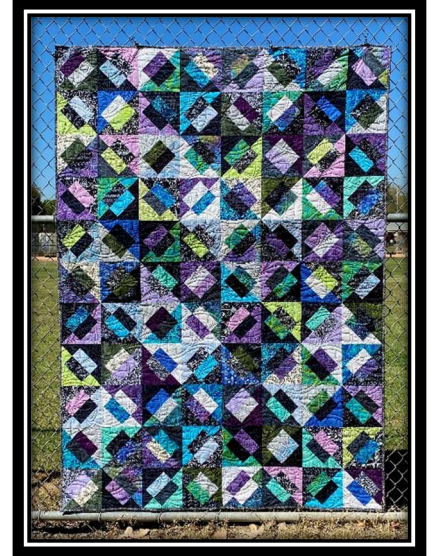
## February Guild Program

She also personally donates between 15-20 quilt monthly to our Philanthropy program! Always has a smile on her face and does so much in the community and in our guild! My favorite part of quilting is being able to make something, with my own hands, for my family and friends. I have been quilting for 50 years now, having completed my first quilt in 1976. It was made from polyester scraps, using a blanket for the batting and JC Penney sheet for the backing. It's a quilt I still have.

My next major jump in quilting was in 2005 when my husband gave me a gift certificate for long-arm quilting lessons. I was instantly hooked and had my own long-arm machine in 6 months. One of my first, and still favorite, quilting projects was a two-year-long effort to create 25 individually designed quilts for my son's friends in celebration of their high school graduation.



In 2011, I joined the OGQG. I enjoy the guild's many activities, the meetings and speakers and the friendship I have made. And, although I have never held a position within the guild, I do enjoy helping in the background.

Through quilting for Lyn Brown, my work has been featured in 14 publications. Now, much of my time is spent creating and donating quilts to the guild and to Veteran hospice patients. I've also enjoyed traveling to quilt shows with my friend Sharon. We've been to Paducah, Sisters, Missouri Star and The Utah Quilt Festival.

My husband Robert and I will celebrate our 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year. Our two boys have blossomed, starting their own families. Our son Travis and his wife Abby live in Boston and our son Spencer and our grandson Jasper (7) live in Salt Lake City.

## Philanthropy

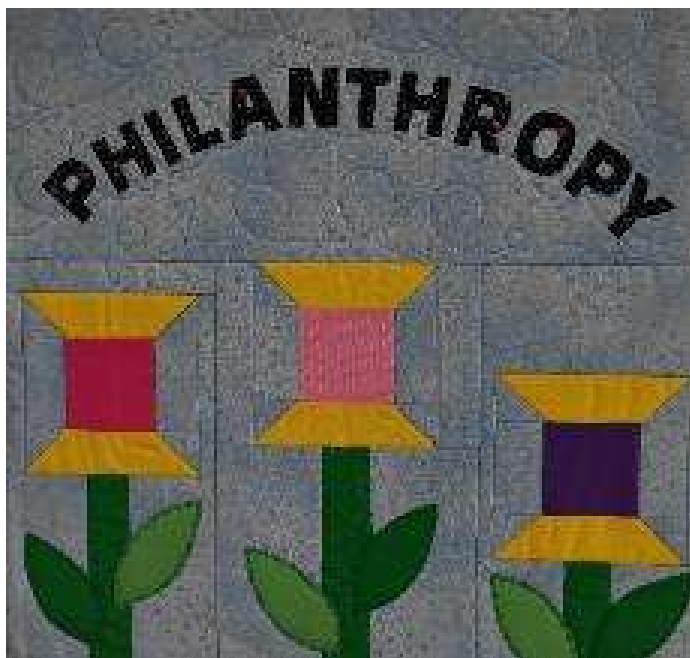

### The Fine Print

1. One form per entered quilt, apparel or home-made article.
2. Deadline for Entry Forms: OGQG meeting June 10, 2026.
3. Maximum of 3 entries per person: no more than one patriotic themed.
4. Quilts larger than 90 inches wide will be folded.
5. Quilts and articles must have a name label on them.
6. All items must be made by an OGQG member. Acknowledge if it was quilted by someone else.
