PCC Updates

The latest approved minutes are now on the church website under governance.

Headlines from the last meeting - the Children and Family Worker post is finishing at the end of the year. The PCC was able to fund this 2-year post from legacies but has not been able to commit further funds for its extension. Anna will be saying goodbye at the end of the year: we are enormously grateful for all that she has done for our children and families.

The PCC is creating two new, small posts- please look out for information about a Community Musician Post and a Sunday Club Leader post.

Audio-Visual Consultation

Sincere thanks to all who responded to the consultation about the proposed new AV projector system. 56 people responded online or on paper, which is a high response rate. There was strong support for the proposal, with 41 either strongly agreeing or agreeing, and many useful comments offered. [see table]. A fuller analysis is available on request. PCC has considered the proposal in light of these results and also reflected on the pros and cons. In view of financial constraints and a number of urgent building costs, it was not able to commit funds immediately to initiate the work. In addition, introduction of large TV screens into the building will require a Faculty application; it may be that the PCC will need to show that they have considered other options. The PCC will keep you posted.

New Door, Fire and Emergency Response policies approved by PCC

New policies covering door security, fire safety and emergency response policies have been approved by PCC, after a lengthy and careful process of review. They were prompted by three factors:

- · some recent disturbing incidents requiring a rethink of how we use our doors
- the discovery that our fire safety needed a major upgrade (you'll see new wall-mounted alarms already)
- a larger process already under way of bringing a whole range of our policies into line with diocesan requirements.

Staff, relevant volunteers and others will be informed of the new policies, and they are also available to anyone who wants to see them, via the office. Policies apply to our whole community, including external hirers

The overall goal of the policies is to strike the best balance between keeping St Paul's as open and welcoming a place as possible for all, while ensuring that it is also as safe a space as possible for all.

You may over time notice various changes to how the Centre and Church operate. For example, some doors will be kept closed or locked more frequently than they were, new fire doors will be installed (some with an automatic release mechanism), access to the side door will be somewhat restricted, and the list of those with keys or access codes will be reviewed. These changes may take a bit of adjustment, so we'd ask for your patience and support as the new arrangements roll out. You are always free to make a suggestion or raise a concern to staff, warden or PCC members.

Thank you very much for your understanding as we seek to keep St Paul's as an inviting, welcoming space for all.
