A powerful Sith Lord of the Sith and the first known disciple of Darth Sidious, he first appeared in Star Wars: Episode I - The Phantom Menace (1999), portrayed by Ray Park and voiced by Peter Serafinowicz. Although seemingly killed at the hands of Obi-Wan Kenobi at the end of the film, the 2008 Star Wars: The Clone Wars animated series reveals that Mole actually survived his injuries, and he made further appearances in the 2014 series of Star Wars Rebels and the 2018 film Solo: A Star Wars Story, all voiced by Sam Whitver, with Park physically reprising the role in the latest film. Clone Wars show that Mole was once a member of the group of warriors of the Datomir, and was kidnapped as a child by Sidious. After being defeated at the hands of Kenobi, Mole is driven to madness and becomes a cyborg, but he was rescued by his brother Savage Opress twelve years later, during the Clone Wars. After being granted new robotic legs by Nightsisters, led by Mole's mother, Talzin, he seeks revenge on Kenobi. In the process, he recruits several crime syndicates to his cause, forming a shadow team. He takes on Mandalor, only to be defeated and captured by Sidious. The Mole later avoids and manages to restore his criminal empire; Towards the end of the war, he engineered the conflict on Mandalore to lure and kill Anakin Skywalker. Asoka Tano is sent to deal with him instead, and he is captured, only to be released by Tano when Sidious performs 66, bringing in clone troopers to their Jedi generals. In the era of the Galactic Empire, Mole, abandoned by his Sith persona, leads the crime syndicate Crimson Dawn until years in the Sith world of Malahor. He escapes after meeting With Jedi Padawan Ezra Bridger, whom he tries to turn on the dark side, and then forces him to help find Kenobi. After tracking him down to Tatooine, he confronts Kenobi and fights him for the last time. The Mole is mortally wounded and dies in Kenobi's arms, realizing that the latter is looking after the boy he considers the Chosen One. Since the release of The Phantom Menace, Mole has become a widely recognized character in popular culture, largely because of his intimidating appearance and double lightsaber. His popularity in Star Wars fandom earned him cult status. Aside from movies and television series, he has appeared in various canonical and non-canon Star Wars media over the years, such as books, comics and video games. Characteristics concept and creation After getting frustrated by a drawing produced by designer Gavin Bocke, Ian McCaig started covering it in the tape. Both he and Lucas liked the result, described as a kind of Rorschach pattern. The final drawing was McCaig's own face, with the skin removed, and some Rorschach experiments (drop the ink on paper, folding it in half, then opening). Tattoos on the face of the Mole were inspired by the indigenous peoples of Brazil. Mole is described as a thing of nightmares when his artistic design is finished. Darth Maul's head originally had feathers based on prayer totems, but the Creature Effects team led by Nick Duddman interpreted these feathers as horns, changing its features into those common in popular devil images. His clothes were also changed, from a tight body suit with a muscular pattern to a syth gown based on samurai folds, because lightsaber fights were associated with big jumps, spinning, running and skating. Another concept had a mola masked figure that could rival Darth Vader, while the senator's characters were painted and tattooed faces. It was later decided to apply painted and tattooed faces to the Mole, not to the senator. The portrait of Darth Maul was physically depicted by actor and martial arts master Ray Park in The Phantom Menace. The character was voiced by comedian/voice actor/director Peter Serafinowicz in The Phantom Menace and Lego in the film adaptation of the prequel trilogy, while Sam Whitver performed the voice of the character in the animated series The Clone Wars, The Rebels and in the live action movie Solo: A Star Wars Story. Actors Gregg Berger, Jess Harnell, Stephen Stanton, Clint Bajakian, and David W. Collins have all voiced it in Legends adaptations and minor performances. Appearance Films The Phantom Menace Ray Park as Darth Maul in The Phantom Menace In his first appearance, Star Wars: Episode I - The Phantom Menace, Darth Mole ordered his master Darth Sidious (Ian McDiarmid) to capture queen Padme Amidal (Natalie Portman) from Naboo to force her to sign a treaty that would legitimize the Trade Federation's invasion of the planet, thus making him the central antagonist. Maul manages to track down his spaceship on Tatooine, where