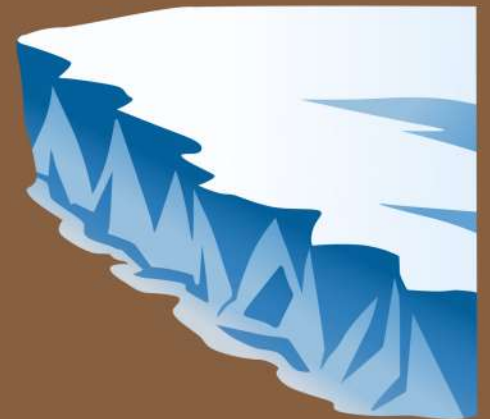

Habitats - Vocabulary



glacier: a slow-moving mass or river of ice (noun)



The large **glacier** only moves 30 cm a day.

Habitats - Vocabulary



iceberg: a large piece of ice that broke off from a glacier and is floating in the ocean (noun)



The ship has to be careful not to hit an **iceberg** in the cold ocean.

curious: wanting to learn about people or things around you (adjective)



The girl was **curious** about the insect she found on the ground.

warn: to tell somebody about something dangerous or bad (verb)



The sign **warns** people about alligators in the water.

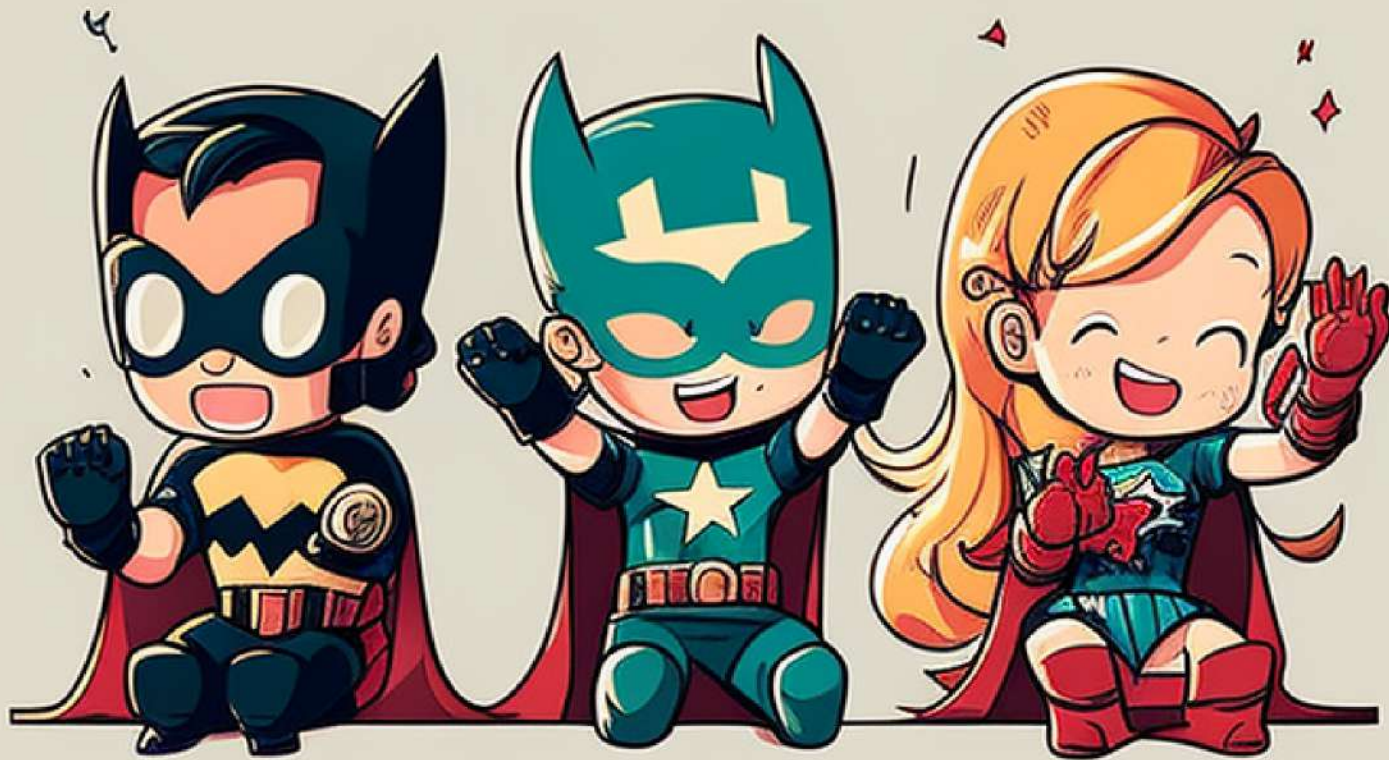
