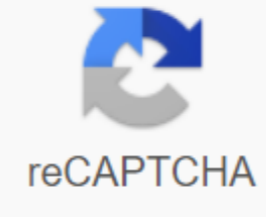




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## Oxford political science dictionary pdf

The Oxford English Dictionary, now 20 volume, a 750-pound monster, has been the author's word for English for 126 years. OED3, the first new edition since 1989, may also be the first to opt out of printing entirely, ap reports. The internet is on a physical media-killing rampage. First BlockBuster, now venerable OED? Nigel Portwood, executive director of Oxford University Press (isn't that the perfect name for it?), says that online revenue was so high that it is very unlikely that the third edition of OED will be physically printed.
