The image quality of the set was good overall thanks to the LED backlight set. Dark scenes from The Dark Knight offered great contrast, and the light scenes from Avatar looked crisp, although we found the futuristic scenes less fluid and more variable than on other scenery. Toshiba's operating system was the slowest to run any test, taking upwards of 20 seconds just for power. The sound quality has been positive overall (a rare feat among internet TVs in our test) and you won't find this TV to be a power hog either. If your family wants to delve into 3D entertainment, you'll be happy with Toshiba; The 3D video looked the best of the bunch, and easier on the eyes to download. It will launch TVs in Japan in December. Without glasses, TVs respond to a key complaint from potential buyers, but they won't be cheap. Toshiba will offer a 12-inch model and a 20-inch model. They will cost around #165 euros; 120,000 (\$1,430) and #165 240,000 euros respectively. Toshiba does not announce launch or pricing plans for markets outside Japan. (Video of new TVs on YouTube.) The company is waiting on big screens before launching televisions outside Japan, said Masaaki Oosumi, president of Toshiba's digital media division, at a news conference. Markets such as the U.S. demand TVs with screen sizes starting at about 40 inches, making these first models a little small. The 20-inch model packs cell Broadband Engine, a version of the same processor found in the Sony PlayStation 3 console, which supports several advanced image processing features. Toshiba said they include the ability to convert conventional 2D images into quasi-3D images on-fly.3D TVs can simulate depth because they provide a slightly different image for each eye. In current 3D TVs, images for each eye are displayed quickly one by one. Filters with glasses flash on and off in sync with the TV image, so that the right eye sees one image, and the left eye sees the next. The new Toshiba TVs have a thin sheet of small lenses in front of the display. Behind this lens screen is a specially designed LCD (liquid crystal display) panel. Each screen has 8.29 million pixels - four times the number of pixels in a regular full HD TV - organized into groups of nine pixels of each color. Nine lenses separate the light from each pixel bank and send it to nine points in front of the TVIf the viewer sits in one of these sweet spots they get a 3D illusion. Nine spots should allow multiple family members to watch a 3D image at the same time. The setting means that despite the large number of pixels on the screen, the resulting pattern is seen in each of the nine spots equivalent to 720p high-definition images, said Toshiba.Similar technology used in Nintendo's recently announced 3DS handheld gaming devices. The 3DS has a screen from Sharp and sends the image to just one place - something that isn't a problem with the portable Toshiba unveiled new TVs ahead of the Ceatec electronics show. At the event, the company also demonstrates the same technology without glasses on a 56-inch TV prototype. The need to wear special glasses was a common complaint about early 3D TVs. Points are necessary for each viewer, they tend to weigh more than typical glasses, and because they contain an electronic circuit, they also need recharges regularly.
