# Drogheda, Co. Louth, Ireland.

**Drogheda** (*pronounced: Dro-ha-da*) is a thriving town with a population of over 67,000 including the immediate environs. Drogheda's close proximity to Dublin and Dundalk increases its population within a 60km (1 hour commute) catchment area to over 1,700,000. Positioned on the east coast of Ireland, adjacent to Dublin Airport and Dublin Port, Drogheda is just off the M1 Motorway, the economic corridor between Dublin and Belfast.

Nestled on the banks of the historic River Boyne, Drogheda and the Boyne Valley region are steeped in history. The oldest known room in the world, the Neolithic Passage Graves at Newgrange, are just 5 miles from the town centre. Over 5,000 years old, this UNESCO World Heritage site is older than the Pyramids of Egypt or Stonehenge. Each year this world class site attracts hundreds of thousands of international visitors. This is just one of our amazing heritage sites.

While Drogheda is rich in history we are very young at heart. Modern Drogheda has undergone significant growth in the last 10 years and is emerging as a heritage town with a sensitive contemporary twist. The town has a relaxed easy feel. Life in Drogheda includes great shopping, super schools, fabulous dining out and leisure activities, stunning sandy beaches and so much more.

Excellent access to Dublin and Belfast Airports (53km and 121km respectively), a well-structured motorway route network and highly efficient train and bus service always ensure that getting to and from Drogheda is easy, quick and enjoyable.


The access network is completed by Drogheda Port and Dublin Port. The strategic location of these ports is hugely beneficial to local industry.

# Location: Ireland



The combination of infrastructural assets, developments in transport, improved connectivity and the young highly educated population underpin the opportunities for business in the Drogheda area.





On the East Coast of Ireland, Drogheda is located just 50km from the Irish capital city Dublin. Drogheda is strategically placed on the main M1 motorway linking Belfast with Dublin on the North-South trade corridor. Drogheda has enviable transport links that connect it to Dublin, the North East, Northern Ireland and Europe by road, rail, air and sea. One third of Ireland's population live within a 50 minute drive of Drogheda.

Dublin Airport and Dublin Port via Dublin Port Tunnel are less than a 30 minute drive providing ease of access to international markets. Belfast International Airport is just 70 minutes drive north of Drogheda. The M1 and the upgrading of the Newry-Dundalk dual carriageway have increased road access from North and South. Drogheda railway station has links to all of the major regional destinations including high-speed intercity rail connections to Dundalk, Newry, Belfast and Dublin.

The development of a new port access road at Drogheda Port and the construction of a new deep-water port at Bremore between Drogheda and Balbriggan will further enhance the reasons why national and global enterprises will want to locate in Drogheda.




# Population

Drogheda is one of the largest towns in Ireland with a population of approximately 67,000 including environs. This number has grown steadily since 1996. Drogheda's close proximity to Dublin and Dundalk increases its population within a 60km (1 hour commute) catchment area to over 1,700,000.

Over 40% of the Drogheda area population are between the ages of 20-44 (a higher percentage than the national average) providing Drogheda and the surrounding area with a comparatively higher economically active population.

Drogheda and its environs are home to approximately 10,000 people commuting to Dublin each day. These people are highly skilled and experienced and most have higher education qualifications, including financial services, engineering, software development, business and legal studies, and management. These experienced, talented and skilled people are a valuable resource for any company seeking to set up a base in Drogheda.

# Education

Ireland's education system is ranked in the top ten of IMD World Competitiveness Yearbook, 2011. In addition to this quality the proportion of Drogheda area residents with at least a university bachelor degree or equivalent in 2006 was higher than the national average. Located in the Dublin catchment Drogheda provides easy access to 5 major Universities and 5 Institutes of Technology, each teaching to Masters Degree or PhD level. Collectively these centres of education have a student population of over 50,000.

Access to these Universities and Institutes of Technologies enable Drogheda based businesses to continue to benefit from a workforce that can up-skill constantly.

