AMCAS is the American College of Medicine Application Service, a centralized service application used by pre-students when applying to medical school. This allows you to create one application, which is then sent to all the allopathic medical schools to which you are applying. How it works Is a Complete AmCAS application and submit online. As soon as you submit an AMCAS application and release the transcript, your application will begin to be processed. (Note: Both your application and transcript must be obtained to begin processing the application. Review your coursework (AMCAS grades, semester hours, course classifications, AMCAS GPA verified). If you find anything in your application that you disagree with, you must request academic changes within 10 days of the processing date of your AMCAS application. Your application package (AMCAS application and AMCAS GPA transcript) will be sent to all schools you assign on the AMCAS website. Your letters of recommendation will also be sent out as they are received. Medical schools will send you secondary applications. Complete quickly and file secondary applications. Respond quickly to invitations to medical school interviews. Once you make a decision, immediately notify AMCAS and other medical schools where you have interviewed that you will be matriculating at a particular school. The peak time of application is from June to September, so keep in mind that processing applications received during this period may take longer. Enter your IDENTIFICATION numbers from the transcript. Enter your date of birth. Enter your gender. Section 2: High School Schools: Enter High School. (See the AMCAS instruction manual, if you received a GED, were at home, or attended high school in a country outside the U.S.) Colleges: List every institution you attended after high school, even if you only took 1st grade there. Enter all schools, even if your loans have been transferred, no credits have been earned, or you have left the classroom/school. Transcript: You need a copy of your official transcript from every U.S. territorial, U.S., or Canadian institution after school where you tried a course job, regardless of whether you earned the loan. You have 5,300 characters (includes spaces) or about one page. You'll get an error message if you go beyond 5300 characters. If you need help with your personal application, please contact these resources: If you are applying for an M.D.-Ph.D., you should complete two additional essays: M.D.-Ph.D. Essay and Significant Research Experience Essay.AMCAS strongly encourages you to enter the essay directly into the AMCAS app, rather than cutting and sticking essays from other software. If you still want to compose an essay in a text processing program, you should use a simple text program such as Microsoft Notepad, and then essay on the AMCAS website. If your text is formatted in any way, it can make your essay unreadable and remember that you cannot edit an essay once your application has been submitted. Remember: Proofread your essay very very There is no spelling in the AMCAS application and you will not be allowed to make any changes to this section after you apply. Section 9: Test Results (MCAT, etc.) MCAT Results: Include only the MCAT exams you took at the time of the amCAS application. Don't include the exams you've cancelled. Remember that you should only include the points you released in AAMC. Most medical schools require that your MCAT scores no more than 3 years. If you have any questions about whether your scores are still valid, contact individual schools to make sure your scores are valid. (MCAT scores from 2003 and will later be automatically released to AMCAS unless you void your points during the exam, you can't release your points once you've released them in AAMC and they will appear on any subsequent AMCAS app, so be careful!) Submitting an application: Before submitting, be sure to adjust and edit! You can use Print Application and print a copy of the app. Once sent, you can only make changes to the following information: Mandatory and alternative IDsName (Full Legal Name, Preferred Name, and Alternative Names)Contact Information (Permanent and Preferred Mailings)Alternative Contact InformationDate Birth and GenderLetters Scores (up to 10 letters). You can also notify AMCAS that the letter is no longer sent. The next MCAT test date can add medical schools and change the existing type of program (terms and limits apply)Release the application information to your pre-health counselor In order to apply, you are required to certify multiple statements confirming that the information you are delivering is accurate as far as you know. AMCAS Application Fees When you apply, you must pay a \$160 processing fee that includes only 1 medical school designation. Additional medical school designation is \$34 per school. You can pay online with a credit card (Visa or MasterCard) or check. AMCAS does not accept payments made not (includes personal checks, cash orders) and does not accept credit card information sent by mail, fax, email or phone. After the Post what's next? Once you have certified and submitted an application, and AMCAS has received your transcripts, your application will enter the processing queue. During this period, your application will be verified by AMCAS staff; This includes ensuring that your courses and assessments are properly entered into the system. Once your application is verified, AMCAS will send the verified application back to you. You then need to check all the application for errors that may have occurred during the verification process. Once the application has been reviewed, it must be re-certified and re-submitted. You have to do this every time you make a change after the initial presentation. If you don't re-subordinate the app, your changes won't be saved. Application Processing Time Monitoring: Application processing can take up to 6 weeks during a tense season, according to the AMCAS website. Keep in mind that your application cannot begin the verification process until all the materials (including all official transcripts) have been received. Checking the status of your application: Per AMCAS, you are responsible for regularly verifying the status of your application throughout the application process. Removing the AMCAS app to review the AMCAS app, you need to go online and choose to remove the application from the right side of the main menu. You can only withdraw your application when it is in the following status: Submitted by AMCAS-Ready to reviewSubmitted to AMCAS-Waiting transcripts Returned You can't withdraw your application if it is in the following status: Submitted by AMCAS-Under ReviewAMCAS Processing Complete.The initial \$160 application fee is not refunded, but you will get your payment back for each school, which is not due if you withdraw the application. Please note that as soon as you withdraw your application, you can no longer apply for the current year of application. Think carefully before you do so. If you are withdrawing at this time, you are not eligible for an AMCAS refund in this case. 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
