How old are fred and george in the first book.

Gryffindor students Angelina Johnson and Cedric Diggory start at Hogwarts in 1989, while Lee Jordan joins Gryffindor as well. In their first year, they discover the famous Golden Snitch map and use it to gain an advantage until passing it down to Harry Potter in December 1993. Percy Weasley becomes a prefect during his fifth year and receives a Screech owl named Hermes, before giving his pet rat Scabbers to Ron. As we descend to number ninety-three, Diagon Alley - Weasleys' Wizarding Wheezes, our new premises, Fred and George Weasley are busy with their latest mischief. Flashback to April 22nd, 1996, when the twins were caught by Filch for turning a Hogwarts corridor into a swamp. Umbridge threatened them, but they remained unrepentant. They Accio-ed their brooms from her office and flew off. Jump forward to July 27th, 1997, for the Battle of the Seven Potters - an aerial battle fought over southern England between the Order of the Phoenix and Death Eaters. Then, May 2nd, 1998, during the Battle of Hogwarts, Fred met his demise after reconnecting with Percy. In the spirit of exploring the Weasley siblings' ages, we'll examine various pieces of evidence from Harry Potter canon. Since J.K. Rowling has revealed their birthdays and corrected her statements on Charlie and Percy's relative ages, let's dive into this discussion using the Lexicon's suggested relative dating system. Ron Weasley's age in his second year at Hogwarts was not explicitly mentioned in the books. However, evidence from the Chamber of Secrets suggests that Ginny was starting her first year, Ron his second. Fred and George their fourth, and Percy his fifth. According to J.K. Rowling's website and various online sources, including Mugglenet and Wizarding World Digital (WBD), the birthdays of the Weasley children are as follows: - Ron: March 1st - Ginny: August 11th - Percy: August 22nd - Bill: November 29th - Charlie: December 12th Fred and George share the same birthday, April 1st. These dates were primarily disclosed on Rowling's website in the birthday calendar. With this information and knowing that students must be at least eleven years old to attend Hogwarts, we can infer that Hermione was nearly twelve when she started at Hogwarts, as opposed to Ron who was nearly eleven. However, determining the exact ages of Bill and Charlie relative to their siblings required additional clarification from Rowling. In a web chat, Rowling initially stated that Charlie is two years older than Percy. However, later correcting herself in another chat, she mentioned that Charlie is actually three years older than Percy, making him the Seeker in Harry's first year. To summarize, Bill is two years older than Charlie, who is three years older than Percy, with Fred and George being two years younger than Percy, Ron a year younger than them, and Ginny the youngest. The dates related to Ron's year of birth, Y0 (1980?), as well as the Hogwarts years of various characters, are examined. The problem arises with determining Percy Weasley's and Charlie Weasley's ages correctly. Using Rowling's three-year difference for Harry Potter, it initially seems that Charlie was born on December 12th, Y-7 (1973?), making him two years, eight months, and ten days older than Percy. However, this would place Charlie in H-5, meaning he would be starting his seventh year when Harry and Ron began their first. The solution involves using the Hogwarts years instead, with Charlie being three years ahead of Percy at Hogwarts, which suggests Charlie was born on December 12th, Y-8 (1972?). This allows for Bill Weasley to be two years older than Charlie both in calendar years and at Hogwarts. A table is created to show the birthdays of the Weasley children: - **Bill:** November 29th, Y:10 (1970?) - **Charlie:** December 12th, Y:8 (1972?) - **Percy:** August 22nd, Y:4 (1976?) - **Fred & George:** April 1st, Y:2 (1978?) - **Ron:** March 1st, Y0 (1980?) - **Ginny:** August 11th, Y1 (1981?) A summary of the findings from previous sections is provided in a table to give a better overview. The students are counted as belonging to the Hogwarts year in which they attend their first year at school. Harry's first year at Hogwarts was a significant one for Gryffindor's Quidditch team. As the new captain, Harry took on the role of Seeker, a position previously held by none other than Charlie Weasley, Ron's second-oldest brother. McGonagall had once described Charlie as an extraordinary Seeker, and Wood was deeply impressed by this claim, suggesting that