Assuming you have something to spend them on, gift cards are as good as money. But one convenient difference between money and gift cards: No one is going to trade you \$50 in cash for less than \$50. But with some clever tricks, you can buy gift cards that are considerably less than their purchasing power. All you need to get the best price on gift cards is to buy them with the right credit card in the right place: a popular place to buy (and sell) gift cards secondhand using gift card exchange sites like Plastic Jungle and Gift Card Granny. You can use one of these sites to save as much as 35% on the face value of your gift card (or more if you include an eBay seller). However, the choice of gift cards for these resellers is sometimes slim and often sells for odd numbers, so if you want to save the amount of money on a particular gift card, you may not have much luck here. Also, when you're in a hurry, it's easier to go to the store to buy gift cards. *G/O Media* is another strategy that automatically discounts the most popular gift cards that might get commissions: Save gift card money by using gift cards to buy gift cards with rewarded credit cards at groceries, pharmacies, or office supply stores. If you have a credit card that will get you a 3-6% buy-back on a supermarket purchase, you can buy a gift card at the supermarket, so you can essentially save 3-6%. Other places where you can purchase gift cards with corresponding credit card benefit categories include office supply stores and pharmacies. For example, if you have these cards, you can get your cash back with a gift card for the American Express Blue Cash Preferred (6% back at the supermarket), daily (3% back to the supermarket) or your grandfather's daily (5% back at the supermarket or pharmacy) card. Chase Inc. (5% office supply store), Amex Simply Cash Card, and other Amex open cards (office supply stores 5%). Using gift cards to buy another gift card, *Area* explains another gift card and reward card buying strategy: Use a (discount) gift card for one store to buy another gift card that you might actually use. For example, you can get a Toys R Us gift card (you can get 5% cashback through *uPromise*) and use that card to buy an Amazon gift card. If you want to buy an OfficeMax gift card that includes a credit card that rewards shopping at an office supply store, you can use that OfficeMax gift card to purchase another gift card. At the end of buying a gift card with a credit card rewards program/points, if you have a reward credit card, it may make more sense to exchange rewards for gift cards rather than other types of rewards (such as cash or miles) because gift card redemptions are often cheaper. Sometimes on sale, Citibank credit cards, for example, received a \$100 Amazon gift card redemption offer for 9000 points (1000 points or about \$10 savings), while a typical cashback reward is \$50 for 10,000 points. If you buy a gift card with a credit card or a shopping portal such as Chase Ultimate Rewards or A Advantage, you can earn miles and points with that gift card purchase. A gift card is a prepaid card that can be used by anyone who receives it. Gift cards usually look like credit cards, but they don't run into debt for their use. Gift cards are replacing old paper gift certificates and are the perfect giveaway if you don't know what to buy. Gift cards with logos for major credit cards such as Deeper Definition MasterCard, Visa, American Express and Discover can be used at any store that accepts these cards. Some cards can be used in stores owned by the same parent company. Gap Inc., for example, owns Gap, Old Navy, Banana Republic and Asleta, so Gap Inc.'s gift cards are good at the stores it owns. Some gift cards are only available at one merchant. Companies such as Target, Amazon, Best Buy and Macy's Offer Cards can only be used to buy goods. Some gift cards charge an activation fee of about \$5. You will be charged an activation fee when you purchase the gift card. Some gift cards charge a dormant fee for cards that you haven't used for a year. Some gift cards act like cash. If it is lost or stolen, the funds will be in the hands of the person with the card. Other cards can be registered online and reported as lost or stolen. When that happens, the balance is frozen and transferred to a new card. Starbucks and Crate & Barrel are two retailers that encourage customers to register gift cards and issue new cards if lost or stolen. If you want to give a gift card, give the recipient a card activation receipt and a piece of paper with the gift card number, including the additional security number on the card. If the card is lost or stolen, the recipient can replace the card more easily. If the recipient notices that their card is missing, they should contact the retailer or credit card company immediately. Retailers must be able to freeze their accounts and issue new cards using activation receipts or gift card numbers. Most store cards don't charge an exchange fee, but bank-issued cards may charge a fee. Gift card exampleThe person who received the gift card can use it to pay for some or all of the purchase. Some gift cards have a maximum amount that can be loaded, but they can be reloaded, so recipients can add funds later if needed.