he briefly duels Jedi Master Kwai-Gon Jinn (Liam Neeson), who was assigned to protect the queen, near the landing zone of the ship, but Kwai-Gon eventually escapes aboard the ship. He soon concludes that Mole is the Lord of the Sith and informs the Jedi Council of Coruscant, thereby revealing the return of the Sith, which were thought to have been extinct for more than a millennium. Later, Mole travels to Naboo to help the Trade Federation when they face hostile resistance from the queen and her people, and once again dueling Kwai-Gon, along with his apprentice Obi-Wan Kenobi (Ewan McGregor). Ultimately, Mole is able to fatally injure Kwai-Gon and knock Obi-Wan into the mine, but the latter uses the Force to pull himself out of the pit and equip himself with a Kwai-Gon lightsaber to cut the Mole, sending two parts of his body falling into the shaft. Solo: A Star Wars Story Ray Park repeated his role as Mole in Solo: A Star Wars Story, with Sam Whitver giving voice, the latter reprising the role from the animated series Star Wars: The Clone Wars and Star Wars Rebels. (a) At the end of the film, Mole, as it turned out, became the owner of the crime syndicate Crimson Dawn, to which the criminal Lord Dryden Vos (Paul Bettany) responds. Smuggler Si'ra (Emilia Clarke) tells Mole that Vos and his men were killed by Tobias Beckett (Woody Harrelson) and his accomplices, but does not mention Han Solo (Alden Ehrenreich) and Chewbacca (Junas Suotamo). The mole orders her to meet him on Dathomir and tells her that they will work more closely from now on, lighting his lightsaber. The animated series The Clone Wars by Darth Maul by Star Wars: The Clone Wars, which takes place between Attack of the Clones and Revenge of the Sith. The Like is said to have been a warrior of the Night Brothers clan on the planet Dathomir, inhabited by the dominant Society of Witchcraft Nightsister led by Mother Talzina. Mole's tattoos are described as warrior markings. Talzin instructs Savage Opress to find his long-lost brother. George Lucas decided to resurrect the Mole for the series after developing Opress. In the fourth season, Mole, as it turned out, is alive, having survived his alleged death at the hands of Obi-Wan. Eventually at the Landfill of the Planet Lotto Minor through a shipping dumpster, mole suffers from amnesia since Obi-Wan defeated him. Savage finds the Mole and leads him to the devastation where Talzin restores Mole's mind and gives him robotic legs. Mole and Savage set out to take revenge on Obi-Wan. Mole continues to attack the colonial village to attract Obi-Wan there and make an attempt on his life, but be thwarted by the unexpected appearance of Asage Ventress to collect the award for Savage. Mole and Savage overpowered Obi-Wan and Ventress, but Mole lets them go, deciding to wait for another opportunity. In the fifth season, Mole takes Savage as his apprentice and begins to build a criminal empire. Needing followers, they go to Florrum and manage to convince the pirate Viro and his team to join them and betray their leader Hondo Ohnka. The Mola Pirates attack the forces loyal to Gondo, and Mole again duels Obi-Wan while Savage fights and kills Jedi Master Adi Gallia. Obi-Wan pulls two brothers away from the pirates, engaging them in a duel. Obi-Wan, though outnumbered, cuts off Savage's arm. While Mole and Savage retreat, The Hondo team opens fire on them and shoots one of Mole's robotic legs. Mole's ship explodes with a rocket as it tries to escape, but Malu and Savage manage to escape with one of the emergency pods. A few days later they were found floating in dead space and close to death by the soldiers of the Mundator Death Watch led by Pre Vizsla. They return to the Vizsla settlement, and the damaged cybernetic legs of the Mole are replaced by a new prosthesis resembling a more humanoid shape, while Savage is equipped with a mechanical hand. Mole offers Wiesla the chance to bring back Mandalor by recruiting the Black Sun, Pike Syndicate, and Jabba the Hutt's henchmen to create a crime syndicate called Shadow Collective. From there came to power engineers Mola Vizsl: he orders his henchmen to attack Mandalor, so that the Watch of Death could arrest them and become heroes for the inhabitants, who for a long time lived under the pacifist rule of the Duchess of Satina Kryze. Vizsla betrays Mola, putting him in jail and Savage. Easily free, Mole challenges Wiessl to a duel to take on Death Watch and Mandalor; He succeeds in killing Wiessl and claims his former accomplice is a darksaber. He wins the loyalty of most members of the Death Watch, but Bo-Katan retreats along with those who are