






JESSICA Daughter

8 years old, but with the sage wisdom of a philosopher. Jessica's cheeky, positive nature inspires all around her to approach life with an optimism like no other.

CRAIG

Father

32 years old, peaking in his familial and professional life, Jessica's diagnosis does indeed send him reeling. However, guided by Jess's ever present tenacity, Craig takes inspiration and tackles challenges with that at heart.

LISA Mother

Lithe and equally fit as her husband, Lisa, 28, is the backbone of the Goozees. assuring every family operation runs smoothly. The only chink in her armour, her inability to maintain a poker face when the going gets tough.

Brother

Jessica's 6 year old accomplice, being subject to his big sister's whims can often get Tim in a wee bit of trouble, but nothing his serious cuteness can't combat. While Tim dotes on his older sister, he probably struggles the most with the change in family routine.

Sister

Brassy and bold youngest child, 4 year old Kylie is hell bent on keeping up with all of her older siblings machinations - it's just a shame stopping for nap time can sometimes get in the way. Like her older sister, Kylie has a unique independent outlook, which keeps Lisa on her toes.





THE COPS

Kim Nikolaides

Late 30s, with a curious arrogance bred of career success, Kim acts as big sister to Craig. However it's that confidence that can somehow serve to her detriment as she can be inclined to over look certain details at times. Regardless, their work marriage is a well oiled machine and often a determinedly fun one.

Police Commissioner Peter Ryan

Headhunted from the UK, where he was Head of National Police Training, Ryan is at once a model cop and citizen and loving husband.

Bob "Squeaky" Irwin

Clean cut and respectable in appearance, Bob Irwin is anything but - rather he's corrupt to the core and a leader at the helm of a surprising ring of impressionables working on both sides of the law.

"Snidley"

Bob Irwin's sidekick and foil.

THE CRIMS

Graham James Kay

The North Shore Rapist, 45 years old, deadpan expression belies the sadistic nature hidden only just beneath the surface.

Bill Tracey

Known to Police, 50s with a solid build with a beer gut, Tracey is well connected with a network spanning NSW and Victoria.

Gary Francisco

Solid and striking at over six feet, Francisco, the Melbourne contingent, a bikie with a handlebar moustache

Les Kallache

Middle Eastern background, 52 and a fitness fanatic who works out every morning at Giles Gym, Kallache is an absolute character, with a "way" with the ladies.

Keith Booney

Neddy Smith described Booney as "the hardest man I've ever met", Booney is known for taking a beating, then getting back up, smiling, ready for more.

Richard "Harry" Harris

A huge man at 6'4", Harry was the strength and conditioning coach for the Sydney Rabbitohs, and career criminal, with a wife and small child.

Glen Flack

Like Teflon, the guy had spent years associated with so many crimes, and yet evaded the law every time, even after half a million in cash was found in his Mum's apartment.



AUDIENCE ***

While a family drama places "Conviction" in two key demographics, that of teens and forty plus, the low impact drug references and police procedure, will likely place it in a MA15+ category.

Women 45-65 a key target, as householders and decision makers, proactive in bringing families together.

If gauged by the Roy Morgan system of market segmentation, audiences would likely fall under Conventional Family Life and Traditional Family Life segments.

Episode 1

Police Commissioner Ryan addresses the task force on the latest events linked to the North Shore rapist. Craig's surveillance sees him and the team move in on their suspect, Graham Kay, home life gets tense when Lisa exposes her concern over a lump she has discovered in their eldest daughter, Jessica's arm.

Craig and the team celebrate capturing Kay, but revelry turns to profound dismay when Lisa relays the news that Jessica has been diagnosed with a rare form of cancer, and must commence an aggressive treatment regime, immediately.

Episode 2

Police Commissioner Ryan introduces the team to - Bill Tracey and Gary Francisco and sets them to task intercepting precursor drugs on travails from Melbourne to Sydney.

From stake outs outside suspicious drug depositories back to the treatment room, Lisa and Craig develop a tag team and short hand for operating family, work and life.

Craig takes note of how little the facilities have to offer, and decides to do something about it.

Craig nudges Lisa early one morning to casually mention he'll be undertaking a 1000km marathon. Her failure to object is all the green light Craig needs.

Episode 3

A halfway meet up with the Victorian police to hand over the discreet surveillance convoy spying on Bill Tracey's drug swap at the Albury/Wodonga border.

The convoy leads Craig and the team to a bush cook house and a dynamic arrest.

With Jess nauseated from the chemo and the two youngest equally in need of her attention, Lisa loses her cool with Craig, about the ensuing marathon and it's potential impact.

Worse for wear from tension at home, Craig arrives for yet another briefing. This time on what was to be the biggest operative of Craig's career - Operation Gymea.

Episode 4

Jessica's oncologist, Dr Cohn speaks to Craig, Lisa and Jessica. She has passed her first round of treatment to great success.

Craig spends days watching, listening, following Les Kallache and his cohorts such as, hard as a rock, Keith Booney,

Craig training and surveilling, Lisa back to slamming out a ten kilometre daily run, and three kids at school, all seemingly in the realm of normal, carefree existence.

Normality is broken as Lisa takes hold of Jess, only to feel something suspicious under the skin once more.

During a regular day eyeballing Kallache and a new voice penetrates the air waves. One of unusual authority. Thus far only known as "Squeaky", Craig advises this is someone to take note of.

Craig and Lisa back before Dr Cohn regarding Lisa's recent discovery. Lisa's face says it all. The news is not good.

Episode 5

Craig and Lisa watch Jessica being wheeled away into surgery.

No sooner does Jessica regain consciousness and notices the bandages around her shoulder where her arm had once been, she implores to go to her best mates party that weekend.

When a bust threatens Kalache directly due to his prints, this necessitates a call to old mate "Squeaky" to arrange a clandestine clean up. Boom! Craig and cohort have veered on to the very path that will take them all the way to the prize.

Craig signs off on a two week hiatus from Operation Gymea.

Craig, before a crowd in the hundreds, makes his way toward the surf to begin his 1000k marathon.

Episode 6

Craig paddles closer and closer to his final destination. A hard yet peaceful final slog before Craig is greeted by a crowd in the thousands. The marathon is complete.

Craig rejoins the team as Kallache has finally given up his man and Gymea now have a trace and gameplan for Sergeant Bob "Squeaky" Irwin. In a series of clamp downs and busts, Craig and his team bowl down crims like ten pins before finally taking down their man, the entire operative sending away more than fifty crooks and corrupt cops.

Parliament house, where Craig is about to receive Parent of the Year award for his effort raising money for Cancer research.

Lisa confesses the insidious disease is back. A winded Craig has to swallow the notion he can paddle to raise money for cancer, but he can't cure it, as he is called to the podium to address the award for his efforts.
