Where do you shop for furniture? I'm going to shout this guy because he's awesome, there's this furniture store called Hunt, and it's in Eagle Rock. He has this giant warehouse where he restores furniture or builds furniture to order. He built our credenza and it's amazing. We've always wanted go out there and just kind of look at all the different things he has. Then we definitely do Western Elms and Anthropology because you can just find exactly what you're looking for, but there are there are Thrift stores we like, too. I'll do the Salvation Army, although Fabio isn't super at that, and then there's rose Bowl Flea Market and Melrose Trading Post. There's a ton of local artisans and people who make custom furniture. I got it really cool as a drink cart out there like \$50 bucks. You have to dig, but you can find almost everything you're looking for. Do you have any decorating tips or tips? I try not to put things against the wall. Our sofa floats, and I like the idea of a floating sofa. It really opens up your space. We also don't put a ton of material on the walls. We have one great work of art when you walk in, but I don't like things to be super cluttered.
