ABSTRACT

This study assessed the Understanding the Adaptive Response of Grade 6 pupils towards their Interpersonal Skills in Nasugbu West Central School. The findings of the study served as a basis for adaptive response of the pupils towards their interpersonal skills. This study utilized forty (40) students, twenty males and twenty female using quantitative-descriptive and correlational research method. The findings of the study revealed that the respondents were 11-12 years old, majority were male and female of Grade Six pupils.