loyal to his previous leader. Mole then puts disgraced former Prime Minister Almek, whom Satin jailed for corruption, in power as a puppet leader, consolidating his grip on Mandalay. Mole expects Satin to contact the Jedi Council as part of his plan to take Obi-Wan to Mandalor. As soon as Obi-Wan arrives, Mole captures him and kills Satin in front of him, hoping to make the Jedi suffer as much as he once did. Obi-Wan was later released by Katan's Death Watch faction. The Mole feels Darth Sidious arriving at Mandalor. Impressed by the survival of his former apprentice, Sidious declares Mola a rival uses the Force to push and strangle him and savage. He then engages them both in a lightsaber battle, fatally wounding Savage. After Savage dies of his wounds, Sidious reminds the Mole of Rule Two and tells him that he has been replaced. Furious, Mole pulls out his lightsaber and dark sword and continues to fight Sidious on an equal footing, but Sidious ultimately defeats him. The Mole pleads for mercy, but Sidious ignores him and torments him with the Force's lightning blasts. Sidious reveals that he has no intention of killing mole, noting that he has other uses for his former pupil. After his escape from the separatists with the help of the Death Watch and the fall of his criminal empire (as depicted in the novel Son of Datomir), Mole returns to the ruling Mandalor and manages to restore the Shadow Collective, though not as powerfully as before, this time consisting of Pike Syndicate, Black Sun, and Crimson Dawn, led by Dryden Vos. He serves as the principal antagonist of the first half of the Arc of the Siege of Mandalore (set during Revenge of the Sith), where he and his forces are besieged by the Bo-Katan Death Watch faction and part of the 501st Legion of Clones, led by former Jedi Asoka Tano and Commander Rex. During the confrontation with Asoka, Mole reveals that he hoped kenobi to come instead, and mentions Darth Sidious before fleeing. Later, he sends his Shadow Collective lieutenants underground, warning them of the Galactic Empire that is about to be established, and has another confrontation with Asoka in his throne room, where he warns her of the rise of the Empire, and invites them to join forces to try to stop Sidious. While Asoka first thinks about accepting the offer, she first demands that Mole tell him what plans he had for Anakin Skywalker (learning from the captured Almek that Mole intended him to come to

Mandalor). Mole reveals that he had a vision for the future in which Sidious turned Skywalker to the dark side and made him his new disciple, so he designed the mandalore conflict to lure him here and kill him. Refusing to believe that Anakin can roll over to the dark side, Asoka engages the Mole in a duel that leads them to the scaffold above the throne room. After he gave up his powers, faced with defeat, Mole tries to escape on the shuttle, but is eventually captured by Asoka. Imprisoned in a Mandalorian device designed for users of the Force, the Mole is transported to Coruscant to give judgment, but on the way to the planet, Palpatine (Darth Sidious) issues Order 66, branding all the Jedi as traitors to the Republic whom the Mole feels through the Force. When Asoka is betrayed and attacked by her clone troopers, she runs away and runs towards the Mole, just as he was about to be executed by a pair of clones on Palpatine's orders. Asoka saves and Like, a lot of a lot his astonishment, which then shows that, although Sidius was a disciple and knew of his plan to destroy the Jedi Order, he never knew how he intended to do so, noticing the brilliance of using his own Jedi Army against them. He then offers an alliance, but Asoka abandons the idea and sends it unarmed to distract the clone troopers chasing it. The Mole kills numerous clones using only the Force, but also damages the ship's hyperdrive, causing it to crash into the small moon. He then escapes aboard the shuttle, despite Asoki's attempt to stop him. Rebels An Older Maul appears in the season 2 finale of Star Wars, which takes place between Solo and New Hope. Tracked by an Imperial Inquisitor named The Eighth Brother, Mole is stuck in the ancient world of the Malahor Sith, where he is found among the ruins by the series' protagonist Ezra Bridger. Introducing himself as the Old Master and seeking revenge on Sidious, mole leads Ezra to an ancient Sith temple, where they discover a holocron that the Mole claims can give them the knowledge they need to defeat the Sith. After his recovery, they find the master Ezra Kanan Jarrus and the former Jedi Asok Tano, locked in battle with the Eighth Brother. They also