The gentleman's guide to getting lucky

Does Santorini's romantic appeal make the first Percy magical, or does all the wailing and accumulation completely spoil the atmosphere? My Thoughts In Many Ways, The Gentleman's Guide to Getting Lucky feels very similar to Monty/Percy fanfic. (And if you know something about me, then you know it's a huge compliment!) Some of my favorite fics are simpler stories where the relationship between the characters is more important than the great adventure or intense action, and that's just what's happening here. Mackenzi Lee throws Monty and Percy to a sunny Greek isle, there's little to do but be together. Felicity is there (the story is among the Gentleman's Guide to Vice and Virtue and The Lady's Guide to Petticoats and Piracy), as is the crew of Eleftheria. But in addition to the brief conspiracy between the Montague brothers, which deals with roses and romantic décor, the main purpose of the short story is the two boys, well, luck. But, like the best fanfic, there is nothing insignificant or irrelevant about this story. Percy and Monty are together at the beginning and together at the end, but the relationship is deepening and ripening. They both learn to talk to each other about difficult things rather than hide or ignore it. Although the story is ostensibly the boys want to get it on, there's more to it than that (again, as the best fics). Sex - especially the hangups and desires to pop-ups like the unexpected obstacles that they actually have after being told about sex - is a physical manifestation of psychological concerns. By the end of Gentleman's Guide, Monty is literally devoid of his tyrannical, abusive father, but one still holds much to reign over his emotional well-being. Monty needs to survive the trauma of his father before he's fully committed to a real relationship. While you don't have to read this short story in order to understand the plot of Lady's Guide, this is an important scene from the love story of Monty and Percy. Besides, why don't you want to read a well-written story with adorable characters and stunning insights?
