General Assembly Meeting November 19, 2017

The following minutes were taken at the November 19th General Assembly Meeting and will be approved/amended at the June 2018 meeting of the General Assembly.

The meeting was held after Sunday service with 28 members present. A light lunch was available. Board President, Gary Whitson welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 11:25 a.m. The meeting package was distributed to all members prior to the meeting, as requested, either by e-mail or hard copy, and additional copies were available at the meeting.

The meeting was opened with prayer by Pastor Kouri.

Review of Previous Minutes:

Motion: It was moved by **Peggy Helliker** and seconded by **Mary Pyne** to adopt the minutes of the June 18, 2017 General Assembly Meeting as recorded. **Carried**

<u>President's Report</u>: President, Gary Whitson's report was presented in the package. He reviewed his report and commented on the positive aspects of the Luther movie presentation on October 26, 2017. Gary Whitson also noted that a number of facility improvements have been made or are in process, including the new handicapped accessible door, the replacement of the broken window in the Narthex, new roof exhaust fans, repairs to our aging organ, the replacement of the Pastor's microphone (including a spare), and the purchasing of new folding tables and chairs for the church hall. Other repairs or replacements will be required for our aging premises. Peggy Helliker advised that a way to support the costs of roof replacement would be to have each member/family buy a bundle of shingles for the project.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor Kouri's report was included in the meeting package. He asked for questions from the floor.

Barb Ryder asked Pastor if he would consider leading a Bible study group. A time for this study to take place was discussed and will be reviewed by the Worship Committee and then sent to the Board of Directors for approval. Pastor will ask for input.

<u>Director of Finance Report</u>: Michel Poliquin, Director of Finance, reviewed the financial report included in the meeting package.

The first page of his report related to Donation Liabilities (Package Page 10). A line by line explanation by Michel indicated that a total of \$26,141 was designated for distribution to various missions. Of the \$26,141 set aside for donations, \$13,562 has been donated. The donation for French hymnals for Africa will be paid out when the invoice is received. The balance (\$10,704) has been set aside for donation as worthy causes are identified in 2018.

The second and third pages of his report related to the 2018 Budget (Package pages 11 and 12). The following comments were made by Michel. An increase of 10% for Electricity and Water and an increase of 25% for Gas has been built in to the budget. This was deemed necessary according to current trends. The mortgage has been paid off. Office expenses have been increased to allow for proposed purchases for a new photo copier when our contract runs out in February 2018 and new computers and better internet connection. Salaries are down due to the fact that Pastor's car allowance has been changed to mileage charged for business. The property upkeep allocation allows for small improvements plus the purchase of tables and chairs. The 2018 budget total is \$239,005. The fourth page of the report was on the U.S. account (Package Page 13). Currently we have \$1.705 U.S. or \$2,186 Canadian in our U.S. account

Pages 14 to 20 laid out the Giving Strategy and Advice for the congregation.

Sheila Ginn spoke about giving to missions and the need to support our own mission, that of Redeemer Lutheran Church, as well as being prudent in how we direct our mission dollars outside our church. A complete copy of the Financial Report is on file with the minutes.

Motion: It was moved by Betty Smith and seconded by Ken Burchill to accept the 2018 Budget as presented.

Carried

At this point in the meeting, Michel Poliquin surprised the assembly with the ceremony of "Burning the Mortgage" and Sheila Ginn distributed decorated cupcakes complete with red chocolate "flames".

Page 2 - General Assembly November 19, 2017

<u>Ministry Group Reports</u>: Reports from the Directors of Facilities, Worship, Witness and Outreach, and Fellowship were included in the meeting package as well as a report from W.O.R.S.H.I.P (Women of Redeemer, Sharing, Helping In Prayer).

Election of Officers: Ken Burchill presided over the election for Board positions for 2018.

President: Gary Whitson has agreed to let his name stand for President. There were no other nominations from the floor.

Motion: It was moved by John Smith and seconded by George Laucek that nominations be closed. Carried Gary Whitson declared President for 2018.

Vice-President:

The following name was put forth for election; Jerry Shuster.

Motion: It was moved by **Brian Rose** and seconded by **Rick Higgins** that nominations be closed. **Carried Jerry Shuster declared Vic-President for 2018.**

Director of Finance: Michel Poliquin remains as director of finance for year two of a two year term.

Secretary: Sheila Ginn agreed to let her name stand for a second term as Secretary.

There were no other nominations from the floor.

Motion: It was moved by Michel Poliquin and seconded by Jane Anne Rose that nominations be closed.

Carried Sheila Ginn declared Secretary for 2018

Directors at Large: The following names were submitted to run for Director at Large positions: **Barb Barraclough, Kim Ebert, Dan Hansen and Lee Schooley.** There were no other nominations from the floor. **Motion:** It was moved by **Sheila Ginn** and seconded by **John Smith** that nominations be closed. **Carried**

Barb Barraclough, Kim Ebert, Dan Hansen and Lee Schooley declared Directors at Large.

Brian Rose and Betty Smith remain as Directors at Large in the second year of their two year terms.

There was **no support** from the General Assembly for a motion to give the Board of Directors the authority to appoint two additional Directors at Large, if required.

Election of Delegates to District Convention:

Gary Whitson and Pastor Kouri addressed the need for a delegate to be elected for the District Convention in Anne Arbour, Michigan, June 19-21, 2018 and for a delegate to be elected for the Circuit Forum conference call, January 23, 2018 to elect a circuit visitor.

Michel Poliquin agreed to stand for both positions and was elected by the General Assembly to fill those positions.

Other Business:

Pastor Kouri encouraged the congregation to support the processes that have been put in place for the effective administration of Redeemer policies and procedures.

He asked all to work together to accommodate the concerns of all. Gary Whitson urged us to appreciation each other's talents.

The meeting was closed with prayer by Pastor Kouri.

Motion: It was moved by **Dan Hansen** and seconded by **Janice Maxfield** to adjourn the meeting at 12:37 p.m. **Carried**
