



## Instructions for Testing

### Important Note:

OncoGraph™ is a blood test used to help monitor your cancer over time. **It is not a test to diagnose cancer, and it does not determine your treatment.**

- A “Positive” result does not always mean that your cancer has recurred or progressed
- A “Negative” result does not mean that cancer will never progress or relapse in the future

This test is used to support your doctor in monitoring your condition, and **should not replace medical diagnosis or clinical evaluation.**

### Who should take this test?

Patients who have been diagnosed with cancer and are currently receiving treatment or follow-up care.

OncoGraph™ helps measure cancer-related signals in your body and track how they change over time. It can support:

- Monitoring how well your treatment is working
- Detecting possible disease progression or recurrence

### Understanding your results:

- **Positive:** The test detected cancer-related signals in your blood. The result must be confirmed by your doctor following standard clinical procedures. Cancer monitoring and treatment decisions are the responsibility of your doctor.
- **Negative:** No cancer-related signals were detected in your blood. This does not guarantee that no cancer-related signals are present or that they will not be detected in the future.

### Important reminders:

- Blood sample collection, transportation, storage, and non-standard processing may impact the performance of OncoGraph™.
- Because the results of OncoGraph™ can change over time, repeat testing is recommended during cancer management as directed by your doctor.
