The book effectively exposes the deplorable stories of the blatant and brutal abuse of Indian intelligence, security and investigative bodies of the ruling classes. The central theme of the entire book is the need for legislative oversight and verification for intelligence agencies in India. Dhar, a former joint director of India's Intelligence Bureau, gives a top-down view of the intelligence agency in India and the kinds of pressures he needs to face in carrying out his duties, including responsibilities related to the way these institutions are used for a personal and political agenda. As a historical memoir, this was as of 2015, the only information available to the intelligence bureau that was in the public domain. Dhar wrote this at a time when writing about the intelligence community was frowned upon to such an extent that it was an act of betrayal. The book remained the number one bestseller for months after its publication and sparked much national debate. Description In the book's prologue Dhar writes that he is going to tell several cases of illegal activities he took part in, by order, as part of his role. He says that any intelligence officer involved is like a prostitute acting in the goeling and Himmlers' breeding ground on the margins of constitutional democracy. Dhar writes how IB and R.I.P. are used by the political class; And, on weak prime minister and chief chief is eventually used by institutions. As an example, he cites how ISHD assets, such as ARC aircraft, are used by politicians and their families for personal use. Dhar explains how many of India's intelligence agencies do the dirty work, including victimizing innocent people. He says it's not just for India, but goes to the central theme of his book that in free democracies there are legislative checks. Dhar emphasizes the lack of accountability in general for the whole system - politicians, bureaucrats and intelligence. Dhar speaks of the war on turf between the CBI and THE IB to the point that the director of THE IB did not speak to the director of the CBI and he even avoided meeting with the special secretary and secretary of the Home Office. I had to keep the shabby line of dialogue open. The book tells the story of Atal Bihari Vajpayee - L K Advani brawls and division of labor in the demolition of Babri Masjid in 1992, as well as ambani-Nusli Wadia controversy. Dhar writes about how he was tasked with providing technical coverage of the Meeting of Sang Parivara, which will be attended by BJP leaders LK Adwani, Murlī Manohar Joshi and Vijaya Raje Scindia; Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh leaders Rajendra Singh, KS Sudarshan and VHP leaders Vinay Katiyar, Uma Bharti and others. Later, Dhar learned that all the recordings pointed to a choreographic attack by a Hindu woman and pralaya Nritiya (dance of destruction) by Babri Masjid. He writes of how Sang Parivar was sufficiently infiltrated by the IB. Dhar goes on to write about how IB helped Indira Gandhi win the election: I must admit that the entire IB field mechanism was mobilized to help the Indira Congress win minor but important municipal elections He criticizes the bureaucracy for the same type of subordination. An ISRO espionage case, which began in 1994, was also developed. Dhar also writes about various other cases that he considers a national disgrace, such as the likes of IB, RA'W and JCB have failed to even decipher the low-grade ciphers used by Pakistani rangers and police. In the book, Dhar talks about his hatred of Islam and Muslims, that his enmity was entirely personal: I would never forgive them for raping Manorama, my childhood companion in East Pakistan, and expelling us from our present homeland. But he continues to write about the preparation and leadership of IB, through which he develops a more subtle and complex worldview of Islam, to the extent that the incident of Babri Masjid was written as the Head of National Shame. The publication and launch of Open Secrets was published in 2005 by Manas Publications. During the book's launch, Dhar questioned the IB's lack of accountability and compared it to the CIA, MI5 and MI6. Dhar stated that if there is no legislative responsibility, could turn into a state worse than Uganda's Idi Amina, where intelligence services were used without checks. In the book he notes this by saying that there is no shortage of evidence to prove the same. The book was released by former Prime Minister Of Jammu and Kashmir, Farouk Abdullah. The reception book received huge media coverage and led to a debate over claims such as tapping IB phone conversations in the Prime Minister's office, overthrowing three state governments, bribing MLAs; corruption in high places, false arrests, black sheep in the media and falsification of referendums and elections. Indian historian and scholar-lawyer A.G. Noorani writes that Dhar's hypocrisy in the book is disgusting but that the book deserves to be read for revealing skulduggery. Noorani writes that a lot of revelations of the CIA, FBI and MI5 and MI6 have been published. None of them, however, was written as Dhar writes. None of the intelligence operators was as vainglorious as he was. The CIA Intelligence Officer's Book Regiment, compiled and reviewed by curator Hayden B. Peake, lists Open Secrets as one of a series of memoirs by retired senior Indian intelligence officers (who) provided top-down views on a scouting career in India.
