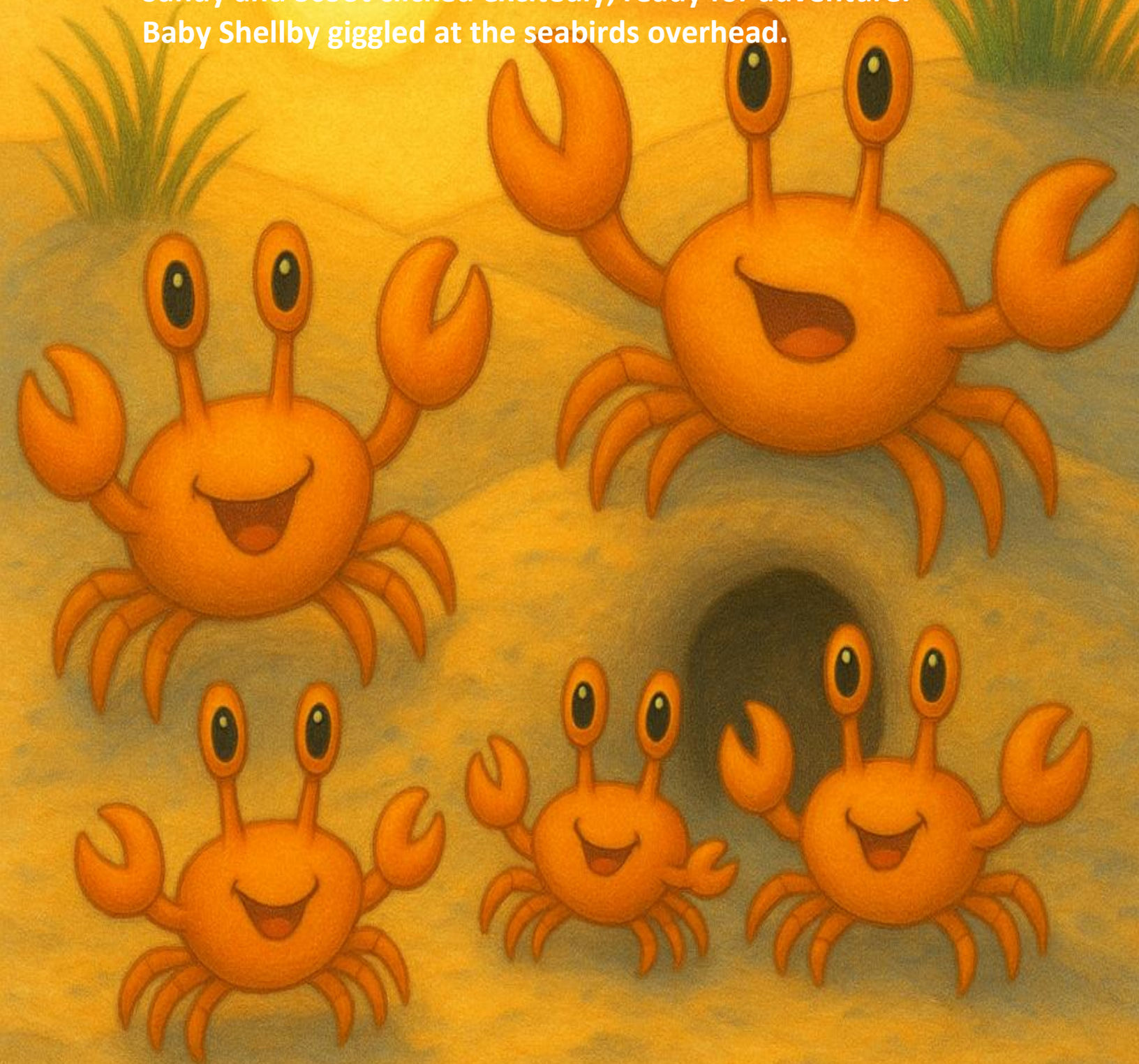
On a peaceful morning in the Outer Banks, the Dunehopper Ghost Crab Family scurried out of their burrow just as the sun painted the dunes gold.

