

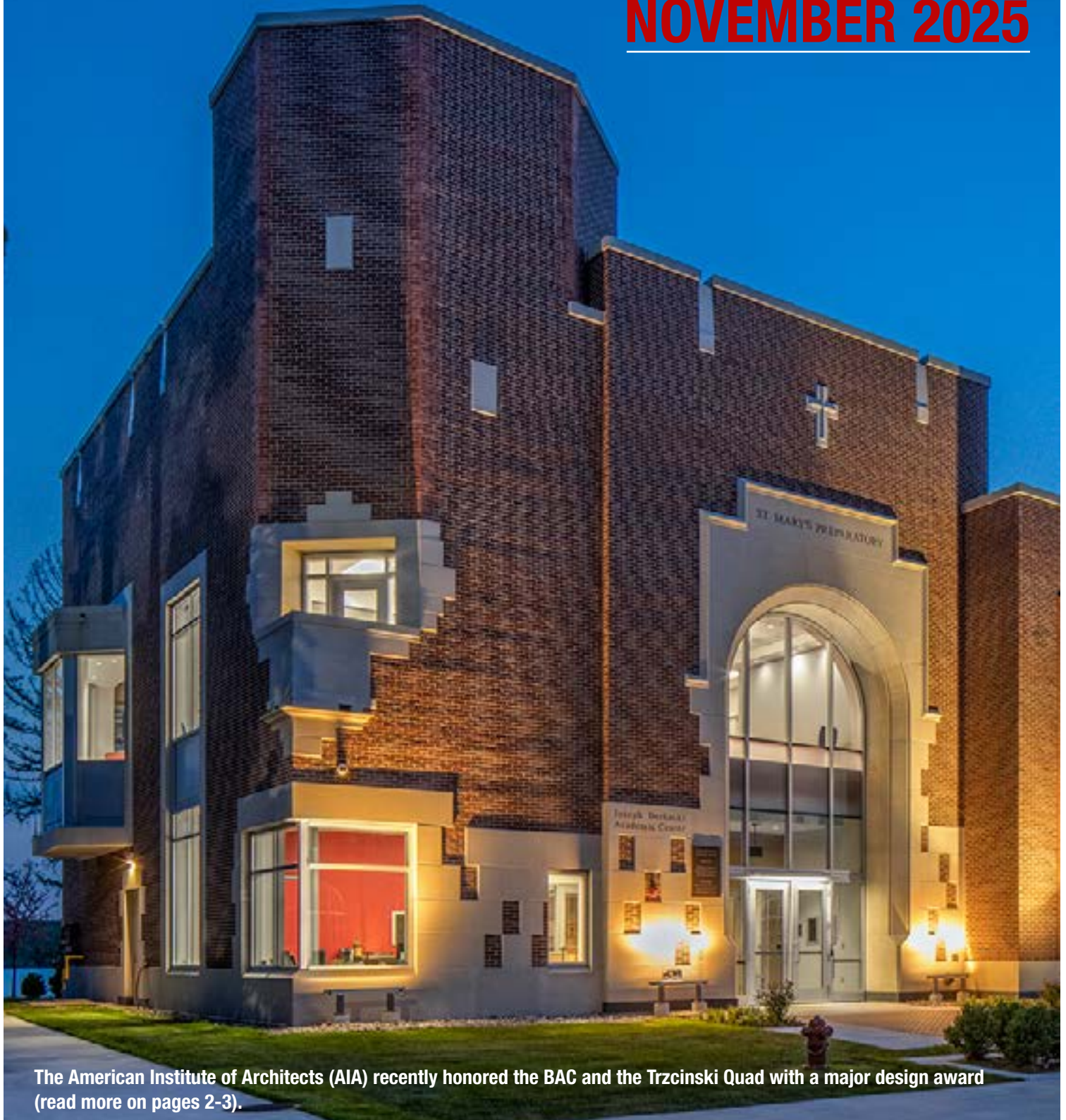

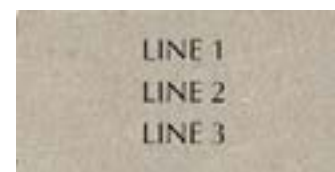

REFLECTION

This year, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, commonly known as All Souls Day, that is celebrated on November 2nd, falls on Sunday and therefore Sunday's liturgy will be replaced with special prayers for the deceased. All Souls Day originated in the 11th century with St. Odilo of Cluny, who instituted it as a day for monks to pray for all souls in purgatory.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (numbers 1030-1031) provides the following explanation:

"All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect."