find inquisitors known as the Fifth Brother and the Seventh Sister who have been chasing the rebels for some time. The One, who casts the title of Darth, shows a new lightsaber disguised as a cane and joins the Jedi in the fight against his enemies, including Darth Vader. After the Inquisitors retreat, Mole wins the trust of the Jedi by condemning the Sith and telling them that he cannot defeat Vader in his own circumstances. Working together, he and the Jedi climb to the top of the temple and successfully kill all three Inquisitors. Mole then talks about his intention to take Ezra as a disciple, having already tricked him into activating the temple. After cutting the lightsaber in front of Kanan, the Mole briefly duelled Asoka in front of the now blind Kanan again, only to be knocked off the edge of the temple. However, he survives the fall and avoids Malahor's TIE fighter's eighth brother. A few months later, Mole takes the Ghost team hostage and threatens to kill them if Kanan and Ezra don't bring him the Sith and Jedi holo-crowns. The Mole took the team to a remote base in the Outer Rim, where he is waiting for the arrival of Kanan and Ezra. The holocrons are then dangerously united, allowing Ezra and Mole to see visions of their desires: Ezra sees images of the way of extermination of the Sith, images including double suns, while Mole sees his own vision. Kanan begs Ezra to step aside before he sees too much of the dark side, while Mole tells him to ignore Kanan and keep looking. Ezra picks up the words of his master and breaks the connection, which causes a big explosion. The mole runs away in confusion, saying, He's alive. Mole reappears find a secret rebel base. He tells Ezra that because the connection was severed, they got bits of each other's visions. After the holocrons were destroyed, Mole discovered another way to get the information he needed. He travels to Datomir with Ezra and recreates the Nightsister spell to temporarily merge with the minds of him and Ezra. Once this is complete, Ezra and Mole realize that they are both looking for Obi-Wan Kenobi. In an episode of Twin Suns, Mole is shown lost on Tatooine. He decides to use Ezra to lure Obi-Wan out of hiding. His plan is ultimately successful, as he tracks Ezra through the desert, and the latter is saved by Obi-Wan. The Mole then comes face to face with his sworn enemy, who opens Ezra away. During their confrontation, Mole makes sure that Obi-Wan not only hides, but also protects someone. Obi-Wan realizes that Mole must die and lights up his lightsaber. In a quick duel, Obi-Wan fatally wounded Mole. When he dies in Obi-Wan's arms, Mole asks whether the man he is defending is chosen, and Obi-Wan replies that he is. The Mole declares that this Chosen one will avenge them and die. Comics In 2017, Marvel released Star Wars: Darth Maul, a five-episode prequel series focused on Darth Maul before the Events of The Phantom Menace. The comic shows that Mole was kidnapped as a child by Darth Sidious. During his training, Sidious took the Mole to Malahor, where an ancient battle between the Jedi and the Sith took place. Mole experienced a vision of the mass destruction of the Jedi by numerous Sith, which led to his hatred of them and the desire for revenge, becoming fully committed to the goal of the Sidius to restore the Sith to power. As his training progressed, Mole became more impatient and wanted to fight the Jedi, but Sidious forbade it because it would show the return of the Sith to the galaxy. Instead, Mole hunted various dangerous beasts across the galaxy, and was sent to kill numerous pirates and criminal lords who posed a threat to Sidious's plans. Attacking a group of pirates, one of them is mistaken in the fact that Mole is a Jedi, and tells him about The Padawan, which is about to be sold at auction. Seeing this as an opportunity to finally kill the Jedi, Maul recruits a group of bounty hunters, including Cad Bain and Aurra Singh, who at one point save his life after he gets into a fight in a bar. The Mole and bounty hunters eventually learn about the place where the auction was to take place, and found a Padawan, a twi'lek named Eldra Kaitis. Allowing it to be bought at auction, Mole and his allies kill buyers and leave on a ship stolen from the criminal Lord Ksev Xerexus, who sold Eldra. Upon learning of this, Xrexus activates a bomb planted inside the ship, causing the group to fall to the moon. With the hunters behind them, Mole frees Eldra and the couple then together before dueling with each other, leading to Eldra's death. Soon after, Mole confronts Krexus Krexus. kills her to secure the secret of the