New Equipment for the Students:

Thank you to everyone for giving to the Enrichment and Equipment Fund. The fund is used to pay for specialists, like Jamaroo, our music and movement team coming every week to enhance the classroom experience for our students. Specialist usually account for 70% of the Equipment and Enrichment fund and typically the other 30% is used for new equipment to replace old or broken toys, as well as to purchase items to enrich the classroom. Due to having fewer specialist this year because of covid restrictions and lack of specialists in the area, we used the funds to buy more equipment from Community Playthings, our favorite preschool equipment company.

The occupational therapy group Ready Set Go comes to our school once a year to look at our classroom equipment and set up to recommend materials to support our students in the classroom. Last year, we purchase new circle time chairs for our first-year class and they have helped keep the children focused during music and reading time. This year, we followed their recommendation to purchase these items (please check out the photos attached):

The Garden/Pre-K Area: We purchase new bike trailers for the tricycles to work large motor muscles in the older classes. Children are able to ride in the trailers as back passengers or drivers can load it with blocks or other toys around the bike track. Children are also enjoying the new mud kitchen cook top and sink area next to the sandbox. We bought new kitchen toys, so kids can use water, sand, leaves, and tanbark to create their recipes. There are also two slightly lower outdoor tables and benches for the kids to use in the yard.

The Creek Room and Aftercare Area: We bought new sleeping mats for the nap room. They are more comfortable for the kids and easier to store. We purchased lower equipment to fit the children better, so we have new tables and chairs in the art/lunch area, as well as in the yard. Ready Set Go also recommended buying something to help children step up and down, as well as balance, so we got a climbing and balancing set for the playground. We have new benches, storage boxes, mud kitchen toys and water table equipment for the class.

End of Year Activities:

Spring Conferences are almost done, teachers are now finishing the end of year books for each student (a wonderful keepsake for the children) and preparing for our end of year celebrations. If you have questions regarding childcare charges, you can view daily attendance sign in/out times in Curacubby. Students entering school from 8:00 to 9:00 am are charged for morning care, and those getting picked up at 2:00 or 4:00 pm will be charged for their corresponding aftercare hours.

Health Reminders:

*Please keep your child home if he or she is not feeling well or you suspect COVID-19 exposure. If your child looks to be under the weather when he or she wakes up, please give your child a day at home to rest to make sure he/she is well, as symptoms can worsen as the day goes on. If children come to school sick, not only will they likely spread illness in the class, but your child will not enjoy their day at school feeling sick and with a mask on all morning, plus recovering may take longer without proper rest.

Covid cases are increasing in Marin and in our school area, so please test your child often if possible. We have tests at school if you need one, just ask a teacher at the door. There is also a cold going around in school, and even though your child may not have covid, they still need to rest at home and feel healthy enough to be at school, as well as not be contagious to the rest of the class. Children are also suffering from allergies, which can lead to sinus infection or respiratory issues if not treated properly. Check with your pediatrician for more information.

*We now follow a 48-hour health policy. If your child is home sick, or was sent home due to illness, your child needs to be she is able to return to school. This guideline helps ensure everyone is healthy at school and exposure of any illness, not just covid, is kept at a minimum. Expect more restrictions if there is exposure to COVId-19, as we will follow the Health Department guidelines. Thank you for helping to keep our school community healthy and helping us remain open.
