Elaine Geissler is the founder of **Rescued and Redeemed**, an Anti-Trafficking Organization located in Eau Claire, WI and serving the entire Chippewa Valley and surrounding communities. The mission of this organization is to **REACH** vulnerable people through, awareness, education and prevention; **RESCUE** victims by protecting and providing hope and healing; **RESTORE** survivors by equipping them to live independently; and **REDEEM** through the love of Jesus Christ.

Sex trafficking is modern-day slavery and involves the use of force, fraud, or coercion to obtain some type of commercial sex act. It has become a crisis of enormous proportions.

Elaine and her husband, Joe, have been married for 14 years and have 4 grown children. They live in Chippewa Falls where Elaine works with challenged children who need special attention. Because of her experience working closely with the mentally and physically abused, she is desperately called to help combat the debilitating issue of trafficking. The information she shares will provide a clear picture of the threats around us on a daily basis and will give you tools to help identify suspicious activities that may be related to trafficking.
