A 3-year holistic development project in Ichchhakamana Rural Municipality, Chitwan, implementing 'Panchamama Raymi' Module: Working with 594 households, the project fosters a 60-40 partnership with the local government to provide agricultural inputs and promote sustainable livelihoods.

SVSI launched a project to provide shelter and homes to the pro-poor community affected by the floods in Nepal in 2020. The project resulted in the construction of 42 houses in Ratnanagar Municipality, with 21 fully constructed and 21 partially constructed and renovated. Additional 13 houses has been planned for construction every year.