Sandy and Scoot clicked excitedly, ready for adventure.

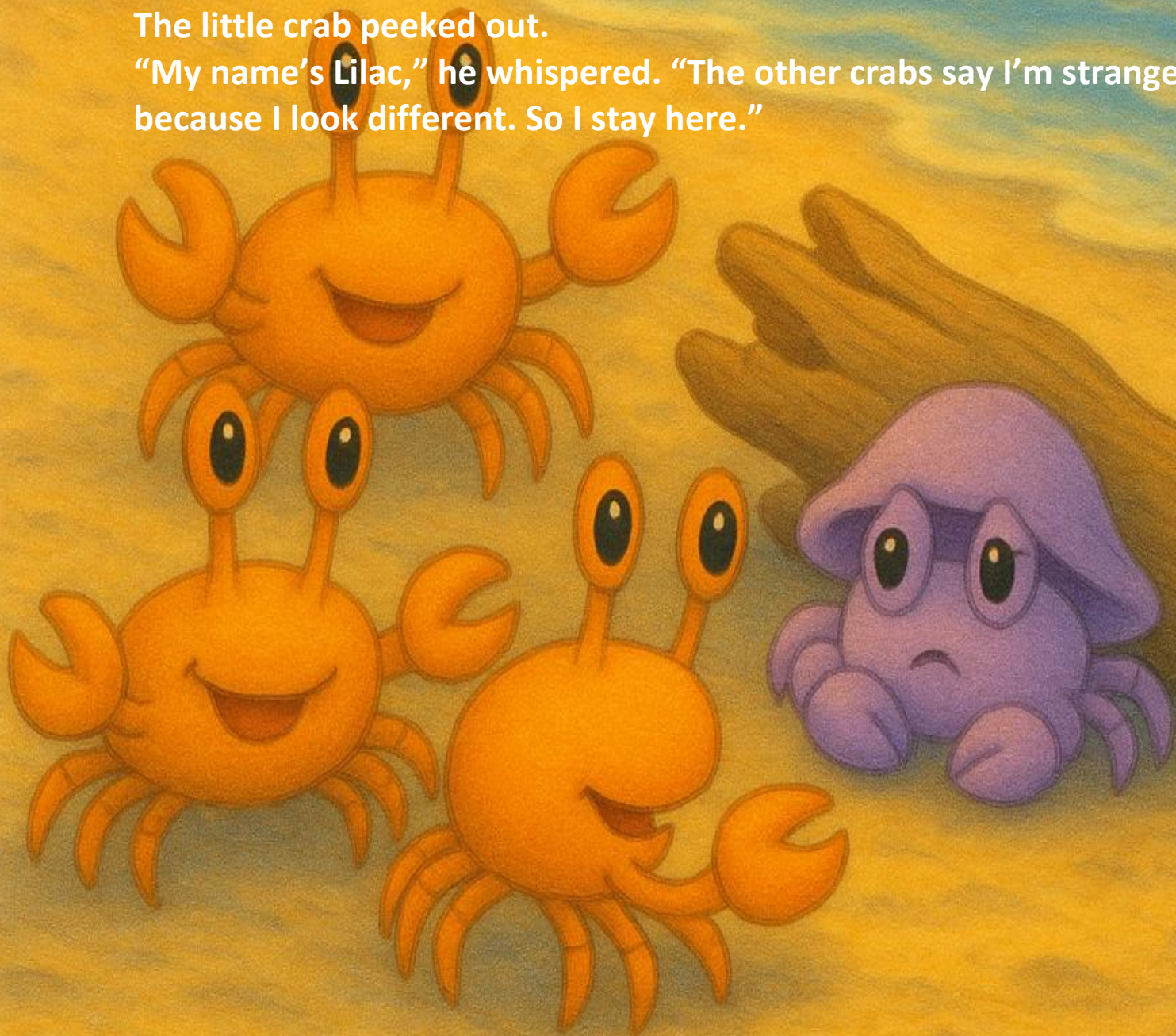
Baby Shellby giggled at the seabirds overhead.

Scout offered Lilac a shiny pebble.