Sith before returning to Sidious to report her mission. Age of The Republic Darth Maul was his own one-part comic during the 2018-19 Age of The Republic miniseries that depicts the stories of various characters in the Galactic Republic era. In his comic book (set shortly after the events of the Darth Mole miniseries), Mole creates a criminal cartel called the Kaitis Cartel (inspired by the name of Jedi Padawan Eldra Kaitis, the first Jedi Mole ever killed) and impersonates a low-ranking cartel member to draw the attention of a sensitive force thief, Seque Peiro, on Coruscant. While at work with Peyro, Mole turns to him and kills him before returning to Darth Sidious to report the mission's success. Sidious then returns the Mole to Malahor, where he experiences the vision that he is a Jedi and rescues Comrade zabrak. However, during dinner with the other Zabrans as a show of gratitude to him, the Mole is disgusted by their idolatrous Jedi and kills them all. He then wakes up from his vision and praises Sidious for denying a peaceful life as a Jedi, although he says it will take more than his rage and emotion to destroy the entire Jedi Order. The events of the comic lead to a Ghost threat. Darth Maul: Son of Dathomir Dark Horse Comics produced Darth Maul: Son of Dathomir based on scripts and storyboards of the unprohibited four-episode story arc for the seventh season of The Clone Wars. The events of the comic unfold some time after the defeat of mole from the hand of Darth Sidious in the fifth season of the television series, and before his possible return in the seventh season. After defeating Mole and killing his brother Savage Opress, Sidious took him to a separatist prison, where Count Dooku tortured him for information about the Shadow Collective. Prime Minister Almek of Mandalore arranges the escape of Mole, and he heads back to sanbar to command the army of the Marines of Death. However, he is followed by General Grievous and his droids, who are fighting the Mole and the Mandalorians. While they put up fierce battles, Mole and his henchmen are ultimately overwhelmed by droids. During the battle, Mole breaks the droids and attacks Grievous, but overpowers and is forced to retreat. Maul then communicates with Mother Talzina and plots to pull Sidious out, capturing Dooku and Grievous. The scheme works, and Talzin can regain herself in her physical form, but she sacrifices herself to save the Maul. Although Mole escapes with the company of loyal Mandalorians, the Shadow Collective broke up due to the conflict with Sidious, as the Hutts, Pikes and black sun left the Mole. Asok's novels In memoirs during the novel Star Wars: Asoka, it was revealed that in the last days of the Clone Wars, the Mole and his forces were besieged on Mandalore an army of clone troopers led by Asoka Tano and Captain Rex. During the siege, Mole confronts Asoki's duel, and although he turns out to be a stronger fighter, the former Jedi outsmarted him and drove him into a radi box. However, before Mole can be taken into official custody, order 66 is accepted and clone soldiers after Asok turn on her, except rex. When Rex's life is in jeopardy, Asoka refuses the chance to kill the Mole, allowing the former Sith to escape again. The events of this battle were later incorporated into the plot arc of siege of Mandalore from the seventh season of The Clone Wars. (quote necessary) Video game Darth Maul has appeared in many Star Wars games over the years, starting with The Phantom Menace (1999), where he serves as boss and fought twice, like the movie: once on Tatooine, and the second time on Naboo. Mole also appeared as the final boss and secret unlocked character in Jedi Power Battles (2000), and as a playable character in Star Wars: Demolition (2000), where he rides his high-speed bike, called Bloody Fin. Mole appeared as the last boss in 2001's Star Wars: Obi-Wan (which follows Obi-Wan Kenobi throughout the Phantom Menace event) as a playable character in Star Wars: Super Bombad Racing, where he rode a miniature version of his ship, Scimitar, and the real-time strategy of star wars: Galactic Battlegrounds. He is also a secret unlocked character in Tony Hawk's Film Pro Skater 3 (2001), and a playable character in Star Wars: Racer Revenge (2002), where he rides Scimitar again. In Star Wars: The Force Unleashed (2008), PROXY, a form-changing robot belonging to the game's main character, Starkiller, fights the player at one point, taking the form of various opponents, including Darth Maul. The Maul is also available as an alternative appearance in the game for Starkiller via DLC. In the Lego Star Wars video game