With American concern over the start of World War II in Europe, the 5 Infantry Leagues were once again activated on October 16, 1939, in Fort McClellan, Alabama. This time the Red Diamond was established as a triangular department with the Infantry Regiment of 2, 10 and 11 for its approximately 15,000 authorized power. After a busy period of training, Red Diamond settled into his permanent post at Fort Custer, Michigan, in September 1940. Red Diamond landed at Sugar Red Beach in Normandy, Utah, in the St Mere Eglise area, July 9, 1944. He was assigned to the V. The rest of the brigade was closed in Quang Tri by July 22, and three maneuvering battalions were in separate base camps outside the Quang Tri base. On August 12, 1968, a company was killed in The 1st Army for ten days against North Vietnamese Army troops trying to infiltrate the demilitarized zone. The Red Devils continued to operate in an area known as Leatherneck Square, and the 3rd World Devils continued to operate. In April and May 1969, the Red Diamond Brigade tried to prevent the enemy from accessing the rice harvest. To achieve this, the Brigade provided security for friendly people as they harvested crops and patrolled at night to block the movement of North Vietnamese tax collectors. The Red Diamonds showed that mechanized forces can be effective, despite operating on land unsymilgible for armored forces. In August 1969, the Red Devils assumed full responsibility for Leatherneck Square. For six weeks, constant activity kept all units of the Brigade occupied in this area. On October 22, along with the Brigade 3. 1. ARVN (South Vietnam) Department, the Brigade had only one responsibility for quang Tri defense Dong Ha battle bases. In January 1971, the reinforced 1st Brigade, the 5th Infantry League, launched Operation Lam Son 719. The brigade opened QL9 Road from Dong Ha to the Laos border. At the same time, engineers built access roads from Rock Pile from punch bowl to Khe Sanh. Following this, an ARVN Task Force of 20,000 people was moved to the Laos border. The red diamond brigade's mission was to secure QL9 as a supply route and provide mobile defense for vandergrift and Khe Sanh's large forward support area. For 69 days in an increasingly complex and bitter fight, the Red Devils ARVN attack prevented the enemy from making a successful attack action against any of these vital connections. A body count of 400 North Vietnamese has been made and the primary mission has been completed to keep logistical support channels running at all times. When the last of the logistics troops withered, the Red Diamond continued its search and cordon patrols and rice denial efforts east of Quang Tri Province. In June, the Red Devils were ordered to withdraw with a stateside redeployment to begin on July 1, 1971. Brigade activities were limited to base security in anticipation of the North VietnamEse Army's effort to achieve a propaganda victory over the allotted unity. Brigade colors left Quang Tri on August 8, 1971, after a ceremony the previous day, during which brigade personnel were given several Vietnamese insignes. The Red Devils returned to Fort Carson and left Quang Tri's defense in the hands of the ARVN 1st District, where they largely trained. On August 22, 1971, Brigade colors were seen in Fort Carson, Colorado. The Red Diamond was once again inactive. The 5th Mechanized Infantry Department was reactivated in Fort Polk, LA, in 1976. From 1989 to 1992, he was attached to the Division III Corps and shared the Cold War mission to strengthen the Allied Forces in Central Europe. According to the Army doctrine of the time, the department was organized by two active brigades and rolled by a brigade from the National Guard Army. In 1989, after months of deterioration of relations between United States governments and Panamanian Dictator Manuel Noriega, the situation became critical with the murder of a naval officer and the harassment of American personnel by Noreiga forces. The 9th Infantry Department killed 4,581 soldiers in the fighting, wounded 16,961, lost 750 in action and captured 868. Their total combat and non-combat losses represent more than 240 percent of their authorized forces. In addition to this sacrifice, former Trustee soldiers won 4 Medals of Honor, 86 Distinguished Service Crosses, 1,789 Silver Stars and 5,518 Bronze Stars. The invasion of the Marianas Island chain included landings in Saipan, Guam and Tinian. It was the largest operation in the Pacific war under Naval command, with about 165,672 naval and military troops participating. Of these, 21,618 were in the 4th and 4th century.
