



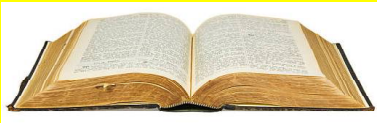

Missions Across the Street

Most Christians are dismissive of missions because "going into all the world" looks very far fetched. Yet it becomes more realistic when we break it down to its basic levels in Acts 1:8, "You will be witnesses to me in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the uttermost parts of the earth."

Start where you are

The average person in Singapore moves about 5 times in his lifetime. Recently, I reviewed my experience and recalled how we have always reached out "across the street" to our neighbours.

Sembawang Hills: my first home after marriage was a rental at Upper Thomson Road. Very often, our Eurasian neighbours, the Drysdals would accompany us to worship at Tanglin Halt.

Holland Village: when we owned our first HDB apartment, we took the children of our next door neighbour, the Hos to our Bible classes.

Jurong West: after having many visitors in our 2-bedroom apartment, our next move was to a larger HDB flat where we shared our master bedroom with visitors from overseas. There we started a weekly Bible study with the Lim sisters, from the next block, who attended and joined us for worship.

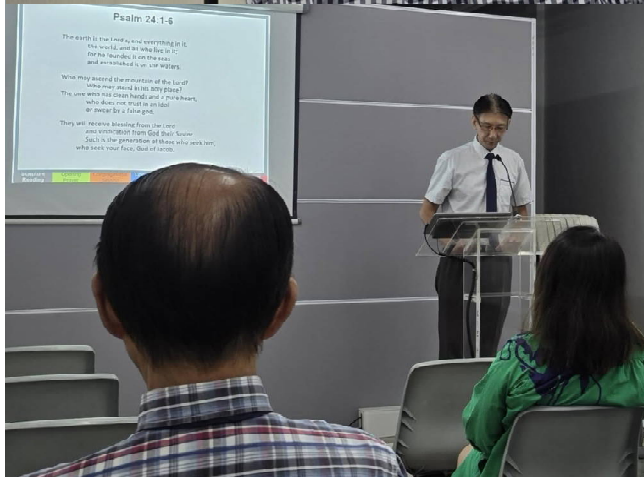
Normanton Park: during our stay, we baptized our next door neighbour and brought a Roman Catholic friend from the next block to our evening worship regularly.

Astrid Meadows: we had several Thai neighbours whom we brought to church.

From our "Jerusalem", we can move to "all Judea and Samaria", and to the "uttermost parts of the earth." The journey of 1,000 miles begin with the first step.

