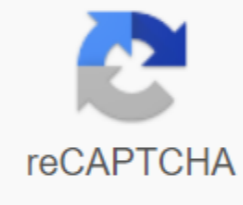

## Digimon cyber sleuth dna digivolve guide

From Before I PlayPlay to Normal or Above. The game is extremely simple, and playing on Easy is so undeniable you could sleep through it. The Digimon type (data, vaccine or virus) is more important than the element. Make sure to bring multiple types of viruses as well as your favorites because some repetitive bosses use data like Digimon. Rebooting the Digimon level with Digivolution is not an obstacle you first think it is. Their stats remain the same, so don't worry so much about throwing your new level 1 Greymon into the fray. Digimon in your reserves get EXP at the same rate, but they don't get CAM (comradeship/friendship). Only those who actually participate do. CAM is usually only really used for basic digivolution pathways for some of the most notable Digimon (e.g.: Agumon-Greymon-MetalGreymon) Veemon can get two of his DigiEgg Armor Evolution. The first Digi-egg is received from a bonus boss in the same Kowloon area as your goal for the chapter. Keep going past your target and you can't miss it. Similarly, Digivolving's DNA is in the game too, all it requires getting like Digimon's CAM up to 100% along with other stats prerequisites, and then choose it like any other Digivolution for one with both in your lot. Your Code-Hacker abilities have the prerequisites for using them away from your cyber sleuth level. If you can't use one despite your CS level, sign up for the Player section of the Digivice menu. Normally, it just requires that you have a Digimon of a certain type in your party. The first thing you have to do at the beginning of the new chapter is to go hunting through every place in Tokyo for a guy with a pair of large yellow hair spikes called Uchida Victory. Every time you find this victorious guy, he will give you a rare point. Like a freebie for a tricky; when you have to go to the Tokyo Metro for the second time, immediately turn around and go back the other way (south). Sneaky hides against the wall and you will never find it otherwise unless you think to look. When you create a new Digimon from a scan higher than a beginner, the first thing you have to do is pass it a stage or two. Newly created champions and above have a terrible ABI stat and limit level (maximum level 25 for champions, for example), which usually means they can't actually Digivolve to Ultimate at all. There are only two ways to raise ABI: Digivolution and Miracle Meat. Miracle Meat is rare and expensive, so the best way to get ABI Digimon is to de-and-re-digivolve it a bunch of times. By the middle/end of the game, it's not too bad when you can burn in the level of 20-30 bracket from a few fights. If you want Stingmon for DNA-Digivolving in Paiddramon, don't do it through Wormmon because his stats take serious work to meet the requirements. Falcon or Tentomon are much easier recruits to get to it to the end. DNA DITIViving requirements must be met by one of the two Digimon, except for 100% CAM requirements that both must meet. Another is consumed in the process, so you can burn the crappy Digimon force-fed Digimeat for CAM requirements in addition to the other well aligned one. Digivolution (進化, Shinka?, illuminated. Evolution is a term in the Digimon series. It is a process used by Digimon, the monsters that inhabit a parallel universe called the digital world that spawned from earth's telecommunications network. Through Digivolution, Digimon can turn into a more powerful creature. The contents of the Digimon concept are found in various Electronic Networks of the Earth, as well as in the digital world. Because they are essentially computer data, they can download additional data for themselves, making it stronger. If they download enough data, Digivolution is triggered. During Digivolution, The appearance of Digimon changes and, in most cases, becomes much stronger than before. As a result, the Digimon form almost always has a different name than the previous one. However, Dimomon's consciousness remains unchanged. If Digimon does not absorb enough data needed to maintain the mold, it will not be able to maintain this shape for a long time and return to a lower level for some time. Digivolution is divided into several levels, consists of an egg shape called Digi-egg (デジタマ, Digitama?) and six major evolutionary steps. The main stages of digivolution (English adaptation terms with Japanese terms in brackets): Fresh (幼年期 I, Younenki I?, illuminated. Baby I) B-Training (幼年期 II, Younenki II?, lit. Baby II) Rookie (成長期, Seichouki?, illuminated. child) Champion (成熟期, Seijukuki?, illuminated. adult) Ultimate (完全体, Kanzentai?, illuminated 究極体. Ultimate) If left on their devices Digimon is naturally of age, and over time can digivolve using data from the environment. Digivolving from the initial fresh stage usually progresses, but each subsequent level takes more and more time. Because of this, only a small number of Digimon naturally reach their final forms. Anger and/or the need to survive a great battle can often spur Digivolution. When Digimon are removed they either regress completely to Digi-eggs or break into countless pieces of errant data that can be easily absorbed or downloaded by other Digimon. However, when Digimon forms a bond with a person, they can digivolve faster. Using Digivice, people can allow Digimon almost instantly digivolve to a higher level by sharing their energy. This action takes a large amount of energy and cannot occur if Digimon is weak, injured or hungry. Digimon