Presentation Guidelines

For **Practicum Students**, please include the following in your presentation:

- Title slide (school, program, title of presentation, name of organization)
- Background of organization or field of work of supervisor
- Learning objectives of the practicum and any professional development goals
- Project background (What was the motivation for your organization/supervisor to start this project? What is the scope? Who/What will it impact?) and description of your role
- Learning outcomes (how will these lessons help you in your future role as a public health professional?) and project findings (if applicable/if permitted)
- What you liked about your practicum (role, project, etc.) and lessons learned (ex: about working in the field of public health, about the particular area of research you were involved in, etc.)

For **Thesis Students**, please include the following in your presentation:

- Title slide (school, program, title of presentation, name of supervisor/ research institute)
- Background, rationale, and objectives of research project

- Please highlight the potential contribution of this project to the field of public health and/or to the literature
- Methods (if in early stages of thesis, discuss the planned/ anticipated methods)
- Results (or anticipated findings if in early stages of thesis)
- References
