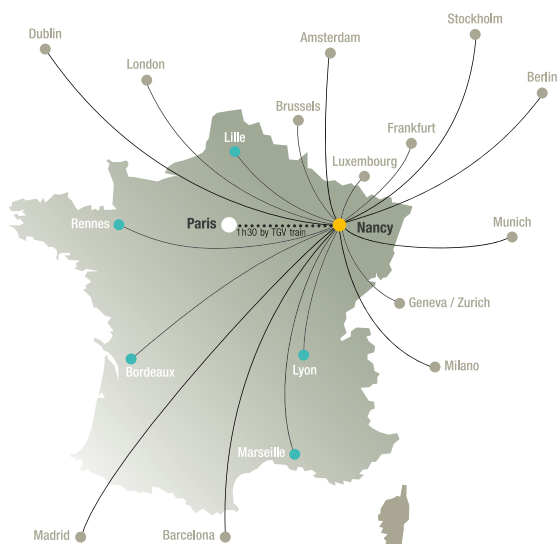

Mines Nancy offers several ways to join its international academic community, from full engineering and Master's degrees to exchange studies to double degrees, research internships and short-term programs.

Engineering degrees



Ingénieur civil des mines (ICM)

General Engineering Degree

A multidisciplinary and highly customizable programme combining advanced science, engineering, management and humanities across five scientific fields.

Ingénieur de spécialité génie industriel et matériaux (GIM)

Engineering Degree in Industrial Engineering and Materials Science

A dual-expertise programme focused on industrial systems, production, materials and the technological and socio-ecological transformation of industry.

Ingénieur de spécialité génie mécanique, parcours ingénierie de la conception (IC)

Engineering Degree in Mechanical Engineering – Design Engineering Track

YOUR PRACTICAL CHECK-LIST

There are many important practical details that you should think about to smoothly prepare your arrival to France. We listed below the most crucial practical tips for you.

Visa

Check if you need a visa and apply for it online:

A visa is the sticker put in your passport by the French consulate in your home country. Most of students' long stay visas are categorized as VLS-TS (visa long séjour valant titre de séjour). This document allows you to enter France.

Within 3 months after your arrival to France, you must validate your VLS-TS to be granted a residence permit

If this is not done, you will not have a legal resident status and you will have to leave France without the opportunity to come back. But don't worry, you can validate your VLS-TS easily online.



Medical insurance

In France, medical insurance (or Social Security) is mandatory for all students. Once you obtain your insurance, the costs of your visits to the doctor will be partially reimbursed by the French Social Security authorities. You can apply for Social Security online.

Students from EU or Schengen area who have a European Health Insurance card (issued by home country and valid for the entire period of studies) do not need to obtain French Social Security. Mines Nancy students have access to a university health center, also known as «Santé U» offering a variety of health care services.

CHECK-LIST



International students in France are allowed to work 60% of the annual working time (50% of the annual working time for Algerian students).

Non-EU students must prove that they have sufficient means of support (at least €877/month) for the entire duration of their stay in France. It is one of the visa application requirements.

Bank account

International students who spend more than 3 months in France should open a bank account. We advise you to ask your home bank whether it has agreements with any French bank to facilitate the process.

Your average monthly expenses in Nancy:

Accommodation: € 150-400

Housing and civil liability insurance: from € 30

Food: about € 200 (a full meal at student cafeteria: € 4)

A monthly bus ticket: € 20-30

Visit to a doctor: from € 25 (70% is reimbursed by Social Security)

Entertainment:

Cinema ticket: € 4-8

Museum entry: free for students

Restaurant dinner: from € 20



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Accommodation

Most of our international students decide to stay in one of CROUS Student Residences. This accommodation is the most affordable for students and there are many locations across the city.

Who is guarantor?

To rent accommodation in France, international students should submit a letter from a guarantor (French resident who agrees to pay the rent in case if a student can no longer do so). If you don't have one, you may use:

VISALE online service
or its alternative **GarantMe**

For students staying in CROUS residences, a hosting university can be a guarantor.

CROUS Student Residences

Standard room: 9 m², basic furniture;
shared spaces: private bathroom with toilets, kitchen and study room.

Comfort room: 9-15 m², basic furniture;
refrigerator, private bathroom with toilets;
shared spaces: kitchen and study room.

Studio: 13-18m², basic furniture,
refrigerator, small kitchen, private
bathroom with toilets

Prices: € 150-400 / month

Other accommodation options

Private renting

To rent a private apartment, the price and conditions are set by the landlord and described in the tenancy agreement. If you use the real estate agency services, you will have to pay a commission.

Average prices:

€ 450-600 / month + utility fees

Flat-sharing (colocation)

If you rent a shared apartment, the rental contract includes the joint-liability of ALL flat mates who must be listed and sign the contract.

Average prices:

€ 200-400 / month + utility fees

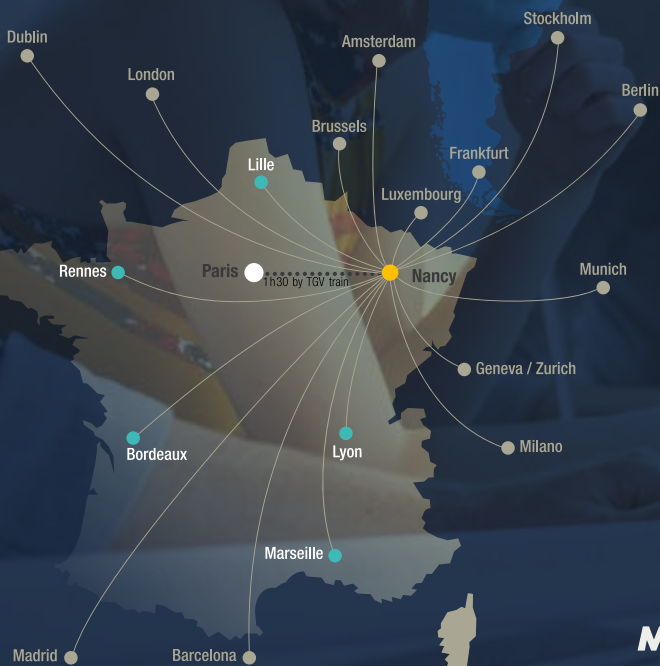