The closest Universities and Institutes of Technology are:

- Dundalk Institute of Technology
- Dublin City University
- Trinity College Dublin
- Dublin Institute of Technology

In addition to the many Universities in the area there are also a number of private colleges and further education colleges:

- Drogheda Institute of Further Education
- Edgewater College: a world centre for teaching of Aviation English.

# Research and Development


While these Institutes and Universities provide a skilled labour force they can also provide research and development for industry specific areas. The main areas of research conducted at Dundalk Institute of Technology are:

- Creative Media Research Group

- Regulated Software Research Group

# Research & University Collaboration

Companies located in Drogheda benefit from Innovation Support and Technology Transfer with the regions Universities and Colleges. Examples include:

- BD (Becton, Dickinson and Company) partners with Dublin City University on Biomedical Research from their Drogheda Operation.
- Drogheda's IFS (State Street) collaborate on Financial and Accounting Education Partnerships with 2 of the region's 3rd level institutes.



## Tax Rates & Incentives

The key features of Ireland's tax regime that make it one of the most attractive global investment locations include:

- A 12.5% corporate tax rate for active business. Ireland's corporate tax rate of 12.5% applies to all corporate trading profits % Corporation Tax. This compares favourably to corporate tax rates in other jurisdictions from a low of 17% in Singapore to over 40% in Japan.
- A 25% Research & Development (R&D) tax credit which may be refundable over a three year period.
  - 5% of the R&D expenditure can be outsourced to European Universities (includes Irish Universities); and in addition
  - 10% of the R&D expenditure can be sub-contracted to other unconnected parties (i.e. 15% in total).
- An intellectual property (IP) regime which provides a tax write-off for broadly defined IP acquisitions.
- An attractive holding company regime, including:
  - participation exemption from capital gains tax on disposals of shares in subsidiaries,
  - an effective zero tax rate for foreign dividends (12.5% tax rate on qualifying foreign dividends, with flexible onshore pooling of foreign tax credits),
  - an EU-approved stable tax regime, with access to extensive treaty network and EU Directives,
  - generous domestic law withholding tax exemptions.

## Employment Law

As with all countries the rights of employers and employees are enshrined in law in a series of pieces of legislation. Many of these are consistent across the European Union.

## Infrastructure

Drogheda can boast comfortably that it is the prime location for investment in Ireland because of its superb infrastructural resources:

### Access & Transport

- 20 minutes from Ireland's main international airport.
- Drogheda is on the M1 Motorway which connects Dublin to Belfast.
- Drogheda Port provides shipping access to Europe and the UK and is situated on the main Dublin to Belfast economic corridor. Investment of €210 million in the expansion of facilities will create a sea bridge to Mediterranean Europe.
- Drogheda Deep Water Port offers strategically important links to Europe's largest ports in Scandinavia and Rotterdam.
- Drogheda Train Station handles over 80 train stops daily providing connectivity to both Dublin and Belfast.
- There are numerous public and private bus services operating from Drogheda to all locations nationally and locally.

### Communications

- The main Enterprise Parks in Drogheda offer ultra fast internet access via municipal fibre networks (Metropolitan Area Networks, known as MAN's).
- The most modern fibre communications provide fast direct connection to North America via "Project Kelvin."

## Energy, Waste & Water

- Ireland's first commercial off-shore wind farm is being developed off the Drogheda coast.
- Drogheda offers state of the art water treatment and waste to energy facilities.
- The region has capacity to expand shared services and manufacturing capability owing to spare capacity on the electrical network and excellent connectivity to the ESB Power Network (that are responsible for managing the electricity network).

### GREEN DATA CENTRE PARK

Perhaps one of the most exciting innovations in Drogheda is the planned Green Data Centre Park. "Project Kelvin" is the fastest piece of fibre on the planet. The Green Data Centre would hinge on the MANs and "Project Kelvin" and will deliver a location that is solely focused on the greenest most advanced data centres in the country.

Drogheda has all the components needed to make this vision a reality: networks, backhaul providers, favourable tax regime, power infrastructure, green energy generators, ideal climate, highly skilled workforce, proximity to the airport, linkages with 2 leading universities for research and development and dedicated business centre spaces.

