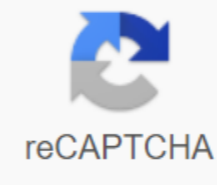

How to change your political party AffiliationYour political party affiliation is the party you choose to associate with. Depending on your state, you can be offered your party affiliation when you register to vote. You can change your party affiliation online, by mail or by phone, using methods to change voter registration. You do not need to join a political party or disclose your party preferences when registering to vote. Not every state accepts or lists party affiliation in the voter registration card. Party affiliation in voter registration does not restrict you from voting for this party alone. You can always vote for a candidate from any party in general elections, such as presidential, congressional or mayoral elections. Your party affiliation is usually only important in primary elections. Many states held closed primaries. This means that you can only vote for your party's candidates in the primaries. Learn about different types of primaries. If you have already registered to vote, you can check your registration to make sure it is accurate. They remove people who have moved or who haven't voted for a long time. And sometimes it's just a mistake. Have you recently moved in or changed your name? Depending on where you live, you will need to renew your registration or re-register. Ask your office. Sometimes just moving a few blocks can really change your polling place. And check your registration if you haven't voted in the last couple of elections or you haven't sent a postcard from your campaign office. They may consider you inactive and clear your name from the voter registration list. Don't wait until Election Day to discover that you can't vote. Check your registration right now.