On Nov 2, 1997, during the Angelus, St. John Paul II addressed the crowds gathered at St. Peter's Square.

In the Words of

ST. JOHN PAUL II

The Church's tradition has always recommended prayers for the dead. The basis for this prayer of suffrage is found in the communion of the Mystical Body. As the Second Vatican Council stresses: "In full consciousness of this communion of the whole Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, the Church in her pilgrim members, from the very earliest days of the Christian religion, has honoured with great respect the memory of the dead" (Lumen gentium, n. 50).

with an answer to his anxious queries about his future lot. At the same time it makes him able to be united in Christ with his loved ones who have already died, and gives hope that they have found true life in God" (Gaudium et spes, n. 18).



Therefore, she encourages cemetery visits, the care of graves and prayers of suffrage as a witness of confident hope, amid the sorrow of being separated from one's loved ones. Death is not the last word on human fate, because man is destined for endless life, which finds its fulfillment in God.

With this belief in man's ultimate destiny, we now turn to Mary, who experienced the drama of Christ's death at the foot of the Cross and then shared in the joy of his Resurrection. May she, the Gate of Heaven, help us more and more to understand the value of praying for our departed loved ones. May she sustain us each day on our earthly pilgrimage and help us never to lose sight of the ultimate goal of life, which is paradise.

For this reason, the Council emphasizes: "Faith, with its solidly based teaching, provides every thoughtful man

Feast of

ST. JOHN PAUL II

Consistent with annual tradition, on October 18th, the Orchard Lake Schools St. John Paul II Liturgical Center commemorated the anniversary of Karol Józef Wojtyła's election to the papacy on October 16, 1978, as Pope John Paul II.

The celebration began with 5:00 PM Mass concelebrated by Bp. Walter Hurley, of the Archdiocese of Detroit, and Fr. Bernard Witek in the St. John Paul II Archdiocesan Shrine on campus. Mass was attended by about 100 faithful. The Filarets Choir performed in English and Polish during Mass.

In his homily, Bp. Hurley recounted many fond memories of St. John Paul II, including that he was and continues to be a profound influence in the Polish community and for very many Catholics at large and that his encyclicals are very inspiring. He was deeply moved by the Pope who personally gave him an eternal cross that he wears daily.

He was impressed that the Pope invited him to a breakfast in the papal dining room. He recalled the moving Mass that Pope John Paul II celebrated in Hamtramck and at the Pontiac Silver Dome, how Pope John Paul II was the people's Pope traveling throughout the world proclaiming Christ's message and encouraging peace, and that he particularly engaged with youth. Bp. Hurley stated that we are very fortunate to be able to walk on the same Orchard Lake Schools campus grounds that the Pope once walked on during his two visits here, a place he thought very highly of.

After Mass, the congregation moved to the Dining Hall for a traditional Polish dinner attended by about 80 people. Bp. Hurley was able to meet many people for the first time and appreciated the opportunity.

The Church celebrates ordinary jubilees every 25 years. In December 2024, the late Pope Francis ushered in the Holy Year 2025 by opening the Holy Doors of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome for a year of grace, forgiveness and renewal — centered on the theme, "Pilgrims of Hope."

In 1470, Pope Paul II established the practice of celebrating jubilees every 25 years, instead of 50, to allow more people to experience a Holy Year within their lifetimes.

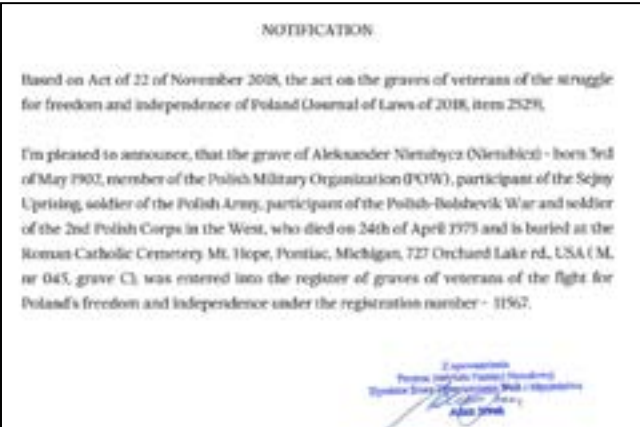
IPN Recognizes
