WikiPortraits Launches Initiative to Enrich Wikipedia with Freely-Licensed Photos of Notable Figures

(July 28, 2025) - WikiPortraits, a pioneering initiative dedicated to addressing the critical shortage of high-quality, freely-licensed images of notable figures on Wikipedia, announces its continued efforts to capture and provide high-quality, copyright-free photos for the world's largest online encyclopedia and its sister projects, all thanks to the growing group of volunteer photographers.

The Challenge

Wikipedia and other Wikimedia projects require images to be freely licensed for use. However, the vast majority of published photos of notable individuals are press images protected by full copyright and restrictive licenses. This results in countless biographies on Wikipedia lacking images or featuring poor-quality visuals—a problem widely recognized and previously highlighted by the New York Times in its 2009 article, "Wikipedia May Be a Font of Facts, but It's a Desert for Photos." Over a decade later, the issue persists.

The Solution

WikiPortraits tackles this challenge by sending credentialed photographers to major festivals, conferences, and events, where notable individuals are most accessible. The team also sets up photo booths at select events, inviting anyone with a Wikipedia page—whether they are speakers or attendees—to have their portrait taken. This innovative approach ensures that Wikipedia's coverage of notable figures is both visually rich and legally compliant.

Highlights

WikiPortraits photographers attend major festivals, conferences, and award ceremonies—such as Sundance, SXSW, Cannes, Eurovision, Jaipur Literature Festival,

and the Nobel Prizes—offering attendees the opportunity to have their portrait taken for use on Wikipedia and Wikimedia Commons. All images are released under free licenses, making them accessible for use across the Wikimedia ecosystem.
