

Instructions for Testing

Important Note:

OncoGate™ is a software that helps estimate your risk of having cancer based on your routine lab results and age. **It is not a cancer diagnosis test.**

- A “High Risk” result does not mean you have cancer
- A “Low Risk” result does not mean you are free from cancer or will not develop cancer in the future

OncoGate™ is designed to help identify people who may need further screening, not to make a diagnosis.

Who should take this test?

- OncoGate™ is suitable for adults aged 20 and above, especially those undergoing routine health check-ups or wishing to better understand their cancer risk.
- It can be used in primary care and health check-up settings to assess cancer risk as part of routine examinations, and in large-scale screening programs to identify higher-risk individuals and prioritize them for further multi-cancer early detection (MCED) testing.

Understanding your results:

- **High Risk:** Your estimated cancer risk is at or above the general population level (based on your routine laboratory results and age).
 - Consider follow-up testing, such as MCED tests (e.g., OncoSeek®)
 - Talk to your doctor about next steps**A high-risk result does not mean you have cancer.**
- **Low Risk:** Your estimated cancer risk is below the general population level.
 - This result does not exclude the possibility of existing or future cancer
 - Continue routine health check-ups and follow your doctor’s screening recommendations

Important reminders:

- **False positives are possible:** A “High Risk” result may occur even if no cancer is detected in follow-up testing. This may be due to:
 - The cancer is very small or hard to detect.
 - The software may overestimate your actual cancer risk.
- **Not a standalone test:** OncoGate™ should not be used alone to make medical decisions
- **Clinical confirmation is required:** Only a qualified physician can diagnose cancer