series, Mole was featured as the boss and unlockable playable character in Lego Star Wars: The Video Game (2005) and Lego Star Wars: The Complete Saga (2007). He also plays Lego Star Wars II: The Original Trilogy (2006), if the player has the game of saving the first game on the memory card, in Lego Star Wars III: The Clone Wars (2011) and in Lego Star Wars: The Force Awakens (2016). Mole intends to return as a playable character and boss in the upcoming Lego Star Wars: The Skywalker Saga (2020). In the Battlefield series, Mole appeared as a playable character in Star Wars: Battlefield II (2005), Star Wars: Renegade Squadron (2007), Star Wars: Elite Squadron (2009) and Star Wars (2017). In 2011, after Mole's return to the TV series The Clone Wars, he was included as a boss in the multiplayer online game Clone Wars Adventures, with his design based on his new in the show. Show. in the same year, there was also the cancellation of the Battle of the Sith Lords, a game that was set before the events of The Phantom Menace with Darth Maul as the main playable character. In Disney Infinity 3.0 (2015), Mole is the playable character and the final boss of the Twilight Republic game set. The Maul has also appeared in a number of mobile games, including Galaxy of Heroes (2015) and Force Arena (2017). Legends With the acquisition of Lucasfilm in 2012 by The Walt Disney Company, most of the licensed Star Wars novels and comics produced since the start of the 1977 Star Wars film were renamed Star Wars Legends and declared non-canonical for the franchise in April 2014. The series is set in shortly before the Battle of Naboo in Episode I - The Phantom Menace. The story follows the Mole in his mission to destroy the leadership of the well-feared crime syndicate Black Sun. The Mole spends his time serving under Darth Sidious, killing countless. His main target in the series is the leader of the Black Sun, some time before Prince Sorance takes over his command. Several sources depict a Mole returning from the dead in several different forms. The story of Resurrection from Star Wars #9 depicts a duplicate of Mole as a replacement for Darth Vader, only for Vader to kill him. The story of The Phantom Menace in Star Wars #17 (set after Return of the Jedi) depicts Luke Skywalker visiting the Rodi planet of The Mole in Iridonia in an ambassadorial capacity, where he encounters a solid state hologram of the Mole projected from the saved brain of the Mole as part of the scientist's attempt to recreate the Mole as champion Iridonia. Luke recognizes the disruption that the Mola causes in the Force, and turns off the life support systems, keeping the brain alive. In 2005, Dark Horse Comics published Star Wars: The Seers, a collection of non-canonical short comics made by the creators of Revenge of the Sith. One story, Old Wounds, depicts a Mole with longer horns on his head, surviving his bisection at the hands of Obi-Wan, with his missing lower half replaced by cybernetic legs, similar to those of General Grievous (and his eventual resurgence in the Clone Wars). He follows Obi-Wan across the galaxy, finally tracking him down on Tatooine a few years after the events of Revenge of the Sith. The Mole mocks Obi-Wan, saying that after he kills him, he will take his master, Emperor Palpatine, Luke Skywalker's baby. Mole plans to kill Vader and return his rightful place on Palpatine's side. He lights up his new double-bladed lightsaber sword Obi-Wan participates in a duel, but Obi-Wan is again better than him in battle, cutting off the enemy's horns. The mole is killed by a blaster in the head from Owen Lars. Obi-Wan thanks Owen and says he'll take Mole's body into the desert and burn it. Novels In early 2012, a young adult novel called Star Wars: The Wrath of Darth Maul was released scholastic. The Mole also ranks prominently in the comic book series dating back to this period, The Clone Wars, Sith Hunters and Darth Maul: The Death Sentence. Set around various episodes of the Clone Wars that featured Mole, two books detailing his and Savage Opress' journey across the galaxy as they seek revenge on the Jedi. In Darth Plagueis's 2012 novel, the titular Sith lord turns his apprentice Darth Sidious to the power-rich world of Dathomir. The Datomy witch, or Night, senses the power of Sidia in the Force and approaches him. Assuming he is a Jedi, she begs him to take her infant son, zabrak. She realizes that Sidious is not a Jedi, and explains how she tries to save her son from a Night Sister named Talzin, who killed Mole's father. It is implied that Mole has a twin brother and that Talzin only knows about one child. Sidious realizes