Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked I will depart. The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; may the name of the Lord be praised.







Job saw God as powerful and wise.

Though he slay me, yet will I hope in him; I will surely defend my ways to his face.






Job saw it to have hope in Jesus.

I know that my Redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand upon the earth.






Job saw God as sovereign.

For I dreaded destruction from God, and for fear of his splendor I could not do such things.




Job saw not to look lustfully at women.

I will not deny my integrity.






Job saw no need to be deceitful.

It hurls itself against him without mercy as he flees headlong from its power. It claps its hands in derision and hisses him out of his place.






Job saw the wonder of God.

And now my life ebbs away; days of suffering grip me.










Job saw to be humble before God.

Job saw a revelation from God.




Job 42:5