## Coca-Cola

Coca-Cola one of the worlds best known brands and have had a presence in Drogheda since 1975. Coca-Cola Global Business Shared Services are based at the Southgate Centre, Drogheda.



In 2011 Coca-Cola announced an expansion of its Global Business Shared Services organisation in Drogheda. This included investment in new offices and the creation of up to 100 new positions. These offices in Drogheda, which currently employ more than 200 people were officially opened in late October 2011.

"Our continued investments in Drogheda and throughout Ireland will ensure we sustain and enhance our growth globally in the coming years," said Muhtar Kent, Chairman and CEO of The Coca-Cola Company. "The Coca-Cola brand has been in Ireland for more than half a century and our long history here gives us continued confidence in the strength of the Irish workforce, the commitment of the Irish government and the know-how of Irish people to support our business."

## Boyne Valley



Boyne Valley was established in Drogheda over 50 years ago and today employs 300 people and supports the jobs of distributors and many suppliers. The Boyne Valley Group encompasses companies spanning 33 categories of Food, Personal Care and Home Care products. Their brand portfolio has made them market leaders in 16 categories in which they operate with much loved local brands including Killeen, Don Carlos, Giovanni di Firenze and Boyne Valley Honey.

The Boyne Valley Central Warehouse and Distribution Centre, based on the Platin Road in Drogheda, just a short distance from the M1 motorway, benefits from one of the most strategic distribution locations in Ireland.

The Boyne Valley Distribution Centre consists of a purpose built Warehousing complex on a fully serviced 12 acre freehold site. With 75,000 square feet of computer controlled storage facilities and 4 temperature zones, -23, +3, +10 and ambient, the warehouse can accommodate 10,000 pallets in single and double racking.

Boyne Valley can provide next day delivery to almost 3,000 retail grocery outlets across the entire 32 counties of Ireland. They use an advanced warehouse management system and other IT tools including radio frequency devices to improve handling efficiency, allow accurate product visibility and reduce costs.

## BD



BD is a medical technology company that serves healthcare institutions, life science researchers, clinical laboratories, industry and the general public.

BD began operations in Drogheda in 1964 and is the longest established medical technology multinational company supported by the Industrial Development Agency (IDA, see page 12 for more information).

By 1968, the Drogheda plant had expanded to more than double its size. Sales in the UK and continental Europe were growing rapidly, and a second BD plant in Dun Laoghaire opened in 1969. Today, BD in Ireland employs more than 450 associates at the Drogheda and Dun Laoghaire plants. During the last 10 years, BD has invested a total of €115 million in its Drogheda and Dun Laoghaire plants, creating state-of-the-art global manufacturing centres.

## IFS



### International Fund Services, A State Street Company

International Fund Services (IFS) is a division of State Street Alternative Investment Solutions which provides a complete suite of fund accounting, fund administration and risk services to hedge funds and private equity funds. Since 1990, IFS have made substantial investments and have maintained a leadership position in financial services technology. Today, IFS has one location in Canada – Toronto; four locations in Ireland – Carrickmines, Drogheda, Dublin and Naas; and three locations in the United States – Boston, Princeton and New York. IFS delivers custom business solutions to asset management groups with trading operations throughout the world. IFS opened its Drogheda offices in 2005 and employs over 200 people.

## Nature's Best



Nature's Best is Ireland's leading producer of chilled vegetable based Convenience Foods. They sell under their own Nature's Best brand and under major store brands in Ireland and the UK. Nature's Best make products like bagged and bowl leafy salads, prepared salads, prepared vegetables, stir fries, and an innovative range of "on the move" products like Meal Pots and Salad Shakers. Today Nature's Best employs around 240 people and operates from a state of the art custom built factory in Drogheda.

## Oriel Windfarm



Oriel Windfarm Limited is an Irish owned and operated sustainable energy company established in 2005 to develop offshore wind farms in Ireland. The company's first project is the development of a wind farm in the North Irish Sea.

