## Eligibility Requirements for Expanded Eligibility for Working Families (EEWF) Subsidy Program

Serving children ages birth through 12

To be determined eligible for the EEWF Subsidy Program, the child's parent must meet at least one of the following requirements:

- Eligibility Access: Parent(s) income is greater than 133% of FPL (if school-age child) or 200% of FPL (if birth to 5-year-old child) but less than 300% of FPL (all ages) AND:
  - is employed an average of 30+ hours per week AND have current check stubs to document employment and income; OR
  - is in school 20 hours per week AND have a school schedule that documents this; OR
  - is working and in school a combination of at least 30 hours per week AND have current check stubs to document employment, income, and school schedule.
- Work Hour Access: Parent(s) working and/or in school at least an average of 22-29 hours per week and has income under 200% of FPL for all ages
- Benefits Cliff: Parent(s) is already enrolled in subsidy and reaches an income that exceeds 85% of State Median Income (SMI) and is up to 300% of FPL
