## Six rivers charter high school calendar

October 9 October 12 12 Director Perry shares upcoming opportunities for parents and students to attend Six Rivers. With a few weeks under our belt, I should welcome the efforts of teachers and students who have done their best to make the most of distance learning. At the same time, we continue to organize the delivery of curricula and help students in need of support. I expect that the settings and changes will continue as we try to figure out what is most effective. To that end, parent meetings will be held over the next two weeks to promote participation and support, as well as meetings of student leaders. First, next week's meeting of the Advisory Committee on Parents will gather materials, discuss student successes and revise current plans. The Parent Advisory Committee (PAC) will meet on Thursday, September 17 at 5:30 a.m. The meeting is open to the entire Six Rivers community. Frankly, the contribution of parents is more important now than ever. I want to focus on the practical aspects of our three goals: providing an effective curriculum, building a supportive safe community, and building support systems for those goals. Study.com, an online educational platform that offers a wide range of products and free resources to make education affordable, ranks 21 out of 50 charter schools in the country for the best mixed learning programs in the country. Six Rivers boasts a robust curriculum replete with electives such as art, drama, journalism and landscaping and what principal Ron Perry describes as a rather seamless relationship with Arcata High School. It's interesting to be recognized in this way, said Perry, who acknowledged that Six Rivers is one of many schools in the area doing such a job. I think study.com chose us because we have a program that fits their model. We really have some great things going on. We have students taking online classes. We create programs for each student based on what they need. Humboldt County Superintendent of Schools, Chris Hartley, the original school principal who has worked with colleagues and the North Humboldt Union High School District, of which Six Rivers is part of to launch the program in 2003, said that the mixed learning option provides educational benefits for students in need of an alternative approach to traditional learning structures - especially for those interested in a smaller-size program, integrated learning, with a project based on focus. Sarajane Christiansen, a sophomore at Six Rivers, benefits from a comprehensive approach to schooling, where she uses her independent research options to ease her path into full-time on-site learning. (Rob Peach - Times Standard) Students engaged in online learning periodically report to the class under the guidance of an assistant, but otherwise work independently. Online courses via Redwood Redwood College two other providers, Cyber High and Apex Learning. According to Perry, courses are useful for individuals dealing with anxiety, providing a smooth segue into the dynamics of the physical class and the full load of the course. They also serve as a corrective function for students dealing with previous academic hurdles. They also allow students to get ahead on high school courses and get college loans. Not only does the charter school offer mixed learning in terms of online course offerings, but also through a partnership with Arcata High, where Six Rivers students can play sports and take electives. In fact, all 100 Six Rivers students take classes through Arcata High. Perry said Six Rivers is proud of community and student pedagogy. Six Rivers is not universal for every school kind of situation, Perry said. We recognize that students need a wide variety of options. We do better because we have these options at our disposal. ... And we're small. I know the name of every child (and their parents). Daniel Brown, who is marketing for study.com, said in an email that the six rivers stood despite its small size because it allows for independent research through its online options. As for the criticism that they create social isolation among students or between students and teachers, Brown said it's not that lonely. Interaction between people is very important and this is a major obstacle to online learning, he wrote. But online learning is not a lonely world. For example, online forums can give students the opportunity to communicate and work together. This collaboration can be asynchronous, meaning students don't need to find a time when they're all free. And, of course, mixed approaches to learning are not just online. The idea behind a successful mixed learning environment like six Rivers is that human-to-human interaction is embedded in the curriculum. Perry would agree, in an email, that mixed learning, at least at Six Rivers, is more than just a matter of kettling students into a virtual space with little peer interaction. In my opinion, I would expand (mixed learning) to include parallel enrollment options as well, he said, referring to courses available through Arcata High School and CR. It's effective in that we present students with the opportunity to increase or support their learning by taking these online options, Perry said. The bottom line is that a school like Six Rivers is committed to providing a variety of options to maximize learning for each student. Megan Froloff, a former independent teaching lab teacher who now teaches English, says she was attracted to Six Rivers after the student taught there because it gives personal communication that is necessary for their success in learning. It is also included in marginalized communities, Frolov said, without pumping disabled students into solitary confinement. For Sarajane Christiansen, a sophomore at Six Rivers who transferred from Northcoast Preparatory Academy after struggling with the crowd and social aspect of the school, charter school is a boon. To integrate myself back into classroom situations, I started with one or two classes in place and then would do independent learning outside of that. And it's ultimately a very useful thing for me, she said, noting that being able to learn on her own has increased her ability to self-motivate and challenges her to dive deeper into what she's learning. Next year she will continue her independent education in the same class. She currently adopts English, history, science and mathematics on her own. On the spot, she takes photography and art - things I can't do on independent research too well because they require creative guidance. Christiansen is interested in continuing the path in art, architecture and/or graphic design - a passion that crystallized when she decided, at 12, to design a treehouse with the help of her deceased grandfather building experience as he owned a sawmill in Humboldt County. Unfortunately, he passed away before we finished it, Christiansen said, though now sits 20 feet tall with a ladder and a fence. Overall, Christiansen said she was pleased with her experience.
