September 5th Church Council Meeting Highlights: Church Council met for its regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday, September 5th at 7:00 PM with 8 of 10 members present. Financial Report as of August 31st: General Fund balance \$2,367; Building Fund balance \$1,194; Memorial Fund \$10,385. Following Committee Reports, Old Business included the upcoming worship together with Calvary/Spring Lake/Harris (Sunday, November 26th), and Thanksgiving Eve worship at Calvary (November 22nd), bus repair and maintenance items, strengthening and clarifying our financial reports and updating the webpage. New Business items included brainstorming fellowship and outreach ideas (Pastor Nathan and NCII Wendy), updating our bulletin boards and volunteer sign-up station, inventory of the church keys, and updating our livestream (including a motion to engage Ministry Technology Solutions to evaluate our systems and give an estimate on upgrading to an optimal level). Complete minutes of the meeting will be approved at the next regular meeting and made available in the church office. The next regular meet-

October 2nd Church Council Meeting Highlights: Church Council met for its regularly scheduled meeting on Monday, October 2nd at 7:00 PM with 9 of 10 members present. Financial Report as of September 30th: General Fund balance \$2,366; Building Fund balance \$2,331; Memorial Fund \$10,532. Following Committee Reports, Old Business items included the upcoming Thanksgiving Eve and November 26th worship shared with Calvary/Spring Lake/Harris, motion to enter into a contract with Ministry Technology Solutions at \$28/hour, updating our bulletin boards and volunteer sign-up station, brainstorming ideas for fellowship and outreach, inventory of church keys, and an update to the Backpack Food Program. Complete minutes of the meeting will be approved at the next regular meeting and made available in the church office. New Business items included uplifting donations of time and talent at the next Annual Meeting.

October 15th Special Church Council Meeting Highlights: Church Council met for a special meeting following worship on Sunday, October 15th with 8 of 10 members present. Motion to approve a bid from Ministry Technology Solutions at \$1,423.84 plus \$28/hour labor of installation for a new Lenovo laptop for livestreaming, digital audio mixer, Cat5e Wire, Netgear 5 Por PoE switch, Netgear MESH system, and StarTech Docking Station. The current Lenovo laptop in the sanctuary will be used as a computer office upgrade. Complete minutes of the meeting will be approved at the next regular meeting and made available in the church office.

October 17th Special Church Council Meeting Highlights: Church Council met for a special meeting at 7:30 PM with 7 of 10 members present. Motion to accept the gift of \$330,000 from the Evelyn Erickson Estate to be used to pay off the current mortgage. The remaining balance will go into a capital improvement fund (Investment Account) to be used for major capital improvements designated by council and will require a 30% match from other funds in order to be used. Complete minutes of the meeting will be approved at the next regular meeting and made available in the church office.

That's A Lot of Food!: 156 pounds! That's how much we collected over the summer months for the Rush City Food Shelf. 35 pounds of tuna, 20 pounds of chicken, 47 pounds of macaroni and cheese, 30 pounds of pasta, and 24 pounds of other items. Congratulations for Gavin Moulton for guessing closest to the correct weight (he guessed 105 pounds). We are so grateful for those who donated much-needed select items such as macaroni and cheese, canned tuna, canned chicken, and pasta. A reminder that Food Shelf donations can be dropped in the bin in the Fellowship Hall.

Many generations of children from Rush City remember Evelyn as a beloved elementary school teacher. At her wish and under the terms of her estate, Evelyn's gift has now paid off the remaining balance of our building mortgage effective October 20th. The remaining balance of Evelyn's gift will become a Capital Improvement Fund. Any project underwritten by this fund will require a 30% match from congregational contributions. Although future projects await, we can and must celebrate that our ministry can move forward with greater hope!

Your Gifts Are Appreciated: Overall giving to our congregation's ministries continues to improve from last year, however, we are running a small budget deficit of \$11,910 year-to-date in our General Fund. That means our greatest need now is contributions toward the General Fund. These essential contributions support the "bread and butter" of our life together—staff salaries, programs for youth and children, utilities and basic maintenance—all the things that make it possible for us to gather together, serve God and neighbor, and maintain a visible presence in our community. For those who filled out a commitment card to the General Fund for 2023, the good news is that our current pledge deficit would more than cover our budget deficit and put us on a solid foundation beginning in 2024.
