# LA MALADIE DU DÉMON









People chained to trees. A woman falls into the fire and nobody helps her. In Burkina Faso there is no place in traditional society for people with mental illness and epilepsy. Demons are seen as the cause of the diseases that many people fear to be infected. Affected people live on the outskirts of the villages, in prayer centers or wander around unnoticed, often they are chained or beaten. But Pastor Guitanga and Nurse Tindano are bravely committed to medical treatment, freedom and human dignity, against the belief of an entire society, within their modest options.

#### LILITH KUGLER

Producer and director of LA MALADIE DU DÉMON

She lived in Burkina Faso as a child, and later spent 3 years in the Philippines. She first came into contact with the topic of mental health in Burkina Faso in 2009 and she has not let go since then.

#### ATOUSA VAN BEEK

She is a medical student at the RUG. She went to Suriname and interviewed patients with a history of psychosis, their families and local medical practitioners about their experiences and challenges with psychosis.

#### MOHAMMED ALMAGHLOUTH

A medical student at the RUG. During his last year in the bachelor he did a project about mental health in Saudi Arabia. The project focused on raising awareness about psychiatric disorders in Saudi Arabia.

#### **CHARLOTTE CLOUS**

She is a medical anthropologist and works at the center for Centre for Transcultural Psychiatry Veldzicht. She conducts research into the relation between culture and mental health and trains professionals into culturesensitive care











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## **EL SUSTO**









Mexico's Number One Killer is not cartels. It's Type 2 Diabetes. El Susto (The Shock) tells the story of how courageous public health activists in Mexico stirred a giant, the powerful beverage industry, aka "Big Soda", when they took action to curb sugary drink consumption, with sobering and inspiring lessons for the rest of the world.

### PANEL

#### MODERATOR: REGIEN BIESMA

Assistant professor at the Global Health Unit at UMCG. She specialises in public health and epidemiology. Her research focuses on global maternal and child health and nutrition, in particular the double burden of malnutrition and the effect on NCDs later in life.

#### **BRIGIT TOEBES**

She is professor in the Chair Health Law in a Global Context at the Faculty of Law. She specialises in international health law and human rights. Her current research focuses on the regulation of behavioural risk factors (smoking, diet), socio-economic health inequalities, and other public health-related concerns.

#### JOSE LUIS FLORES-GUERRERO

PhD student at UMCG. He has worked on the prediction of the incidence of type 2 diabetes, hypertension and the progression of diabetic kidney disease. He collaborates with the National Institute of Astrophysics, Optics and Electronics (Mexico), helping in the development of non-invasive instruments for the diagnosis of Diabetes and its complications.

#### WIEKE PAULUSMA

Project leader Ommelander hospital Groningen, councilor in the city of Groningen. She focuses on the question of whether, in order to really promote people's health, we should not stop focusing on treatment and invest in the environment and the opportunities that people have.





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