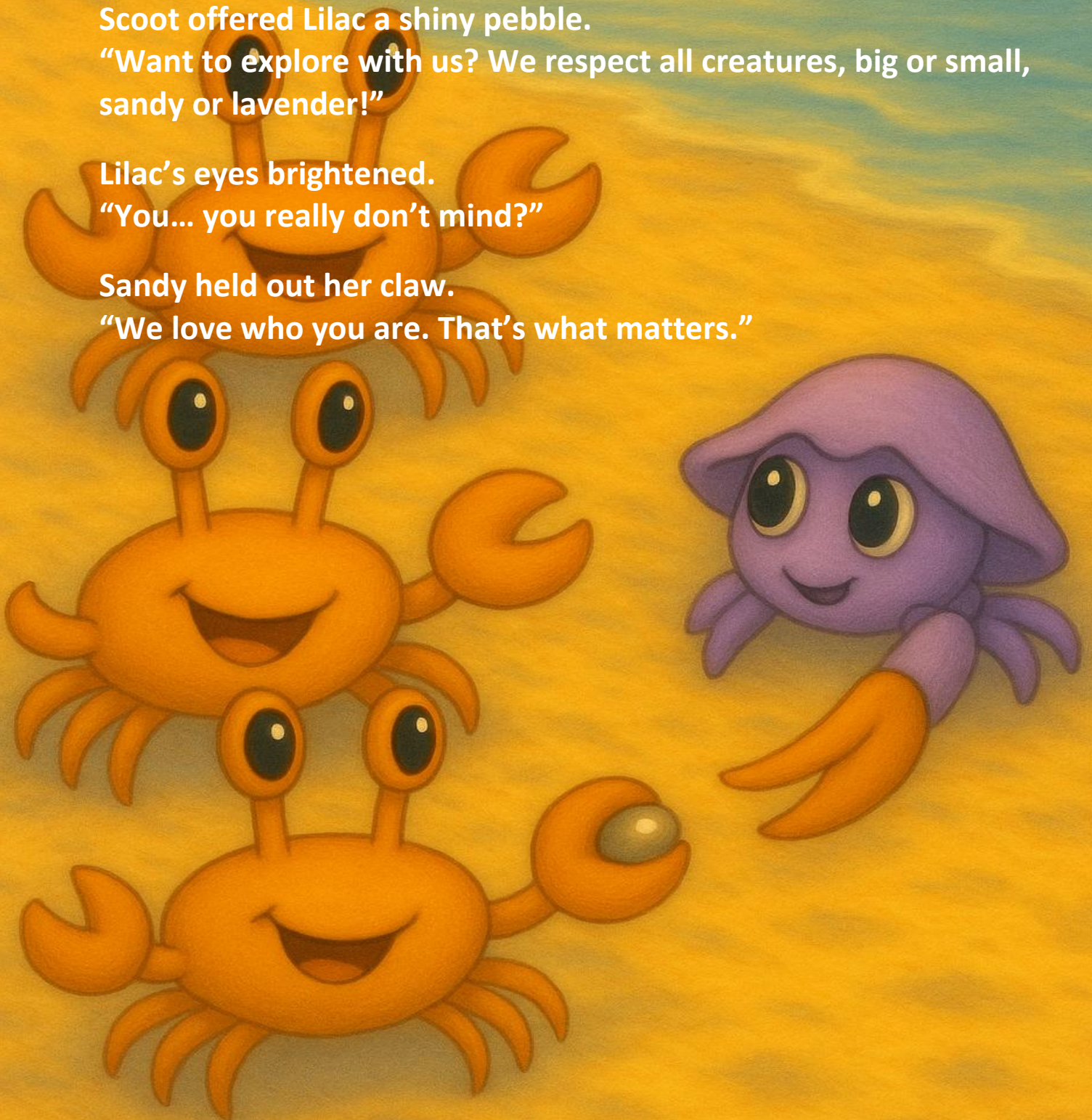
"Want to explore with us? We respect all creatures, big or small, sandy or lavender!"

"We love who you are. That's what matters."