The Oriel Windfarm, off the County Louth coast, will be the first fully operational commercial wind farm developed in Irish waters. With 55 turbines, delivering a total of 330 MW of clean renewable energy the facility will supply energy to more than 250,000 homes. This will be the ninth largest power plant in Ireland.

Oriel Windfarm will contribute to Ireland meeting it's climate change targets in 2020. In the longer term Oriel Windfarm will have the opportunity to be a significant exporter of both energy and the supply chain components which will build green energy power plants.

## Armac



Armac Systems' inventory optimisation solution was developed in collaboration with Irish Academic Institutions including DKIT and is supported by Enterprise Ireland. Their engineers and consultants have over 50 years experience in inventory optimisation and operations research and have spoken internationally at a number of seminars on related topics.

Armac support ongoing research and development into operations research through partnerships such as Cork Constraint Computation Centre.

SR Technics, CSA, Bombardier, Thomas Cook, Aeroplex and Stork Fokker Services are among the leading aviation organisations using Armac's solution to optimally provision their spares, rotatable and consumable inventory. The tool has helped aerospace clients to significantly release cash tied up in inventory while simultaneously improving Service Levels and aircraft dispatch reliability.

## Science & Technology Parks

### Drogheda IDA Park

IDA Ireland recently completed a 25 hectare (63 acre) Business & Technology Park with direct access onto the M1 motorway developed and landscaped for the needs of the IT, Financial and International Services Sectors. The park has been designed to include advanced office facilities and advanced technology buildings of high standard to suit both manufacturing and internationally traded services sectors. There are ample greenfield areas available for future development.

### Newtown Science and Technology Park

With over 9.2 acres, this recently launched park has excellent access to the town centre and has been master-planned as Drogheda's for the needs of modern knowledge-based, technology and service business. This facility is planning permission approved for suitable tenants. It will also be the site of the new Drogheda Enterprise Centre.

### Boyne Bridge Business Park

Boyne Bridge Business Park is zoned and ready for development as a multi-faceted business park. Just off the M1 motorway Boyne Bridge Business Park can provide up to 74,000 sq.m. (800,000 sq.ft.) of business space over 16 Hectares (40 acres). It has the potential to cater for a range of enterprises from small start up operations to large logistical firms and office based organisations.

## Retail Parks

**Drogheda Retail Park:** A warehouse scheme comprising approximately 15,000 sq.m including 5,165 sq.m. Homebase DIY store and Garden Centre.

**Southgate Shopping Centre:** Located on the Southern edge of Drogheda with high profile frontage to the N1 Dublin to Drogheda Road, Southgates mix of retail, leisure, cafes, and restaurants coupled with excellent office space make it an attractive location.

**The M1 Retail Park** is located just off the M1 motorway, which is the main Dublin to Belfast road on the outskirts of Drogheda. It is 20 minutes from Dublin International Airport and the Dublin commuter Belt. The Retail Park is anchored by Woodies DIY with other tenants including Smyths Toys, Heatons, Cost Plus Sofas and Mothercare. The Pavilions offers retailers such as Costa Coffee, The Carphone Warehouse and Sizzles Diner. Mellview House is occupied by Energy Fitness and Subway.



## Private Office Parks & Enterprise Centres

### **Millmount Incubation Centre**

The Millmount Incubation Centre was established in 2005 by the RDC (Regional Development Centre). It offers support as well as office facilities to start up companies. Millmount Development Centre is a joint initiative of DkIT, Enterprise Ireland, Louth County Enterprise Board, Drogheda Borough Council & Louth County Council.

### **Drogheda Enterprise Centre**

Drogheda Enterprise Centre will be based in the Newtown Science and Technology Park development. It will provide a focal point for supports and programmes as well as for investment in the Drogheda area. The Centre will focus on supports to knowledge-based companies in the following sectors:




Drogheda is not only a historical town, it is also a modern and exciting destination. The retail scene offers unrivaled choice for shoppers.
