Now there are at least some studies to support my hunch. Maybe. Pop music becomes repetitive, according to a thorough analysis by Colin Morris published in Pudding. Morris studied Billboard Hot 100 hits dating back six decades, from 1958 to 2017. And while he may be a self-described unemployed programmer and deep learning enthusiast, Morris says he knows the repetitive tune when he hears one. Advertising Morris used compression analysis to assess how much lyrical the echoes of some of our most beloved pop stars attend. For those of us who spend more time listening to music than sitting behind a computer, this means that he used an algorithm to review the lyrics and calculate how much they could be hacked down by removing repetitive conditions. Morris analyzed repetition not only of individual words, but also of repetitive lyrical sequences. Using a three-year rolling average, he found that the repeat of song writing is definitely on the rise, and recently reached its peak in 2014, with the average tune since this year compressing 22 percent more effectively than the one in the 1960s. Poke around at Morris' conclusions and you can search for your visualized data on the artist, decade and genre. Who are the re-culprits? Pop artists like Beyonce, Michael Jackson, Madonna and One Direction ranked high, although Rihanna reigned supreme thanks to all her hard work, work, work, work. Artists like Ray Charles, Connie Francis, Elvis Presley and Frank Sinatra ranked low in repeats. While Morris considered Daft Punk's 1997 hit Around the World the most repetitive pop song of the past 60 or so years - notching (un?) an impressive 99 percent compression rate - he also found that four of the top 10 most monotonous jams came in our current decade.