that the baby is strong in the Force, and will become a threat if he is hired by the Jedi. Hiding the existence of his master, Sidious raises the Mole to believe that he is a Sith disciple, but in reality he intends to be a consumable minion, not an heir. Mole himself acknowledges his flaws, such as his limited understanding of politics, even when he is trying to become a true Sith. Darth Maul: Shadow Hunter Darth Maul: Shadow Hunter is a novel by Michael Reeves, released on February 1, 2001. This prequel novel takes place about six months before the events of The Phantom Menace. The cover was David Stevenson. Del Rey showed a television commercial for the novel in 1999. As pictured in the novel, Mole was raised by Sidious for as long as he remembers. Sidious then trains the Mole as a Sith, marking his body with Sith tattoos. The Mole first goes on several terror missions for his master, killing politicians, criminal authorities, merchants and warlords. Sidious secretly meets with his non-oid contacts at the Trade Federation to finalize the details of the Naboo blockade plan. One member of the delegation was missing; suspecting betrayal, Sidious orders Mola to hunt down the traitor. The Mole completes this task, but learns that the traitor recorded evidence of the manipulation of the Sith blockade of Naboo on the holocron to sell at a profit. A suicide attack by a bounty hunter hired by the Trade Federation interferes with Mole's plan, and a Holocron acquires a Corellian frontier named Lon Pawan. Pawan is aware of the nature of the information and seeks to take it to the Jedi Temple. The Mole, for his part, ordered Sidious to get and kill Pawan and anyone who may have information. Meanwhile, a Padawan Jedi named Darsha Asan faces the trials of the Jedi to become a full-fledged Jedi Knight, and tries to save a member of the Black Sun (whom Mole maimed in The Saboteur). Pawan tries to do business with the criminal lord of the Hutts at one of the lower levels in Coruscant, but the Mole arrives and kills the Hutts. Pawan escapes to the caves, where they meet Darsha and her master. The Jedi begin to accompany Pawan and his droids to the temple, but Mole soon attacks them. Darsha's owner is killed trying to buy time for the others. Pawan and Darsha avoid the various dangers of the underground levels of Coruscant before ending up in another battle. Darsha, realizing that she can't beat the Mole, pulls their duel long enough for Pawan's droids to repair the carbonite freezing unit and seal Pawan and the droids inside it. Darsha plunges her lightsaber into a pile of gas canisters, killing her and causing an explosion that Mole barely escapes. Looking at the scene, Mole feels no trace of Pawan in the Force, not realizing that carbonite hibernation has made his life force undetectable. The automatic timer frees Pawan from hibernation, and he goes after the Mole on his own. Pawan follows Mole to the Republic space station and sneaks up on Mole, stunning him for a moment before he wakes up, chops off Pawan's right hand and chases him through the station's service pipes. Pawan barely gets into a public place where mole can't follow, and unwittingly gives a holocron to Senator Palpatine of Naboo, not realizing that Palpatine is a master of the Mole Sith. After recovery, Pawan begins to leave his cabin, but encounters the Mole, who kills him as a worthy opponent. Darth Maul: The Saboteur Darth Maul: The Saboteur is a short story by James Luceno. It was released in the form of an e-book, with a length equivalent to about 55 printed pages, on February 1, 2001. It was also published in the back of the paperback edition of Michael Reeves' Darth Maul: ShadowHunter. The story of Darth Maul takes place about a year before The Phantom Menace. It tells the story of Mole's first solo mission and an attempt to destroy two mining companies so that the Trade Federation can take over. Maul: Lockdown Maul: Lockdown is a novel by Joe Schreiber, released by Del Rey Books on January 28, 2014. It was the last novel released in the Star Wars Legends franchise. Before the Events of the Phantom Menace, Sith Lords Darth Plagueis and Darth Sidious send their disciple Darth Maul to a galactic prison to return powerful weapons. There, the treacherous gambling empire pits the galaxy's most feared criminals against each other in gladiatorial battles, and the Mole must face Jabba the Hutt and various other terrifying obstacles to complete his mission. Darth Maul was the focal point of the toy marketing campaign, which was aimed at the re-release of The Phantom Menace in 2012, which was shown on the packaging for the toy line.
