ST. JOHN PAUL II LITURGICAL CENTER UPDATE

LONG-AWAITED DIVINE MERCY ALTAR IN THE SHRINE **CHAPEL COMES TO FRUITION**

Installing the Divine Mercy Altar in our Archdiocese Shrine of St. John Paul II is the culmination of a plan launched by Fr. Mirosław Król in 2015 to have the totality of the Divine Mercy story visible in our Shrine Chapel and have it be a sanctuary of devotion to it. Installing the altar dedicated to St. John Paul II on the left side of the Shrine Chapel was the first phase. On August 10, 2025,

the new marble altar will be blessed by Archbishop of Detroit, Edward Weisenburger, who will celebrate Mass at 11:00 AM in the Archdiocesan Shrine of St. John Paul II.

Here, Joseph Majcher shares a look at the project.

Divine Mercy, St. Faustina Kowalska, and St. Pope John Paul II are inextricably intertwined. Theirs is a powerful spiritual journey that spans decades and helped shape modern Catholic devotion.

St. Faustina Kowalska was a humble Polish nun who lived from 1905 to 1938. She received mystical visions of Jesus, who asked her to spread the message of His Divine Mercy - a love that forgives and heals even the greatest sins. Jesus instructed her to record His messages in a diary which is now a spiritual classic. He also requested that she promote the image of Divine Mercy which is Jesus with rays of red and white light emanating from His heart with the inscription "Jesus I trust in you." In adition, Christ asked that the Church establish Divine Mercy Sunday to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter.



St. Pope John Paul II was deeply influenced by St. Faustina's message early in his life. Pope John Paul II called Divine Mercy "love's second name" and considered it central to his pontificate. He initiated her beatification in 1993 and canonized her in 2000, declaring her the first saint of the new millennium. During her canonization, he officially established Divine Mercy Sunday for the entire Church. In 2002, he entrusted the world to Divine



Mercy at the Shrine in Kraków, saying the world desperately needed God's mercy in the face of suffering and injustice. He died on the eve of Divine Mercy Sunday in 2005, a moment many saw as divinely symbolic.

Today, the Divine Mercy devotion includes praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, venerating the Divine Mercy image of Jesus, and living out mercy in daily life.

IN THE WORDS OF ST. JOHN PAUL II

Recently, the Archdiocesan Shrine of St. John Paul II has received a relic of St. Maximilian Kolbe, who was a Polish Conventual Franciscan friar, priest, missionary, and martyr. He volunteered to die in place of a man named Franciszek Gajowniczek in the German death camp of Auschwitz. He was canonized on October 10, 1982, by Pope St. John Paul II. His memorial is celebrated on August 14th, and we will prepare for it by a novena prayer beginning on August 5th. Here are some extracts from the homily of St. John Paul II during St. Maximilian Kolbe's canonization:

'Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends' (John 15:13).

From today on, the Church desires to address as 'Saint' a man who was granted the grace of carrying out these words of the Redeemer in an absolutely literal manner.

For towards the end of July 1941, when the camp commander ordered the prisoners destined to die of starvation to fall in line, this man-Maximilian Maria Kolbe-spontaneously came forward and declared himself ready to go to death in the place of one of them. This readiness was accepted and, after more than two weeks of torment caused by starvation, Father Maximilian's life was ended with a lethal injection on August 14, 1941.



All this happened in the concentration camp at Auschwitz where during the last war some four million people were put to death, including the Servant of God, Edith Stein (the Carmelite Sister Teresa Benedicta of the Cross), whose cause for beatification is in progress at the competent Congregation. Disobedience to God-the Creator of life who said, 'Thou shalt not kill'-caused in that place the immense holocaust of so many innocent persons. And so at the same time, our age has thus been horribly stigmatized by the slaughter of the innocent.

Father Maximilian Kolbe, himself a prisoner of the concentration camp, defended in that place of death an innocent man's right to life. Father Kolbe defended his right to life, declaring that he was ready to go to death in the man's place, because he was the father of a family and his life was necessary for his dear ones. Father Maximilian Maria Kolbe thus reaffirmed the Creator's exclusive right over innocent human life. He bore witness to Christ and to love. For the Apostle John writes: 'By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren' (1 John 3:16).

The Church has venerated Father Maximilian as 'Blessed' since 1971. By laying down his life for a brother, he made himself like Christ.

Gathered today before the Basilica of St. Peter in Rome, we wish to express the special value which Father Maximilian Kolbe's death by martyrdom has in the eyes of God.

Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his saints. These are the words we have repeated in today's responsorial psalm. It is truly precious and inestimable! Through the death which Christ underwent on the Cross, the redemption of the world was achieved, for this death has the value of supreme love. Through the death of Father Maximilian Kolbe, a shining sign of this love was renewed in our century which is do seriously and in so many ways threatened by sin and death.



SHRINE OF ST. JOHN PAUL II: JUBILEE YEAR PILGRIMAGE SITE

Did you know that the Archdiocese of Detroit has designated our Shrine Chapel at Orchard Lake one of 12 Detroit-area pilgrimage sites ahead of the Jubilee 2025; a place for pilgrims to visit and receive a plenary indulgence?

The Church celebrates ordinary jubilees every 25 years. In December 2024, the late Pope Francis ushered in the Holy Year 2025 by opening the Holy Doors of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome for a year of grace, forgiveness and renewal — centered on the theme, "Pilgrims of Hope."

In 1470, Pope Paul II established the practice of celebrating jubilees every 25 years, instead of 50, to allow more people to experience a Holy Year within their lifetimes.

After many years of thoughtful footsteps, the pathways of the Marian Grotto of Our Lady of Lourdes at Orchard Lake St. Mary's have given way to age and are in need of repair. The Mary Project needs your help to sustain this prayerful space.

We are soliciting your support to repave the walkways and paths, starting with the walkway from the Grotto towards the lake. It will be paved with custom bricks to make it much more attractive and durable than poured concrete, and we are asking that you donate one or more of the bricks.

The donated bricks will become a part of the Grotto, paving the way for generations of visitors. 




ENDURING LEGACY


