll base my work ethic, my determination and my commitment out of it. Do not use predicate if out of it. You've all seen it: The dream is free, but bustle, work, reward - it's sold separately. They ask me who my hero is, I tell my mother, whom I watched get up every day and work a double shift at Wendy's from when I was a kid until I got on campus at the University of Tennessee, the first time I slept in bed alone. How dare I ever step foot in this football complex, on any field, in any weight room, and not give everything I've got. That would be disrespectful. Expect, standard, don't bend, don't break that for anyone. No cat here is bigger than Power T. It doesn't matter how much talent you have. And not to have this work ethic determined by a certain date, whether in autumn, next month or spring. Let it convey your integrity, your mentality and your spirit as men. I don't care what the world says. I never expect Tennessee to get off the field and lie down on anyone. We all face a time of challenges and controversies, but as you all know, men, adversity causes some cats to break and other cats break records. Which side are you going to be on? Whatever that Power T means to you, boys. Transcript: I said, I can't move. There's a shock going through my whole body. I don't feel anything human. I still remember the day I was in the movie room watching the movie and I watched the California Bears and my defensive backs coach Larry Slade come into the room. He said, Inky Johnson, I have good news for you. I dropped the clicker and I said, Coach, what is it? He said: 'All you have to do is play these next 10 football matches. You're an automatic multimillionaire. I ran out of the room. I was on the phone. I called my mom and grandma. I said, Listen, after this season, our lives will change forever. Little did I know that our lives were really going to change. The first game we come out to play against the California Bears. I'll eavesdrop on them, shut them down, get a victory. Second game, we're playing against the Air Force. It's late in the game, we find ourselves in a dog battle and I approach the solution as I approach any other solution and the way I'm approaching, either I'm going to knock you out or you're going to knock me out. I'm 165 pounds. I can't play with anyone. But at the time of contact, when I hit this guy, something else happened to me that never happened to me in my life. I hit him and it seemed as if every breath in my body had gone. My body was completely limp. I fell to the ground and it went down. I looked at the doctor because I didn't feel my right hand. They shoved me with all kinds of needles. Inky can you feel? Can you feel it? I didn't feel anything. They took me back, did a CAT scan, and they put me back in my room and I'll never forget it. All within about a 15-second time frame, I was laying close to my bed. My father went to the step and looked at me. He told my son, I can't do this. Left. My mother walked in. She was running. She kissed me on the forehead. She said a prayer. She told Ink, everything was going to be fine and she ran away. As soon as my mother got out of the room, the doctor rushed from the opposite side and said hey, go here, we need to rush this guy back to the emergency room. He's going to die soon. What did I say? My mom just told me everything was going to be okay. He told his son what had happened, you arrested some [inaudible artery 00:01:59] in the chest. You're bleeding internally. We need to rush you back and take the main vein from your left leg and plug it into your chest to save your life. When I woke up from recovery, the same doctor was standing on me. Said Inky, I have good news and bad news for you. Did I say you had bad news for me after you told me I was going to die? I'm still alive. How bad can it get? I'm still here. He said good news Son, we saved your life. I said thank you, sir. He said the bad news is that you have nerve damage in your right shoulder. You probably can never play football again in your life. I said doctor, no disrespect, but I'm eight games away. I've been working on this since I was seven years old. No way. God, not God now. Let me do this to the NFL so I can help my family first. We missed the meal. No way. I never cheated. I never cheated. I gave everything I had, and I respected it. I never cheated. There's no way my career is over. I said send me to the Mayo Clinic. After a few visits, I'll never forget, that's when the reality set in, it was me, my mother, and my dad in the room and the doctors came. They told Inky Johnson, here's the deal. They said to your son, we don't like to tell you, but your hand will never be the same again, your hand will never be the same again. Son, you can never play football again. He told his son, here are your options for surgery. We can take the muscle from the back of your left leg, plug it into your right hand, but there's a chance that your weak left leg and weak left hand will leave you for the rest of your life. Or we could take your nerves out of your left hand, laugh in your chest, down to your right hand, but there's a chance they'll leave you two weak hands for the rest of your life, or we'll take your nerves from your left rib, move it to your chest, down to