## BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI SINGKO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, one hundred (100) years ago, women across the United States celebrated their victory in the fight for their basic, fundamental right to participate in their government, and to pursue on equal footing, a better quality of life for themselves and their families; and

WHEREAS, for more than seven decades, women leaders from across the United States marched, lobbied, fought for the right to vote and they emerged victorious when the Nineteenth Amendment to the US Constitution was passed on June 4, 1919 and ratified on August 18, 2020 and declared that "the right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of sex"; and

WHEREAS, the 19<sup>th</sup> amendment granted women the right to vote and represented the pinnacle of the women's suffrage movement in the United States led by the National American Woman Suffrage Association (NAWSA); and

WHEREAS, with its passage, 27 million American women were granted access to the ballot thus marking the largest expansion of voting rights in the history of the United States;

WHEREAS, the decades-long fight for female enfranchisement was led with strong opposition from anti-suffrage activists but nevertheless they persisted; and

WHEREAS, Guam was not one of the original 36 United States jurisdictions to ratify the 19<sup>th</sup> amendment and women in Guam did not have voting rights after its passage because they were not US citizens at the time but women on Guam going back to ancient times continue to lead in all facets of society, including prominent CHamoru women Cynthia Johnston Torres, Lagrimas Leon Guerrero Untalan, Agueda Iglesias Johnston, Amanda Guzman Shelton, Concepcion Cruz Barrett and many others who were influential and significant figures to the advancement of women on Guam; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated almost 70 million women including those n Guam now have the right to universal suffrage because of the women and men who fought for the right to vote; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina'trentai Singko Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the ratification of the 19<sup>th</sup> amendment, granting women suffrage, and to celebrating the social, economic, cultural, and political achievements built by courageous women; and to further recognize and commend the CHamoru and Guamanian women whose contributions have paved the way toward progress and success for all; and be it further;
