## Research the School

You should go to the school's athletics page to do research on the coaches (their title and responsibilities). You should also research the roster to find out how many upper classmen play your position, the team's records and athletic background, as well as get a sense of the athletes currently on the team

# Ways of Contact

- 1. Recruitment Questionnaire (often found on the sports webpage)
- 2. Email the coach/ recruiter
- 3. Phone Call with coach/ recruiter
- 4. (Optional) Online Recruitment website (create a profile to be easily found by coaches)

#### **Timeline**

The contact timelines for each sport varies slightly, so be sure to check out the NCAA Recruitment Calendar for specific and up to date information for your sport. The general rule of thumb is YOU can contact the coach at anytime, but the COACH can only initiate contact after July 1 between your Junior and Senior year of high school. Even after this time frame, some sports have additional restrictions on how often a coach can email or call you. For example, in baseball, coaches can only contact you once per week outside of a contact period. More information can be found linked above in the Recruitment calendar.

## Sending an Email

Communicating with coaches can be intimidating and hard to navigate at times, but, ultimately, your discussions with the coach will be the biggest factor in helping you decide where to commit. Emails and phone numbers can often be found on the school's athletics page. Here are a few things to keep in mind in email correspondence:

- Personalize the email- make sure you have the right coaches name and school listed
- Make the Subject line "attention-grabbing" -include your Spell check and use proper grammar- have someone name, position, and graduation year
- Include your contact information- Coaches will want to know how to reach back out
- Basic athletic and academic information- no need to detail every stat or achievement, but give a brief
- · Give a brief overview of when you compete next- this can help them to plan to see you compete and coordinate their recruiters

- Have a professional sounding email- something simple and straightforward
- else read the email before you send it
- Perhaps you want to follow up the email with a phone call- it can be beneficial to contact the coach in multiple forms. Coaches get thousands of emails a day, that phone call could help to solidify a contact with them to make sure your email gets read
- Even if you don't hear back from a coach, it can be helpful to continue to send them email update with your playing schedule and new achievements.