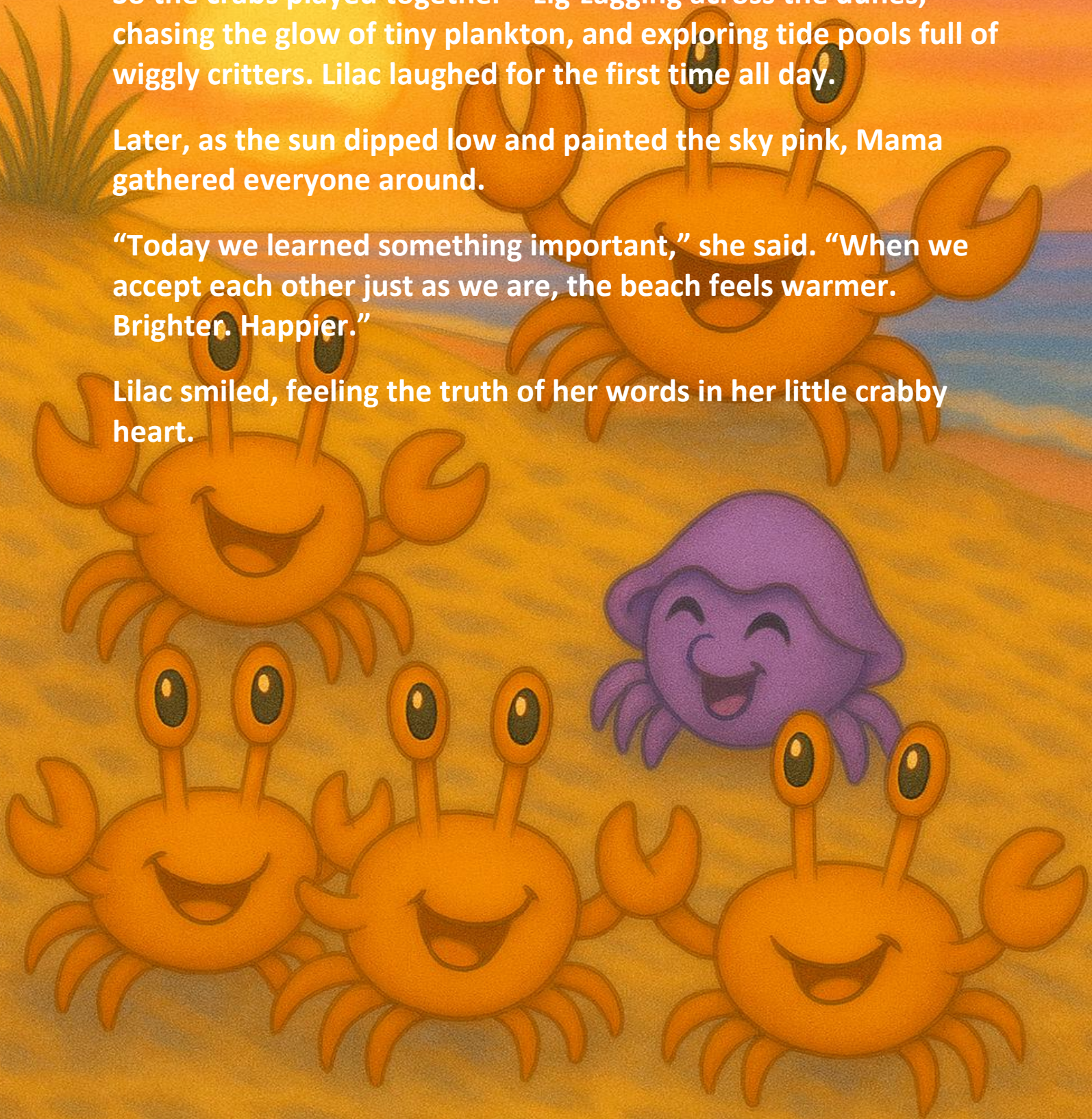

- Ghost crabs use their eyes to stay safe.

Their tall eyestalks let them see almost all the way around them—helping them watch for danger and find friends!