your right hand, but there's a chance you'll be left with a problem with braething and a weak right hand. your life. By the way, tell us what you want to do in the morning. The next morning, I walked into the doctors' hope. They said, son, what option did you choose. I said no disrespect to you doc, I don't choose the option. The situation is out of your hands. Cut me where you have to cut me. I said I knew I was going to get out of this situation. When I'm standing here in front of you on this stage today, my left thigh has been cut six times. They cut my right rib twice. They cut me twice through the furnace. They cut me once over the left side of my neck. They cut me once over the right side of my neck. They cut me from the bottom of my amplit to the bottom of my hand. And after they're done with me, they said you'd be in this hospital for another 40 days. I left the hospital on the third day. They said you broke the record. How did you do that? I said first of all what I want you all to understand, that I will never allow a circumstance or situation to define my life. But most importantly, do you know what I invested in? I had a sweat of justice. I've worked my whole life. What I didn't understand by being determined to chase something, by being committed to it, and what Is, the commitment remains true to something that you said you would do long after the mood that you set it left. You see, people think the commitment says yes, I'll do it on days when it feels good, but I've been committed to everything I've ever started in my life and I've never stopped and I've never finished. So by committing to everything I started, I finished and built a certain type of spirit. She's built a certain type of mentality. It built a certain type of individual, so now I couldn't stop even if I wanted to. I couldn't lie in bed even if I wanted to. I couldn't stop even if I wanted to. I had too much sweat justice in my life and everything I did. I understood that the process is more important than the product. It wasn't about the outcome for me whether I got into the NFL or not. It was inconsistent to God's plan for my life, but I wanted to fall in love with this process because I understood that by failing in love with this process, it was going to turn me into a machine. A lot of people need a little extra money to motivate them. many people need what the case may be, a small bonus to get motivation. I don't need anything but breath in my body and life. I wake up every day, I understand. I have two children depending on me. I understand I have a wife, depending on me. I understand I have a world that needs me. The reason I go into life with the passion and zeal that I go for is because I understand every day of my life there is someone in the world who is dependent on me. Maybe it's not you, and if it's just about you, you're in trouble because I'm telling you you're going to come across something in life that's a lot tougher than you and it's going to test your heart and if it's just about you and it's just about the product, it's going to crush you. Every day I come, I understand that in the free world there is someone who looks at me to see if I should continue so I can't quit. So I went back to school the next week after just saving my life. I was back in class. I had to learn to write again. I had to learn to walk again. I had to learn how to tie shoes again. I had to learn how to bathe again. I had to learn to live life over and over again. I never once said let me go home. I need a break. You see what we need to understand about everything we are apart of, first and foremost it's a blessing from God. When it's a blessing, you can't help but give everything you have to do it. They saved my life. God saved my life. I almost died. The doctors came to me on the field. He was on one knee. He grabbed my wrist and told my son you didn't have a pulse. I don't even know how you're still alive. My last visit to the doctor, they came to me and said sorry to Inky Johnson, you will never be able to use this hand or hand in your life. I said no disrespect to you doc, but I will use this hand and this hand every day for the rest of my life so that I live my life. Every day, I'm going to affect someone's life. Every day someone about influence. I inspire someone every day. I'll encourage someone every day. Anyone who has direct contact with people on a daily basis, this is an opportunity to change someone's life. I will never miss an opportunity to be encouraged by other people. Never leave the opportunity to inspire someone. Never leave an opportunity to strengthen someone. Never pass on the opportunity to show someone love because the thing about it, my wound... It's like you're seeing it. You see my hand. My wound is visible. But there are a lot of people in this room who are injured. You can't see it. It's internal. So the opportunities we pass on to be a blessing to other people can save their lives, which is [inaudible 00:08:10] in common. Because sometimes that thing about life, life always comes when we get into our minds to try to distract us. But to tell you the truth, we all know we're stronger together. Alone, weak. He can't do anything. Together, strong, unstoppable. He can change the world. World.