he may have seen Charlie in action. However, it is unclear whether Wood actually witnessed Charlie playing or if it was his legendary status that made such a strong impression on him. Later, when Harry became the new Gryffindor Seeker, Fred and George were thrilled, believing that with Harry on board, their team would finally win the Quidditch Cup. They mentioned that Gryffindor hadn't won since Charlie left, but it was unclear whether they meant he had left Hogwarts or the Quidditch team. As for the year Charlie left, it seemed to be sometime before the events of book 1. Despite this, Fred and George were optimistic about their chances, hoping to break the streak of eight years without a win. The final mention of Charlie was in the context of Gryffindor's failure to win the Quidditch Cup for seven consecutive years prior to the events of book 3. Charlie Weasley played Quidditch for Gryffindor eight years before Book 3, which means the final was in Y5, at the end of the Y4 academic year. Since first-year students can't play, Charlie must have been in his second year, attending H-7. The quotes about Charlie's Quidditch career suggest that Gryffindor enjoyed a winning streak while he played, not just one victory followed by honorable seconds. Unfortunately, this interpretation is impossible according to the books, but it would be disappointing if true. Bill, the last Weasley sibling, has limited age information, making it more intriguing. In CS17, Ginny mentions Bill started at Hogwarts when she was about a year old and could remember his departure or being made a Prefect (when she was six). This is confirmed by Harry's description of Bill as wearing an earring and ponytail, fitting with him being almost ten years older than Harry. Bill's relationship to Fleur Delacour also provides clues. He seems seven years older than her, assuming she left school at 18. The fact that Bill explains about the Death Eaters in Book 4 suggests he might remember the first war, though not necessarily as an active combatant. This could make him a precocious child who recalled information he heard later on. Wearing the Head Boy badge in PS12 The Mirror of Erised is not surprising. Ron would have been around eight years old when Bill started his last year at Hogwarts, and it's likely he remembered it well when he started himself three years later. In hindsight, I would have proposed a different age range for Charlie and Bill before 2004, but the evidence has changed that scenario. Initially, Charlie's achievements in Quidditch seemed impressive, especially with Gryffindor winning the Cup every year from his second to fourth or fifth year. However, this makes it harder to believe his legendary status in the house. Harry's case is different, as he was already a legend before joining the team and had a unique role. The new information from WBD and Rowling's website has altered our understanding of Charlie's age. He is now listed as being two years older than Percy, which suggests that Charlie's age range might be broader. The loose interpretation of this statement could imply he is between one and four or five years older, aligning with my initial estimate. I must admit I initially rejected the WBD information but had to accept the correction. This means we now know Charlie left Hogwarts a few months before Harry and Ron started. It's essential to be cautious when expecting scientific consistency in this context. The Harry Potter series by J.K. Rowling explores themes beyond mere fantasy, as evidenced by the author's own admission about her lack of proficiency in math and physics. For instance, discrepancies exist regarding Hogwarts' enrollment numbers, which seems inconsistent from a mathematical standpoint. Fred and George Weasley, mischievous twin wizards born to Arthur and Molly Weasley, founded Weasleys' Wizard Wheezes, a joke shop that became successful thanks to Harry Potter's Triwizard earnings. The twins were known for their pranking skills at Hogwarts, participating in Dumbledore's Army and the Order of the Phoenix. Fred Weasley played as a Beater on the Gryffindor Quidditch team, while George Weasley excelled at both magic and pranksterism. Despite having good grades, they only managed six O.W.L.s combined. In 1996, the twins departed Hogwarts after rebelling against Dolores Umbridge and the Inquisitorial Squad. Following their departure, Fred and George opened Weasleys' Wizard Wheezes, creating an array of magical joke items. They were infamous for their mischief at school, often leaving behind a trail of chaos and trouble.
