

The Kuch Karo Project: College Exposure Program

We would love to work with your students!

Here is the general procedure and structure to start The Kuch Karo Project at your college. We are also flexible with changes that your institution may need.

- 1) **Initial meeting.** We come and meet with a faculty member and administrator to introduce ourselves and our program. We would like to discuss the students who you would like to participate.
- 2) **Founders' Talk with Students.** We hold an in-person presentation for all of your students. We will speak about the importance of volunteering, why students should volunteer, and then explain how our program works. At the presentation, we will have a sign-up sheet for any and all students who are interested in participating.
- 3) **Select Faculty Advisor and Student Liaisons.** We will work with your faculty advisor to choose two or three student liaisons who will work with us to organize events and communicate with their peers.
- 4) **Set Up Events.** We recommend holding two to four events per month. We will work with your faculty advisors and student liaisons to choose the NGOs and finalize dates and times for the events. The liaisons will be in charge of finalizing the students who will be attending each event.
- 5) **Pre-Event Training.** One day before the event, each student (for that event) will receive an email and a video from us telling them about the NGO, what they will be doing, as well as some guidelines for volunteering with the particular demographic.
- 6) **Group Celebration and Discussion!** After three or six months (based on your choosing), we will hold a group celebration with all of the participating students. We will speak with the students about their experiences, and we will present each student with a participation certificate from The Kuch Karo Project. In addition, the top three students with the greatest number of hours will get special recognition.