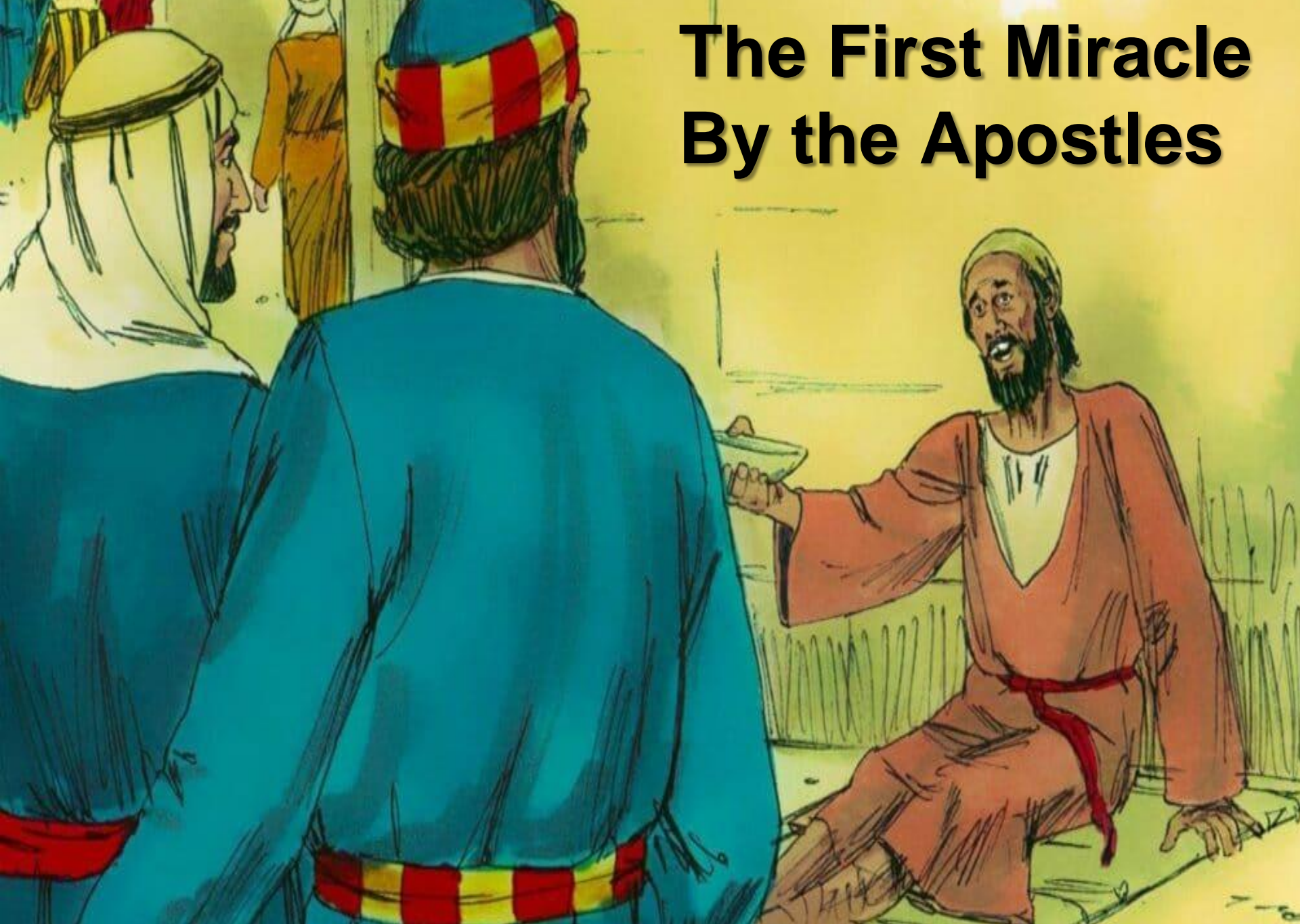

Acts 3:1-11

Peter and John were going up into the temple at the hour of prayer, the ninth hour. A certain man who was lame from his mother's womb was being carried, whom they laid daily at the door of the temple which is called Beautiful, to ask gifts for the needy of those who entered into the temple.

Seeing Peter and John about to go into the temple, he asked to receive gifts for the needy. Peter, fastening his eyes on him, with John, said, "Look at us." He listened to them, expecting to receive something from them. But Peter said, "Silver and gold have I none, but what I have, that I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, get up and walk!"

He took him by the right hand, and raised him up. Immediately his feet and his ankle bones received strength. Leaping up, he stood, and began to walk.

4. Humble – gave God the praise



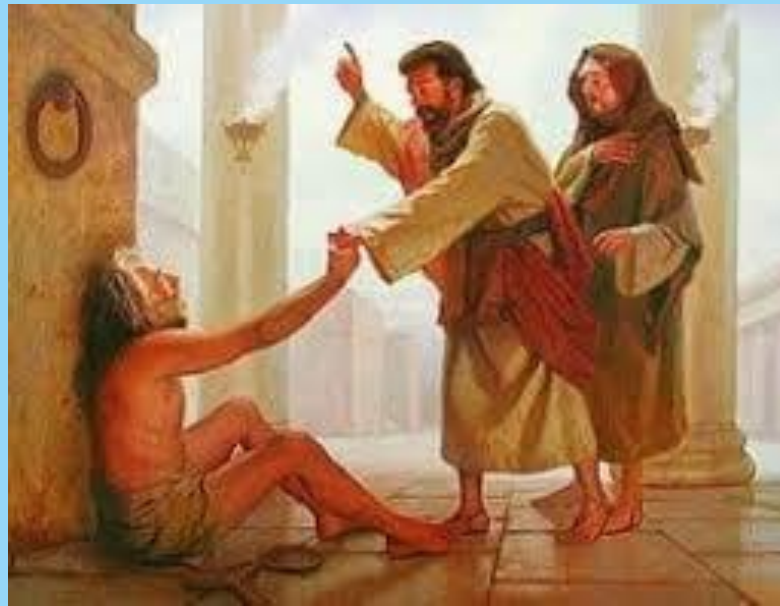
