School counselors at AACPS address the prevention, intervention and development of student needs through a comprehensive school counseling program. To make sure that students know: they have the dignity and value they have the right to participate in a comprehensive school counseling program for their ethnic, cultural, racial, sexual differences and special needs will be addressed in their school counseling experience as school counselors will address the academic, career and socio-emotional development of all students in order to ensure that all students are trained with school counselors available in all APSAC, elementary, high school and high schools. The AACPS School Counseling Program is fully compliant with the Maryland Department of Education (MSDE) Guidelines and the ASCA National Framework program published by the American Association of School Counselors. Services vary depending on the level. Primary school counselors conduct class on a variety of development-appropriate topics, including, but not limited to, personal security, goal-setting, social interaction, academic success, problem-solving and communication skills. They also work in small groups and individually with students on identified topics as needed. Initial consultants are partners and consultants with school staff and parents to help with behaviour management and developmental issues. Secondary school counselors are assisting in the transition of new students, including advising parents and students on course selection and early adolescent issues. Based on their program firmly in social emotional learning skills, they provide classroom lessons and small group activities on topics such as conflict resolution and school success skills related to the average school age of young people. They meet individually with students who need additional support with interpersonal issues. Secondary school counselors identify, monitor, and assist students who are at risk of failing a subject, including organization, learning skills, and goal-setting classes. As students prepare for to high school, the focus is on college and career research that puts foundations for post-secondary school planning. To find out more high school counselors, click here. Secondary school counselors advise students on course selection, helping them make the right choices that suit their future plans. They provide information on options available to students, including career and technology education, magnetic programs, and dual enrollment opportunities at Ann Arundel Community College (AACCC). They are an integral part of the post-secondary process, helping with the registration of college entrance exams (PSAT, SAT, ACT), access to financial aid and scholarship opportunities. As at other levels, they can provide counselling to students who may experience social and emotional difficulties or difficulties in the post-secondary school process. High school counselors support students and their parents/guardians as they move through the application process to college.
