Although we will try to run all classes, if sufficient entries are not received we reserve the right to cancel classes and return fees paid. Richmond upon Thames Performing Arts Festival will hold data solely for the purpose of running the Festival.

SPECIAL AWARDS

YOUNG SPEECH & DRAMA PERFORMER OF THE YEAR

We are pleased to award a bursary of £100 for the YOUNG PERFORMER and £50 for the RUNNER-UP. The winner will also receive the Festival Challenge Trophy. To be eligible for this competition performers must be:

- In Year Groups 9 14 (equivalent)
- Have entered pieces in both a poetry section and an acting section the eligible sections are:

POETRY - Own choice poetry OC8, OC9.

ACTING - Solo Acting SO4, SO5 or Classical Monologue CM3, CM4

ADJUDICATORS CHOICE

- Chosen by the adjudicator the winners must be available to perform at the Festival Showcase.
- Previous first-place winners of the award are not eligible.

The First prize will only be awarded if the performer reaches an Outstanding or Exceptional mark.

To be considered for this competition, please add the following information to the entry form: Young Performer Consideration, Date of Birth and School year, School or College

Additional Information

TIMETABLING: Notifications of time will be by email provided the email address is given correctly in the entry form and the whole timetable will be viewable on the website. This will be approximately three weeks before the date of the competition.

The Section Secretary will create a timetable of classes for the events and every effort will be made to comply with the applicant's requirements where they are reported well in advance of the festival.

Please note that requests for changes to the timetable which are made less than three weeks before the event will NOT be accepted under any circumstances.

TIME LIMITS: Time limits for each section are given and must be observed. The Time limit includes the whole performance. Performances may be stopped by the adjudicator if Time limits are exceeded. A performance exceeding the Time limit will be marked and adjudicated, but will not be eligible for a first prize or trophy. Performances may be stopped if they grossly exceed the Time limit. Competitors must arrive 15 minutes before the start time of their Section.

NOTIFICATIONS: Notifications will be by email only. Performers will be given approximately 2 weeks' notice of the date of their competition.

POETRY: All poems, monologues, duologues and solo acting pieces are to be memorised unless otherwise stated. Poetry should be recited without gestures or movement.

COSTUME: Costume is not allowed. Simple suggestions such as a long practice skirt or leggings are only permissible. Vital hand props are allowed. In mime classes, no props or costumes are allowed. Music is optional.

SCRIPTS: A copy of all pieces chosen must be available for the adjudicator. These must be labelled with the following information: Name of performer, Title, Author, Source/Publisher

CLASSES: Depending on the number of entries it may be necessary to combine or divide classes.