- The beach is home to many kinds of creatures.

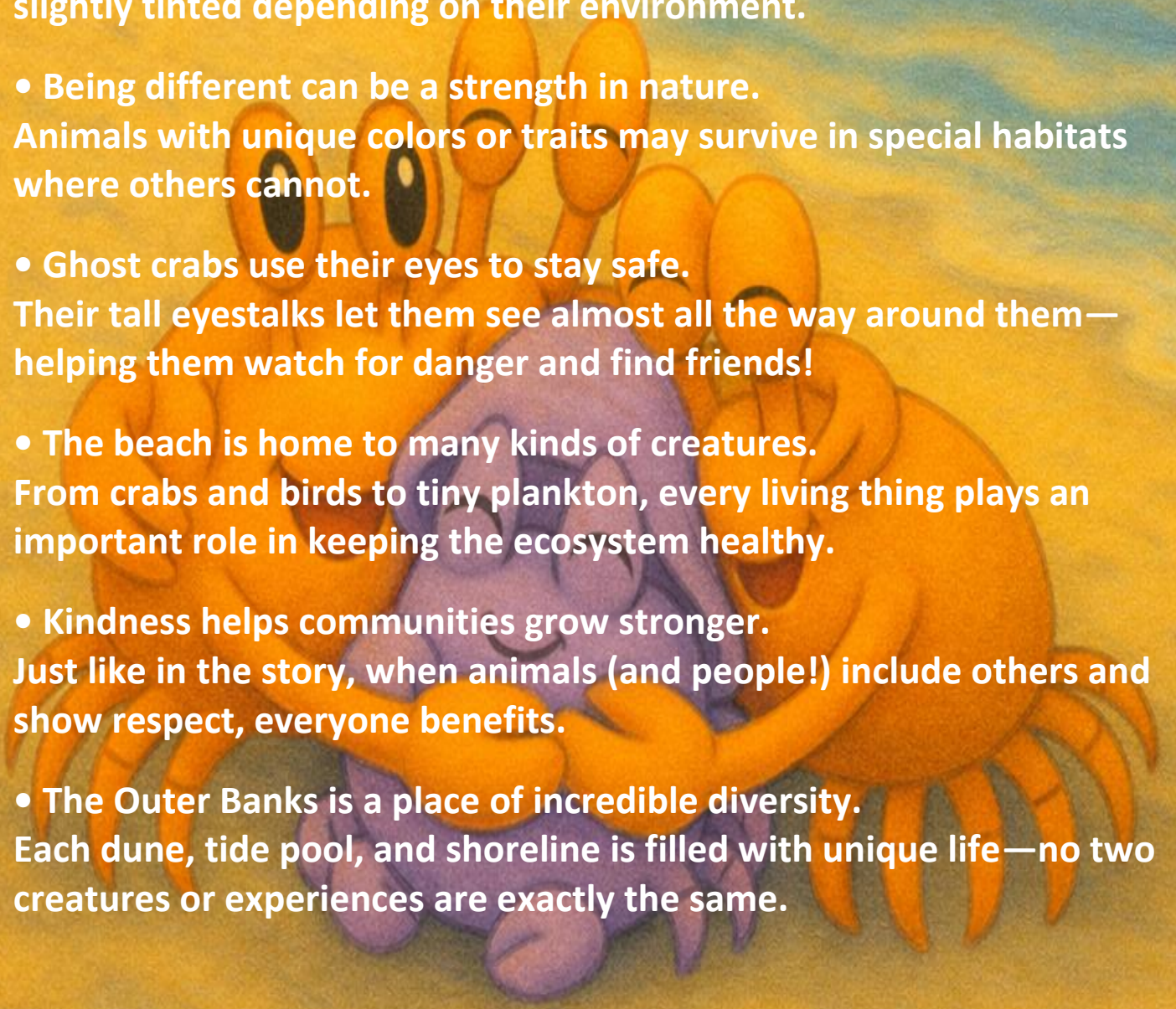
From crabs and birds to tiny plankton, every living thing plays an important role in keeping the ecosystem healthy.