who digivolve using digivice will degenerate, or de-digivolve to lower after a certain amount of time or if sufficiently damaged in the battle. Typically, a partner partner The default stage is Rookie. Gatomon from Digimon Adventures is a notable exception as she naturally digivolved before meeting her human partner Kari Kamiya. However, sufficient injury or loss of energy can cause Digimon to return to an even lower form after a natural digivolving. Several other Digimon not in partnership with people also have the opportunity to temporarily digivolve at higher levels and then return to their basic form with Hackmon from Digimon Adventure Three. is a notable example. In addition to regular stages, there are special forms that can usually only be obtained through special techniques: Special Stages of Armor (アマ体, Ome-tai?, illuminated. To get this shape, Digimon needs to absorb energy from one of the special Digi-eggs (デジメタ, Digmetail?). If Digimon has several Digi-eggs, its digivolved shapes become more powerful. The power of Armor Digimon is similar to the power of the champion and was often equated as such in various card games, with some explicitly stating that they were the same. They are also considered the equivalent of Ultimates in Digimon World DS and Digimon World Dawn and Dusk. Hybrid (ハブリド体, Haiburiddo-tai?, lit. Hybrid Form is a special level associated with the spirits of legendary warriors; By teaming up with one or more Spirits, someone can turn into a special Digimon of this level. A human hybrid is a form that transforms a person or digimon into a person like Digimon, whose power rivals the champion. To achieve this, it takes H Spirit to be one of ten legendary warriors. Human hybrids were seen as the equivalent of champions in the Digital Monster Card game and became champions in the digital game Monster Card - a form that turns a man or digimon into a more beastly kind of Digimon, whose power rivals Ultimate's power. To achieve this, it takes B Spirit of one of ten legendary warriors. Beast Hybrids were seen as the equivalent of Ultimates in a digital monster card game and became Ultimates in the digital monster card game q. Fusion Hybrid, also known as Fusion Form (融合形態, Yuugoukeitai?), is a powerful form achieved using both H-Spirit and B-Spirit. Fusion Hybrids were considered the equivalent of Megas in the Digital Monster Card Game and Became Megas in The Digital Monster Card Game q. Unified Hybrid, also known as Transcend Form (超越形態, Chouetsukeitai?) uses five H-Spirits and five B-Spirits, combining to give a person or digimon an incredibly advanced and powerful shape. United Hybrids were seen as the equivalent of Megas in the Digital Monster Card Game and became Megas in the digital game Monster Card Game q. Blast mode: Shown so far only in Digimon Data Squad and Masters, although the Digimon blast mode appears in other media such as and games, Explosion is a power that exceeds Mega, although it may just be similar to a regime change where Digimon of a certain level transform to achieve more power such as Imperialdramon Dragon Mode. Burst Digimon retains a resemblance to their original shape, but has new attacks and a clear increase in power. This is its special level at Digimon Masters. Ultra (超究極体, Cha Kuukyukutay?, illuminated. Super Ultimate) is a level even higher than Mega. Its existence was one of the main trends of Digimon Adventures V-Tamer 01. Only a few Digimon are at this level, and many times they are simply classified as Mega for convenience, although later games have slowly started using it. Xros Wars (クロスウォーズ, Kurosu W'zu?, lit. Xros Wars: Levels are not mentioned in Digimon Fusion and related media, and most of the Digimon created for the series are listed as at the Xros Wars level in the Dimimon Handbook. Some media portray these Digimon as having no level at all. In the anime and some other media Digimon tend to shout your type of Digivolution just before digivolving and then shout your new name right after. Examples include: Agumon digivolve to ... Graymon (Ahumon Cincal Greymon)! and the Imperial mode of change to... Fighter mode! (Change of imperial regime! fighter mode)! Digimon Story: Cyber Sleuth parodies this: when Elecmon and Numemon scream Elecmon / Numemon digivolve! Just for nothing will happen, they will say what they thought, just shout it was like you digivolve. It confuses the other characters. Although Digivolution is named after the theory of evolution it is more like metamorphosis, although there is also an element of aging involved, as seen in the Japanese term stage. The effects of Digivolution When Digimon reaches its next level of evolution its appearance may resemble its previous form or have no relation at all, such as Gatomon, which resembles a cat, digivolving to Angewomon, Archangel Digimon. Usually, with the case of Digivolution to the champion level the resultant Digimon resultant is larger than the previous form, but Digivolution to the final level can often cause Digimon to clarify its strength and reduce its size at the same time, such as (for example. Togemon to Lillymon). The same circumstances can come with Mega Digivolution such as MetalGreymon (Vaccine) to WarGreymon. Forms Digivolution Digivolution (進化, Shinka?, lit. Evolution) is one of Digimon's special abilities. Digivolution is part of Digimon's natural life cycle with Digimon digivolving to stronger forms as a result of age and experience. Not all Digimon can pass it, but it can happen naturally. They can get armor and/or clothing.
