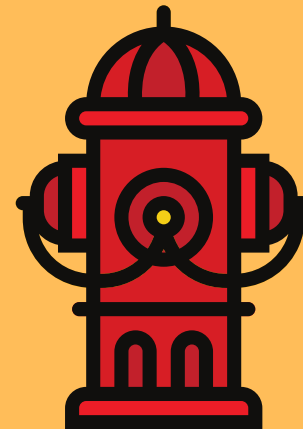

Vocabulary

# firefighter - Vocabulary



**emergency:** something serious that needs fast help from somebody. (noun)



The man was very sick, so it was an **emergency**.

# firefighter - Vocabulary



**equipment:** the things needed to do a job or activity. (noun)



The firefighters keep a lot of **equipment** on the fire truck.

# firefighter - Vocabulary



**alarm:** a device that warns of danger or tells you something. (noun)



The **alarm** sounded letting the people know there was a fire.



# firefighter - Vocabulary



**siren:** a very loud noise warning others about something. (noun)



The town **siren** sounded letting people know a big storm was coming.

# Let's do Grammar!



We use **much** with uncountable nouns in negative sentences and questions.

We **don't** have much sugar left.



How **much** sugar do we have left?



**Much** is never used in positive sentences (but we can use "very/too much")

# Fire at the school!

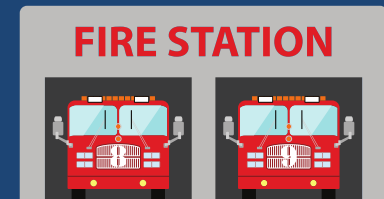
